Which is all to the good, as it tends to bring a sense of equality between all dancers.



Most club badges proclaim this information enthusiastically, as most display in a creative manner. The SQUARE PINCUSHION shares with you bits and pieces from our mailbag....



First, an addition to the information about square dance patterns and their availability which I mentioned in the last issue-Until now I was unaware that some of our square dance apparel shops also carry patterns so please accept my apology for not mentioning them. Authentic patterns are available also at Hickory Hills in East Brunswick, also some patterns at Hannelore's Korner in New Milford, and some at Shirley's Square Dance Shoppe in Hughsonville N.Y. I'd suggest a call in advance to see if what you're looking for is to be had in your size. If there are other locations for square dance patterns I'm not aware of the fact and am sorry if I neglect to mention it. However, we'll share your findings if you get the information to me.

A helpful hint from reader and dancer Kathryn Hill of Blairstown. This is a most helpful hint for the hemming of circular skirts. Machine stitch a row where the hem will be turned first. This will keep it from stretching. Turn on this line of stitching and stitch both thicknesses about 2° from the bottom. You can add a second stitching if desired. This type of hem will eliminate the excess bulk and your skirt will have a nicer swing. Try it.....

Caller Bobkellogg's wife, Jean, has a super idea for getting more mileage in an outfit- make a skirt and a separate bib top to convert the skirt to a jumper and fasten it with velcro....Velcro is available in fabric shops by the inch and is much better than sewing lots of snaps.

And with summer approaching atip from an anonymous dancer concerning what to do with that little pursemake a small clutch-type bag, making two large buttonholes in the rear section for your belt to go through...presto your purse is with you and out of the way...



FOLLOW UP - Regional S/D Meeting - MASA [Mid Atlantic States Association]

On March 18 two NNJSDA couples (Jim/Fay Bates; Sol/Harriette Koved) represented the Ass'n at this regional meeting in Harrisburg, PA. 37 dancers (including 5 Ass'n/Fed presidents) from 4 states attended "to air pros & cons of organizing a multi state regional ass'n, whereupon data would be returned to the dancers for a vote determining pursuit of such an Association." Discussions were held on a possible regional associations' objectives, its financing and communications. Other topics included Bylaws, education, S/Ding and callers, hall rentals and the National S/D Convention and what changes the fuel crunch may evoke. If Steve Musial hadn't kept to a time schedule the group would still be there talking!

Most present were in accord to explore further a regional ass'n, provided the clubs and ass'ns represented by this leadership approve it with a June 1st deadline for replies. Our delegates voted their reply in April.

CATCHERICALE

The International Association of Square Dance Callers

For the quarter beginning April 1, 1979, CALLERLAB has voted NO NEW MOVE-MENTS. For those groups who wish to use some workshop material during the Mainstream Dances, we recommend you feature some of the calls from the Mainstream list that you haven't used too frequently in the past. The Mainstream emphasis calls for the quarter beginning April I, 1979 are The FOLD and CIRCULATE Families. There is a great deal of material that is waiting to be used if we, as callers, work at it and present it to the dancers in a palatable fashion. Or, you might wish to use some smooth flowing All Position Dancing (APD) material. Please remember that the theme for the 6th CALLERLAB Convention is Comfortable Dancing in the Proper Spirit.

We would also like to remind you readers that the purpose of the Quarterly Selections Committee was to review the available moves with an eye towards selecting moves that were suitable for workshopping at the Mainstream Clubs. A Mainstream Club is one where the majority of dancers dance on the average of once a week or perhaps twice a month. While there is no shortage of moves being written by today's choreographers, there is a distinct lack of moves that offer the potential widespread use at Mainstream Clubs.

OUARTERLY SELECTION COMMITTEE reports...

(copy from CALLS 'n' CUES of WASCDA)

When CALLERLAB established this program, we felt that some guidance was needed to limit the number of new calls that many dancers were being exposed to. While some dancers and some clubs can handle several new calls each month, many dancers and clubs cannot. It was with this in mind that CALLER LAB decided to select 0, 1 or 2 calls per quarter to be emphasized in those groups where workshopping was desired. It was not the intent that all clubs would use any given figure. For instance, last quarter, the figure TWO STEPS AT A TIME was selected. Some groups are not yet comfortable with the Basic PEEL OFF. We would urge that the caller for those clubs not use the Quarterly Selection in that ease. CALLERLAB is not trying to dictate policy to any club or caller, rather, we are trying to provide a screening process that will enable dancers to get some new material in a controlled manner that will offer a longer lasting appeal to the majority of dancers.

Each year, during the CALLERLAB Convention, the membership votes on the list of Quarterly Selections to reduce the list to no more than 10 calls. Obviously, this means that some calls will be dropped. A call may be recommended for inclusion at the Mainstream level if it has been on the Quarterly Selection list for a period of not less than three years.

Our thanks to ART SEELE, CCNJ President, for the following report on CALLERLAB's annual meeting....

The sixth annual convention of the International Association of Square Dance Callers (CALLERLAB) was held on April 9 thru 11, 1979 at the Los Angeles Marriott Hotel stressing "Comfortable Dancing in the Proper Spirit". The attendance exceeded 900 and included 540 callers from 41 states, 5 provinces of Canada and 5 foreign countries (New Zealand, The Netherlands, Japan, England, and Aus-

tralia). There were many significant actions taken by this group and these will be reported in detail in later issues.

Jon Jones of Texas was elected to Chairman of the Board and his Executive Committee for 1979-80 will include Al Brundage of Florida, Herb Egender of Colorado, Bill Peters of California, Dave Taylor of Illinois and John Kaltenthaler of PA who was reappointed as Executive Secretary.

It was resolved that the following basics or parts of basic families be deleted from the MS & that they be referred to the Plus Level Committee:
#19 Couples Lead Left #25 Swat the Flea #33 Shoot the Star (3/4)

#19 Couples Lead Left #25 Swat the Flea #33 Shoot the Star #38 Couples Backtrack #56 Cast Family (1/4,1/2, In, Right, Left) Discussion: This would leave the Cast Family as only Cast Off 3/4

Backtrack will be added to U Turn Back & will read U Turn Back/Backtrack.

While the CALLERLAB members revamped and renumbered their Programs, there were no sweeping changes. The BASIC Program (B) now goes only thru 37 with the changes mentioned on page 45. EXTENDED BASIC (EB) Program is renumbered but remains basically the same with the addition of #38 Turn Thru and #40 Ocean Wave Family with a. Right b. Left C. Balance and d. Pass the Ocean. Ferris Wheel was added as number 53.

In the MAINSTREAM Program (MS) #56 is now Cast Off 3/4. The definitions for the calls 39 thru 69 on the 7th draft (shows how hard & long they discussed these points) of the MS listing were adopted on a one year trial basis. Special emphasis is being placed on #69 - RECYCLE. It is redefined as ... "Starting from an Ocean Wave, the ends of the wave Cross Fold as the centers of the wave fold in behind the ends and follow them on around to face in as a pair." In other words a NO hands movement.

As for the QUARTERLY SELECTION LIST (QS) - Chase Right and Coordinate were all moved to the Plus One listing. Trade the Wave, which was also on the Plus One list, was taken off OS and left in +1. Stroll and Cycle and Grand Weave were dropped altogether. Roll was extended, or really clarified to be used only from the following: a. Adjacent columns Trade & Roll; b. Centers of wave or 2 Faced lines Trade and Roll; c. Half Tag Trade & Roll; d. Partner Trade & Roll.


CALLERLAB recommends 41 weeks of $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ hour lessons of approximately 80 hours of instruction to teach the MAINSTREAM PROGRAM (Calls 1-69). They ask callers to not teach just from a single position/formation and to also teach styling as well.

Other than the additions mentioned above to the Plus I listing, Plus I and Plus II remain the same.
