He said that the 1st prize winner of a contest would receive an expense paid weekend in Philadelphia. The runner up, as a second prize, would receive two free weekends in the same town. The remark was meant to reflect unkindly on our fine neighbor to the south, but we can vouch for some splendid square dance weekends in Philadelphia - or many other places, for that matter.

The weekend has become a S/D institution - one which promises a wealth of good dancing, good times & good fellowship. As a matter of fact, it seems that the nicest people attend such events & chances are that you

will come away with a number of new & good friends.

S/D weekends come in a variety of shapes and sizes to fit every individual taste. They range from an event sponsored by a club or caller & featuring one caller to a grand area promotion involving six or more callers, many ballrooms & a choice of levels. Do you dig camping? --outdoors groups sponsor these affairs, too. How about a cruise?

The sites for these get-togethers run the gamut from a modest hostelry in the "country" to a posh hotel in a city center - even Philadelphia. Some with meals, some without. Or, cook your own. And if round dancing

is your thing -- that's offered, too.

There are two pitfalls which can detract from your enjoyment to a very large extent. If the weekend has just one caller, then the many sessions require that he have a talent which avoids repetitious choreography - or

boredom is the result. Be selective for a weekend of this type.

The 2nd consideration is level. Regardless of the number of callers on the program, it is important to determine if there is a level with which you will be comfortable. There is nothing more miserable than to be locked into a constant diet of dancing far below or much too difficult for your ability or preference. Be sure to check out this important point. Far too few flyers mention specific level plans.

very quickly understand why we ask the dancers to support the Ass'n dances.




The SQUARE PINCUSHION makes vests.....



With cooler temperatures upon us what would be more practical than a vest for him and her? And as you will see the possibilities are limitless.




For added warmth, the vests designed for winter should be quilted. Now quilting can be done by machine or by hand or the fabric can be bought pre-quilted. Quilted fabric consists of three layers, the top, the stuffing and the bottom or lining layer. The top layer can be



made of corduroy, cotton, velvet, wool, fake suede, or almost whatever pleases you and your purse. Be sure to preshrink washable fabrics and woolens and in the case of non-washables know

the cleaning required. If you're planning to do the quilting yourself, do the quilting before cutting out the vest pattern. Quilting can be done in

pattern. Quilting can be done in squares or diamonds, or the new style in channels or if your top fabric is a print it can be out-




line quilted causing the design that is outlined to puff up. Place your pattern pieces carefully to take advantage of a design or if the fabric has a nap your pieces must all be placed in the same direction. Vest patterns with only 3 ppces (2 fronts and 1 back) work best. If you wish your vest to have the addition of a yoke, add that as a single layer of fabric over the top of front and/or back.

WRONG SIDE

Sew darts if called for, then your shoulder and side seams. Finish your outer edges last. Outer edges may be enclosed in fold-over braid, self or contrasting fabric, fake suede or bias tape. Next come the closures. Some

people like vests without closures but they should be given a choice. You can use buttons and buttonholes, or snaps, or buttons with chain loops, or toggles, or ties, or loops and buttons or velcro. From a scrap of self-fabric or the

type used for the trim, cut a small rectangle and make a pocket flap. Fold in half lengthwise, right sides together; sew sides, trim & turn. Press. Turn under the raw edges and baste in place on the left side of



vest. Sew on. Attach a snap to the center bottom and the other half of snap to the vest. Use this to attach the badgeholder with your badge. Fernaps, A piece of interfacing inside the flap and a small square on the reverse side of the vest under the area where the snap would be attached would be helpful as this will be a stressful area. A few notes- your lining fabric should if possible be made of a slippery fabric as this makes putting the vest on easier. And the best filling would be dacron. These would be super for Christmas gifts.

QUARTERLY SELECTION COMMITTEE reports ...

The International Association of Square Dance Callers

For the quarter beginning Oct. 1. CALLERLAB has selected one new movement for use in

workshops at Mainstream Dances. This move was written by Lee Kopman and is called COUPLE UP. From any Box Circulate Foursome, ALL BOX CIRCULATE one place and, without stopping, those facing out turn back in the direction of body flow to end in facing pairs. (For Right Handed Boxes, the flow is to the right and for Left Handed Boxes, the flow is to the left.)

Timing is 6 steps.

Please remember that this is in the Quarterly Selection category and does not mean that all MS dancers must learn the figure but only those groups that enjoy something extra. It should be workshopped before being called at any dance advertised as a MS Dance. It appears to be another good way to get into facing couples from waves. It can be varied as to girls or boys doing the turn back and can be called from any of the formation partner pairings that permit this definition to be used (APD). Please note, however, that not all groups desire this call in other than standard positioning,

Excerpts from Joe DiSano's remarks at LUST on"Levels-Need, use & Abuse"

"The introduction some years ago of the dance level identification system by CALLERLAB was celebrated as a milestone in the S/D movement. This universally accepted system, identifying calls of the various levels, was most welcome. It became a very useful tool for clubs since they were now able to select & advertise their level of dance. The intent of the dance level identification is commendable. The results disappointing.

It seems that s/ding, insofar as our association clubs are concerned, is in an era of specialization, catering for the most part only to those dancers in the plus l or higher levels. It's quite obvious that advancing to higher levels of dance became the "in" thing to do in the late 1970's. The dance level identification system provided the "means" for this rapid advancement,

Presently, of the 3500 members of the 36 clubs in the NNJSDA, 80% are with clubs dancing at a +1 or higher level; 17% are with clubs dancing at a Mainstream plus Quarterly Selections level; & less than 3% with the one & only Association club dancing at a Mainstream level. The record clearly indicates an unusually high percentage of dancers concentrated in the +1 or higher levels. In the last 3 years, 21 clubs have advanced their level of dance. In the same 3 years over 2000 dancers have been lost by Association clubs. For the 1980-1981 season one club has already announced a change to advance level of dance & an effort is being made to start an A-1 level club on Staten Island. I believe that the clubs' infatuation with dance level identification & their quest for attaining level improvement translates into difficult times for the S/D movement in the 1980's. Policies to be decided on now will do much to determine whether S/D membership surges ahead during the 1980's or enters a period of prolonged stagnation. 49 (continued on page

I believe it is essential that strong action be taken to assure a proper representation of clubs at the MS level of dance. We must accommodate those dancers who wish to remain at the MS level &, especially the new graduates who have completed a very elementary education. MS dancing represents an integral part of our S/D movement & to ignore its meed would certainly not be in the interest of square dancing. It's naive & self-defeating to pretend we can continue the same policies as in the past. A study is necessary to revamp our system of instructions to reduce the tremendous gap that presently exists between class & club levels. Most important, membership requirements for the entrance of new clubs into the Association must be relaxed in order to permit the acceptance of MS clubs. We must make provisions for the dancer who wishes to dance only 2-3 times a month instead of the 2 times or more a week to maintain a +1 or higher level of dance.

I do not wish to imply that the dance level identification system devised by CALLERLAB has not served its purpose. CALLERLAB has provided a standard that is universally accepted. Unfortunately, Association clubs have concentrated too much of their effort on advancing to the higher levels of the system & focused narrowly on the necessary lower levels creating an unbalanced system. We must have a proper representation at all levels in order for the system to be successful. There must be variety. To retain the new crop of dancers harvested each year we will do well to insure that there are a sufficient number of MS clubs.

I, & perhaps many of you, belong to the school of thought that believes that square dancing, which includes persons in all walks of life, from teenagers to senior citizens, must be an activity which satisfies the needs of all dancers & not just a select few. Only in this way can we truthfully say that there is a place for everyone in our wonderful world of s/dancing."




