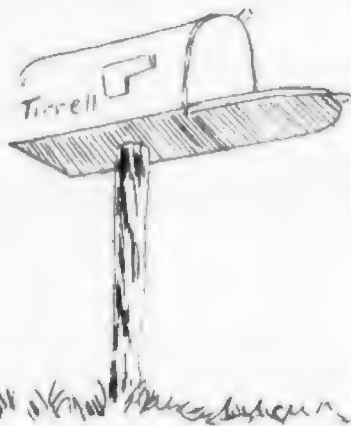

from MURIEL OSAGE's Cahi-Hoes write-up.... "It's a puzzlement" sang Yul Brynner in The King and I - and some things are certainly that. I had not meant to belabor any longer some of the habits of square dancers until Doris Gill's plaintive article ...In a previous issue the question of teen-age involvement was discussed, and, although I firmly believe that children should not belong to an adult club, I can certainly tolerate them more than some adults who behave as children. We boast that within our ranks we do not have to cope with those "on the sauce" as they say, but isn't it easier to put up with someone not accountable for his actions than with some one who has his wits and yet acts witless? Hemingway said that "Courage is grace under pressure". I think the same definition could be applied to good manners. The rudeness and even some of the fun and games do not belong in this great recreation. I do hope with the emergence of new members into clubs, seasoned dancers will remember that they have been there too."

from BARBARA & SKIP SAMSOE's M T Squares write-up..... "Most people realize that the lions share of the credit for a good dance goes to the callers but too few of us make it a point to thank the caller for a job well done. This goes for our round dance leaders too. Callers and round dance leaders are, for the most part, products of their own hard work and practice. They don't just happen. A lot of preparation and learning of new calls and dances must precede each dance in order that one dance is not just a carbon copy of the last. 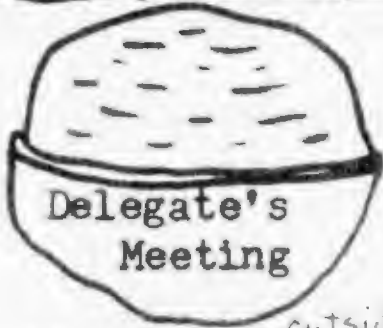

In a nutshell.....

N N J S D A

January 23, 1972

"...meeting started a little late due to janitor not being aware we were having a meeting at the Madison Library....being a nice day, delegates passed the time away ^{outside} by reading the latest copy of GRAND SQUARE....all clubs present except Cloverleafs, Country Promenaders, Isle Squares, Mountain Squares, and Swingin' Stars...6 club presidents also came.....a budget will be presented at the April delegate's meeting....balance on hand now \$2024.23 with several large outstanding bills ...NNJSDA dances will be May 8, 1972 with Ron Schneider; Sept. 30 Phil Adams; March 31, 1973; Sept. 29 Ed Fraidenburg; Mar 29, 1974 Red Bates....summer dates are June 28, July 19, 26 Aug. 2, 9, 16, 23 and 30...The Ron Schneider dance will be at the West Essex High School in Caldwell, NJ and is not for new graduates.....The Lutz have visited 18 beginner classes and are setting up graduation plans.....the Mooneys asked clubs to start thinking NOW for their next years classes and also how to publicize the Square Dance Week next September...it was announced Squarenaders is no longer an active club....please let the NNJSDA know when you change the delegate so the new delegate will get the proper mailings....The R/D Council Round Up was socially successful and broke even in spite of the torrential rains....By-Laws revision committee announced the committee had reviewed the Constitution and By-Laws and would soon get their suggested changes to the Executive Board....they questioned - are we too geographically spread out; do we need a secret ballot; is the 15 mile radius for conflicts enough; are 20 lesson adequate for beginners;... Festival questionnaires are slowly coming back....February was announced as BOOSTER Month for Grand Square with the delegates urged to PUSH their sale....Warren & Barbara Brown were announced as the new advertising editors...See Saw Squares were accepted into membership...teens will pay full price at all NNJSDA dances except the graduates ball when it will be half price....rules for Freeloaders were changed to attendance at all 8 summer dances....baby sitting felt unnecessary for the graduates ball - suggested all graduates be reminded to leave small children at home....suggestion was raised that several s/d clubs sponsor classes together if all had too small a class to financially keep going....Basic Booklets are under review by committee with Dick Lighthipe as Chairman and Vin Caruso and Hal Holmes helping...it was suggested when booking an out of the area caller, the club arrange for an exclusive booking in the area so the caller will not be tempted to book other clubs nearby....a reminder that the NNJSDA has first priority on all 5th Fridays and Saturdays....it was also suggested clubs try to book specials on their own dance nights so as not to conflict with any other area clubs....during the mid-meeting break refreshments were served by Ramapo Squares, Richmond Dancers and Princeton Squares....next meeting and election of our new officers is set for April 16, 1972 at the Madison Library in Madison, NJ at 2 PM....."

from the desk of GEORGE & PHYLLIS COWAN, presidents, NNJSDA

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome all of the new graduate dancers into the wonderful world of square dancing. As each of you receive your diploma and club badges you have obtained all of the outward signs of a full-fledged square dancer.

However, a diploma is much more a key to new opportunities and responsibilities than a certificate of accomplishment. Today, new dancers face a much greater challenge to achieve comfortable club level dancing proficiency than was true ten or more years ago. There are so many more basic movements and variations that the learning process is continuous.

Consequently your first responsibility is to continue to learn. Attend your club regularly and get into the habit of dancing at least once a week if at all possible. While no one expects perfection (and few achieve this, anyway), your fellow club members can only do so much. They depend on your applying yourselves so the level of the club and the overall enjoyment of the dance is maintained during the period of your apprenticeship. The Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association is sponsoring a GRADUATES BALL on Sunday afternoon, April 9th especially to introduce you to other callers and their styles and give you a chance to dance with graduates from other clubs and some of the old-timers too. We hope to meet most of you at this dance.

Aside from your technical self-improvement, your second responsibility is to the club that sponsored you. Become an active member. This involves a variety of things but most important, mix and join in the activities. Square up with the older dancers. Don't always wait to be asked. You can learn a great deal with experienced dancers and they can help you over some of the "rough spots".

The third and most important responsibility is your social attitude. Square dancers come from all walks of life and social backgrounds. They bring with them into the activity all of the latent prejudices and viewpoints that one would expect from such a cross-section. Don't draw firm conclusions about people or situations from first impressions. Listen to the varying points of view and reach your own decisions on what is good or bad. Remember that on any issue, whether it be the quality of a caller, the friendliness of a club, the character of an officer, etc. there will be at least two schools of thought in any discussion. Square dancers have strong opinions on such things. Beware of the constant critic; rather base your actions on what will be best for square dancing as a whole.

All of these responsibilities are also opportunities. Given a reasonable chance, square dancing will make a greater impact on your future life than perhaps any other single activity has done in the past. Without exaggeration, square dancing is the finest couple social activity available today, and we are pleased that you have decided to be a part of it.

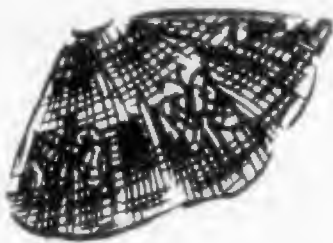


This issue we'll discuss that 'in' fabric for spring- the square dancer's most versatile fabric- Gingham. small checks-medium or large anyway you look at it it's GINGHAM.....

Ginghams lend themselves very easily to both liquid and regular embroidery. Simple designs can be put to use as lovely borders.

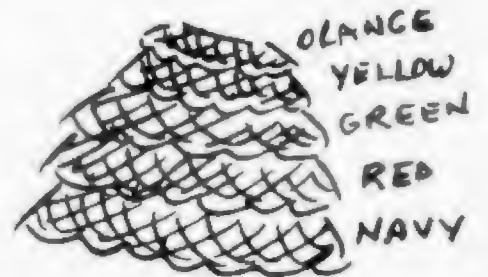


A 3-tiered skirt could use 3 sizes of checks, small nearest the waist, largest at the hem; a matching blouse could be made with the smaller check in the lower half; and sleeves and yoke in a larger one.



A dress or skirt of small checks lends itself nicely to applique's of larger checks, such as butterflies or flowers. You are as always limited only by your imagination. If you're short on ideas a trip to the library or children's bookshelf can provide many to capitalize on. Just make notes when the ideas strike.

Still another idea would be a skirt of several flounces, checks all same size, but all in different colors. Again the blouse could use mini-ruffles of each color as trim, either on the sleeves, down the front bodice or in scattered applique's.



Ginghams are inexpensive; come in perma press types, too; come in rainbows of colors; all sizes to suit all types; and are a perfect fabric to start a square dance wardrobe with. Your scraps will make a handsome tie for your husband. Try and see for yourself.

In the last issue we mentioned that there are some low-priced mail-order places to obtain satisfactory trimmings. I'd like to share one with you.

Home-Sew Inc. of Bethlehem Pa. is such a place. For 25¢ they will send you a small catalog of their merchandise. Example- 22" nylon zippers cost 2 for 70¢. Hemming lace costs 10 yds for 40¢. In their catalog is an offer for a 'sample club'-this costs 25¢ for which they send you a card featuring actual samples of about a dozen trimmings on special- in that particular style & color. As long as you order something from the current card you will automatically get the next one (about 8 weeks later). This may help you and your sewing friends get started.



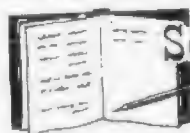
