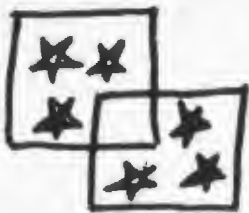
from the desk of JIM & FAY BATES, presidents NNJSDA

Those in attendance at the September 18 Delegate's Meeting witnessed a truly exceptional event, when the Musials and the Bottas, representing the 26th National Square Dance Convention presented your Association with a check for \$1,743.24. This was a return of the sum raised by the NNJSDA-sponsored Booster Dance. In addition to this check, they presented another, for \$500, for Education in our area. Other groups who were beneficiaries of this largess were the Round Dance Leaders Council and the Callers Council.

This "return" of monies previously presented was all the more gratifying because it was unexpected. All right, so the Association raised dollars for the 26th, but our contribution did not obligate the Convention Management in any way.

As we are all aware, the NNJSDA's contribution did not center on dollars and cents - our 1,000 workers, plus also made a considerable contribution in time and effort, to the success of the 26th.

That the Atlantic City Convention was well managed is obvious. We are now benefitting from the sound fiscal policies followed. The transfer of funds from one organization to another, and then back to the first group, indicates that both we, and the Federation of Delaware Valley Square and Round Dancers, want to be good neighbors, and underscores the fact that "Friendship is Square Dancing's Greatest Reward."

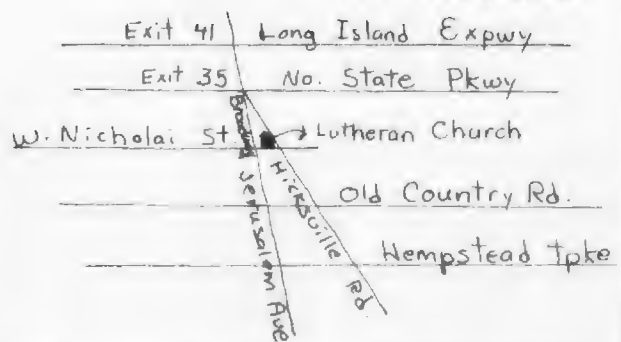

 "In a Nutshell" September 18, 1977

"...in attendance all clubs except Kings Squares, Kittatinny Rangers and Princeton Squares...19 presidents, 1 VP, 2 alternate delegates, representatives from Garden State Campers, Lakeland Squares, Kuntry Kuzn's, CCNJ (Jean Kellogg) and the Bottas and the Musials from the 26th National S/D Convention.....

1st VP - thanked everyone for their help at the summer dances...average 31 squares...more teens this year...85 freeloaders...Next special Sept. 30 with Red Bates at Cedar Hill School in Basking Ridge

2nd VP - 21 clubs have classes...mailed info to over 150 people...Basic Manuals available for clubs whose class membership is established.

3rd VP - distributed 1000 small & equal number large size of winning poster; sent press releases to 130 newspapers...resulting in fantastic response... What is Modern American Square Dancing available for all clubs to use when doing demonstration, etc...S/D week proclamation received and distributed to all clubs and many papers...is working with CCNJ to coordinate demonstration requests...see p.53 for info on Bill in Congress to make S/D the National Folk Dance.

OLD BUSINESS - Ed Bell reported on INSURANCE (see page 40); 33 sets attended the STAN BURDICK April dance; 58 squares attended the GRADUATES BALL in Montville; 32 paid sets (the English visitors were our guests) were at the TRAIL-IN Dance; The Mooneys gave a wrap up report on the 26th NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION. They then presented the Musials & the Bottas.

Steve Musial gave a brief report and read the financial statement and presented Frank with the checks for the NNJSDA, CCNJ, NNJRDLC (see page 12)

Approximately 3000 people helped to put on the convention...it would cost 2 1/2 million for a private organization to duplicate the 26th National;

LUST '77 - Yale summarized the day...over 200 attended...most would like it to be longer...many said they would come even without a dance afterwards

Lust was explained as a dialogue between all persons associated with s/ding

MINI-FESTIVAL - all is in readiness for Sunday, Nov. 27

May your holidays be happy, healthy ones.



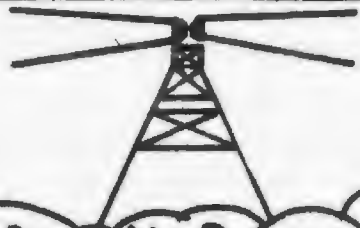

(Approximately 24 NNJSDA clubs are so insured; NY based clubs are not eligible, but may secure similar coverage thru the NY State S&RD Federation)

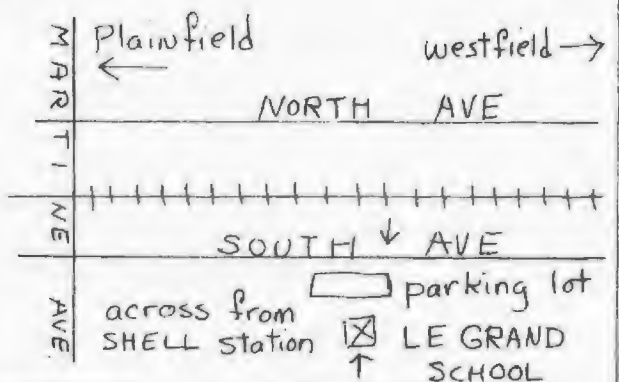

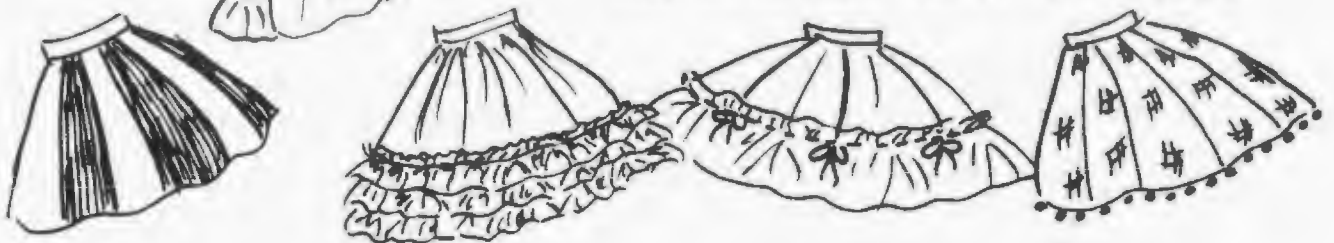

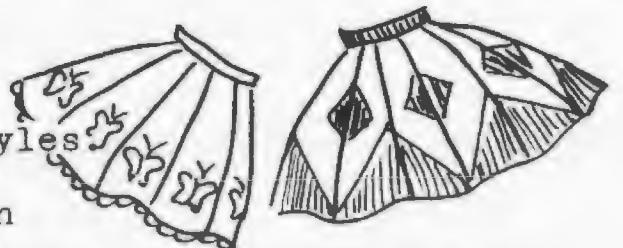


Short gores with the addition of a flounce or ruffle....
