With so many more folks going camping nowadays, the suggestion was made - "How about an article on the Garden State Square Dance Campers?" And quite Togically there was only one person qualified to tell

it best - the first presidents of the GSSDC and still a guiding light in this growing organization. Briefly, this is their history......

A former NNJSDA caller, Lloyd Siewers, moved to Appleton, Wisc. and became involved in the organization of NSDCA (National Square Dance Campers Association). Lloyd wrote Ed & Gwen Knight of this, Ed placed a note in the January '65 GRAND SQUARE seeking a possible interest in a NJ chapter. Sixteen families, including one caller - Jack Shoffner, met on March 28, 1965. Officers elected: President - Bob & Lynn Long; VP -George & Dorothy Hunt; Treasurer - John & Lorraine Weinmann; Secretary -Ed & Gwen Knight. Two weeks later the '65 program was a reality. By September 1966 there were 127 families as members.

By virtue of the fact that we were an operating chapter before NSDCA

was ready to accept chapters, we became Chapter #001.

We camp and dance at campgrounds in NJ, PA, NY, where an adequate lighted and covered area for dancing exists. Nominal charges, \$6-\$10 per family per weekend, cover camp fees and all dance sessions Friday

evening to Sunday noon.

In June 1967 we hosted a Camporee, erecting a 60' x 120' tent and laying 7200 square feet of plywood floor in Lebanon State Forest, NJ. Dancers from California to Florida danced the week prior to the 16th National S/D Convention to callers from numerous states. MC'd by Marty Winter and Jack Shoffner. Rounds by Long's and Tirrell's. "Campy" our travelling leather dog is still travelling.

Chapter #001 played significant roles in forming NSDCA chapters #006, 013,016,021,022 and assisted three others in coming into being. Chapter #001 is a chartered non-profit corporation of the State of New Jersey.

A newsletter - "Hot Embers" - keeps the membership informed as to happenings. The '70 season is ready with guest callers and other new innovations. If interested, contact this season's officers for information. They are listed elsewhere (page 23) as are our dates, places, and callers. Double your pleasure - combine two favorite pastimes camping and dancing.

Recently while chatting with a guest dancer at a club of which I am a member, I was distressed to hear her say, "I won't come back here. It's so cold and unfriendly. You are the second person to talk to me all evening. And if I make a mistake while dancing people glare at me." Try as I would to dismiss this as a series of unfortunate co-incidences or a particu-

larly sensitive mood on her part, I cannot help feeling that square danc-

ing IS losing some of its warmth.

Perhaps this is partly due to its growth. Clubs are generally larger, attendance at dances is up and it's just not possible to spend time with everyone. Another factor may be the proliferation of new and interesting steps. There is so much material to cover, there is sometimes less time for people.

Still, without sacrificing growth and technical progress, it is quite possible to be friendly and welcoming to people. After all club members are the hosts and they would not dance and enjoy themselves at home

while their guests sat ignored - Why do it at a square dance?

I'd also like to bring up what may be a touchy subject. I know "kissing goes by favor" and some people like to dance together and certainly can dance more smoothly that way. At beginners class we were taught that square dancing was built on good manners - if you wanted to dance, you got up and joined the nearest set and danced cooperatively with them. Yet nowadays at dances one sees more and more of obviously pre-determined sets. In some cases it is the club leaders who are involved. This trend certainly sets up a "cliquey" exclusive atmosphere and seems contrary to everything square dancing stands for.

It would be a pity if in our search for improved square dancing, we lost the spirit of fellowship - and also lost a lot of people who dropped


out because they didn't feel welcomes.




