
Bob Dubree gave us a big evening on April 23, with great variety in his calling. Over 20 sets were tickled by his Tennessee humor and rollicking

N.N. J.S.D.A. April 24,1966

"....51 people were in attendance, missing were Circle Eights and Isle Squares....Jack and Carol

DeCoste, v.p. in charge of beginner classes reported this has been a highly successful endeavor, surpassing any previous year....there have been 15 classes conducted by Association clubs and 2 others, with about 160 couples graduating....4 clubs requested financial aid....s/d figure of the month (similar to round dance of the month) a California based idea is being investigated....progressing past the talk stage is the getting together of all the s/d instructors in the area to discuss such an idea and also to standardize necessary basics taught in the courses (last time this was done by veep Bob Kellogg) ... additional courses geared for drop-outs are planned for the fall....Wrong Way Thars, who dance 1 & 3 Sundays at the Firehouse in Somerset with callers Bob Kellogg and Jack Shoffner and Mountain Squares who dance every Monday at the Central School on route 46 in Parsippany to the calling of Dick Pasvolsky and Vinnie Caruso, having fulfilled the membership requirements of our constitution and by-laws were accepted in the NNJSDA raising out total club membership to 27....in spite of dire snow threats approximately 35 sets attended the Paul Hartman dance.....(the Keokuk report is on page 17) 2/3 of the clubs have sent in a roster for compiling a master list of NNJSDA dancers, Joel Spivey has volunteered to do the compiling (Ed. note where are the other 1/3?)....so far with 3 clubs unheard from, we have 342 Grand Square boosters (Ed. note: A record high and a big THANK YOU from the staff for your vote of confidence)...next year's membership roster will also include the club president's address and phone number, club dance season and the phone number of the hall (if you can get it) ... 


