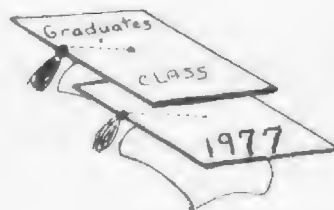

The Quarterly Movements Report by CALLERLAB

The committee has selected one experimental basic to feature for the quarter beginning in April thru June. CROSSFIRE....Ron Schneider, Fla.

The action starts from a two face line.....The ends of the line will cross fold as the centers will trade, then extend (step ahead) to join hands with the dancer who has completed the cross fold.....

What is CALLERLAB? - The International Association of Square Dance Callers. In the planning stages since 1960, it became reality in 1971...presently it has a membership of approximately 600 callers from all parts of the world. Their 4th convention is scheduled for early April in Kansas City. Their accomplishments include - establishment of the Quarterly Movements Program (see above), coordinating of the Mainstream Basics List, initiating an accreditation program for callers (see last issue), level identification research, publishing a book on Halls for S/Ding & developing a workable curriculum for callers' schools..It is an involvement organization with its members taking an active part on committees. Currently their chairman is Jim Mayo and John Kaltenthaler is Executive Secretary. A number of NNJ callers will be attending the CALLERLAB meeting this April.

LEGACY is not to be confused with CALLERLAB. LEGACY began to develop as an idea in the early 70's. The purpose of this group is to coordinate the various phases of the s/d activity. These include: Square Dancer Associations, Caller Associations, CALLERLAB, Round Dance Teacher Associations, The National S/D Convention, The Lloyd Shaw Foundation, S/D Publications, S/D Record companies, Special Groups, Special Projects, S/D Suppliers and the American S/D Society. As a non-profit organization, it is basically a communicating center for the whole activity and welcomes suggestions, ideas and questions from leadership. Their third convention is scheduled for this May down in Memphis. Its second convention in '75 attracted 145 to Cleveland, including Doc & Peg Tirrell, John & Betty Pedersen and John & Freddie Kaltenthaler. Invitations are issued at the suggestion of present "trustees", and by approval of the Board of Directors to men and women of proven leadership ability.

BUD MILLER was a gentle person but one whose unselfish character and warm personality had been a tribute to square dancing. For many years he aspired to be a caller and it was most fortunate for everyone that he realized his ambition. As a very accomplished dancer he always patiently helped those in difficulty. He had a ready smile, a kind word and a friendly hand for everyone. Bud Miller was the epitome of the perfect square dancer and he will be sorely missed. To Elsie and the family we offer our most sincere sympathy.

2nd VP = So far visited 15 of the 23 classes & 1 graduation at Rutgers have noticed some people are repeating the course....suggests angels dress in proper s/d attire to give a good impression. Reminded all proper S/D attire is required at all NNJSDA Dances.

3rd VP- reported on successful half time demo at Rutgers football game may be repeated next season...Solitaires has applied for membership....reminded all of poster contest for National S/D Week

R/D Liaison- reported R/D LC plans a Spring Bouquet of Rounds May 15. Council is hosting Trail End R/D in Atlantic City Wed, June 22.

GRAND SQUARE - explained Booster Drive (\$1 per person for a tag) and urged all for their support, including s/d classes. Thank to drive & ad revenue we ended last year in black. GRAND SQUARE not available at the meeting for distribution as the presses broke down- arrangements for distribution at a later date were made.

OLD BUSINESS- MINI FESTIVAL- a social & financial success; 214 couples from 58 clubs. (72 had attended in '74; 92 in '75) Mooneys thanked all for their support, esp. the DoYLES & Schmidts (registrars). Suggested the retiring Ass'n. president move on to Mini-Festival chairman. Presented \$832 check to NNJSDA Treasurer...CCNJ LIAISON - requested feedback on CCNJ system of club ratings; mentioned Jan 30th student dances and Feb 27th class/club dances...NATIONAL CONVENTION- We are responsible for providing floor & workers hospitality...need about 900 volunteers...urge all to talk up convnetion...over 14,000 registered now...suggest you get a program booklet to better plan your day at convention...cookbooks at \$3.50-an excellent buy...INSURANCE - 13 clubs as of 1/16/77 enrolled in plan; 4 needed higher limits of insurance & NYS based clubs can secure insurance thru NYS Federation...10 clubs not heard from...TRAIL IN DANCE-Wanda & Stan Blanchard, chairmen have secured Holy Spirit Parish Center in Pequannock LUST 4 fun- 17 page summary distributed to all clubs...next LUST date set for Sunday, Sept 11, 1977...ASSOCIATION DUES -delegates passed a change in dues to a sliding scale of 10¢ per member with a minimum of \$5.00 a year.

NEW BUSINESS - Delegates voted to take full page ad in 26th National Program booklet at \$250....plans underway to have clubs handle punch detail on rotating basis for summer dances.....Nominating Committee composed of Dell"angelos, Rellingers, & Arkins, Chr.....NYS State Federation Tax case= delegates were appised of situation (see holiday issue '76)- the federation is seeking donation to help pay their legal fees....Delegates were reminded to urge their clubs to incorporate....Sol sent all the necessary papers in one of the presidential newsletters...?asked if Association can help a club in financial problems - (continued on page 17)

CONVENTION NEWS for **ALL** Square Dancers & Most Especially, Recent Graduates...

A perhaps once a lifetime happening will be coming to Atlantic City in just 2 short months - the 26th National S/D Convention on June 23, 24 & 25th. Some readers have been to previous conventions, some recall the last East Coast one in Philadelphia in '67, & still others have no idea of this great event. To the latter group we say, "try it, you'll like it." A s/d convention is unlike any s/d experience you've had to date. The National Committee expects this to be THE BEST yet & they're planning something for everyone! Besides every level of s/r & contra dancing, you can learn to clog & folk dance; you may want to attend some of the seminars, sewing clinics, bid session, workshops & roundtable discussions, & of course you won't want to miss the fashion show or some of the 20 exhibition groups, or the Parade of States.

For the remainder of this newsnote we'd like to share answers to some ?'s people have proposed to us over the past 4-yrs. which might give you an insight of what to expect at this fantastic yearly world-wide event. First, your whole family can register; the 3 days dancing costs only \$6.75/person & includes a name badge which is worn at all s/d functions. Children under 2 years of age will be admitted free but everyone else - dancers & nondancers alike - must register. And there are no exceptions! Visitors will be permitted to view the dancing for a nominal daily fee. Your lodging, food, drink, & extra curricular activities are all additional, of course and should be planned according to your own individual budget. Babysitting services will be available through your hotel manager. A large well-prepared program book can be purchased for \$1.25 which lists the time schedules for every caller and hall being used. This is not only a nice souvenir but is designed to help you determine each day where and to whom you want to dance & how often. There will be 6 large square dance halls with all levels of dancing - from the Extended Basics to Mainstream and Mainstream Plus, Advanced & challenge and for those who are good Mainstream dancers and would like to try a bit more, there will be an introduction to advanced level dancing every afternoon from 1-2 pm.

Round dancers will have the best facilities of any convention to date. There will be 40,190 sq. ft. in 3 beautiful rooms, exclusively for rounds and there will also be rounds between squares in both the Miss America and Atlantic City rooms, so pack your dancing shoes and enjoy a total of 249,928 sq. ft. for squares, rounds, contra, clogging & youth dancing - all under one completely air-conditioned roof! The sound at the 26th National will be excellent; sound in all 10 halls will use Hilton equipment which will be engineered, installed and monitored throughout the entire convention by Jim Hilton & Associates.

Campers will be happy to know that 2000 campsites have been personally inspected and approved by the committee and all camping reservations should be made through the Registration Chairpersons. Trams and a jitney service will be available for transportations to and from the convention center and though owners of motor homes & truck campers can not stay overnight, change clothes or use the facilities while parked, a designated area will be available from 9am until 1:30 am for parking about 300 recreational vehicles each day. (More on the convention on page 10+14.)



26th National Square Dance Convention



Youth dancers have not been forgotten and will probably have the time of their lives with many happy memories of the 26th, as activities galore are planned for them, including 10,000 sq. ft. of space in the Ragtime Room devoted to youth exclusively. They will have their own get acquainted parties, workshops on squares, rounds & line dances, & at least 2 hours of teen callers each day, They also have 1/2 day ocean fishing trip planned and will surely enjoy the amusements & pop concerts on the Steel Pier.

An Information Booth, Lost & Found, and a First Aid Station will be just inside the main entrance directly off the Boardwalk. About 250 s/d apparel shops will have oodles of supplies lest you forget a piece of necessary wearing apparel, & it should be noted here that proper s/d attire is mandatory at all functions. The reason behind this is that half the fun of being a s/dancer is dressing like one, and some clubs or groups from different States even choose matched outfits so they are easily identified throughout the arena.

As you may or may not know, States who want to host a convention must bid for the opportunity; the bid session is open to viewers and it is interesting to listen to representatives go before the National Committee to state the reasons why they feel their area should be granted an upcoming convention. Sometime Saturday night the bid is awarded to the winning state and this year Atlanta & Seattle will be bidding for the 1981 National.

Another important note to share with you is that YOU plan your dance time & leisure time the way YOU wish. Leisure time activities (besides walking on the famous Boardwalk, seeing the Million Dollar Steel Pier, arcades & swimming in the Atlantic) will include sightseeing tours to points of interest in nearby States, shopping sprees, a deep sea fishing trip and a genuine old-fashioned clambake for both adults and children. There are not many women callers and many dancers have never seen one. But at our February Valentine Dance Shirley Richard (now Mrs. Stevens) delighted us with a solid performance. She has a good voice, good beat and pleasing stage mannerisms. Instead of calling "four-hands-round" she substitutes "Happy Valentine's day" which proved to be a real crowd pleaser. We predict she'll be heard from more often in this area. Recall is the movement. For some time SS has been embarrassed by the smallness of its annual Booster contribution. The reason is that by the time we dance, other clubs have met and pre-empted us. Well, this year officers of the club held back their purchases until our time came around. ready to go to Convention.....



June...Atlantic City....Convention....they're all just
around the corner and will be here before you know it.

Club presidents...if your club hasn't already made a
club uniform it's time to get busy.....how about a
club outfit that would be individual and yet somehow
identifiable with your club??? If you purchased one
or two bolts of fabric in a bright, not too common
print, a type of fabric that were completely drip-dry
and had a little body, then resold to your club mem-
bers a length of fabric to make a skirt of their own
choosing. All the skirts would match yet the styles
would be different and individual. Their scraps could
be made into ties for a co-ordinated look for hubby.
A bolt of fabric has about 25 yards on it and most
fabrics are 45" wide (woven not knits). Talk it over
and come up with something so when your group 'comes
marching in' they'll present a proud picture.

With convention and the coming of summer dances, they
often have the halls air-conditioned at least at the
start and a little cover-up is most welcome. It's
not too late to knit or crochet a little capelet that
will cover your shoulders and allow freedom of move-
ment of your arms and still stay fastened about the
neck-shawls keep slipping off and sweaters are too
bulky.

Plan your wardrobe to do double duty wherever possible,
a change of blouses and the look is different and the
space of another dress was saved....Sew up some bags
for your petticoats of clear plastic (an old shower
curtain or liner is great) cut into gores, sew 2 or 3
to make a bag, add wide bias tape casings at top and
bottom and use a ribbon or string for drawstrings...
A clear plastic wrap-style circle skirt with velcro
at the waistband for a closure would be a perfect
'umbrella' for your skirt and protect it where the
umbrella doesn't cover it. Make the waistband of fabric
putting your name on the inside for identification
and a loop or two for hanging up to dry...Look in the
pattern books for take-along accessories for your
travel needs, easy to make and a delight to take.....
Whatever, plan to come to Atlantic City and enjoy.....

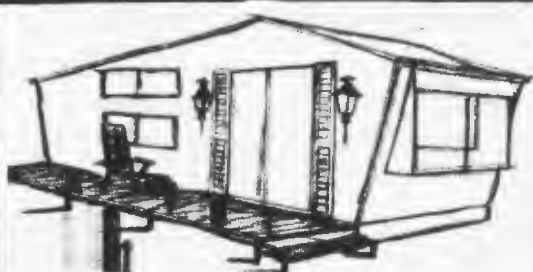
