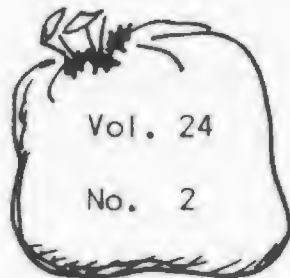

Treasurer gave detailed report including cost of a Delegates Meeting

1st VP - 21 sets average attendance at summer dances...thanked all for help with refreshments....22 sets at special dance where 352.76 donated to NJARC Covered Bridge Sq. highest attendance at summer dances - followed by Hix & Chix, Solitaires, Kings Squares & Richmond Dancers....34 Free loaders with 10 from Hix & Chix.....next special Jan. 30, '82 with Clint McLean in Montville, NJ....has confirmed summer dance schedule with callers & halls - 1st half in Lyndhurst, second half in Iselin....working on '83/'84 schedules...

Word from Senator Byrd's office in Washington, DC that the Senate Bill re: S/D passed 9/23/81. Now we need to get sponsors in the House of Representatives. It is #HJR 151 when you write your representative to co-sponsor.

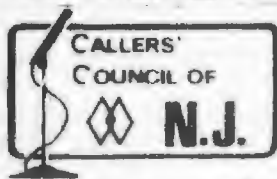
QUARTERLY SELECTION COMMITTEE reports.....

For the quarter beginning Oct. 1, CALLERLAB has selected two new movements for use in workshops at MS dances. CHAIN DOWN THE LINE - written by Don Beck... "From a right-hand two-faced line or left-hand ocean wave, centers trade while ends adjust as necessary. Then the ends courtesy turn the centers. Ending formation is facing couples." STAR THE ROUTE - written by Don Williamson... "From a static square, those designated (heads or sides) will complete the call. Example: the heads will Right Hand Star 3/4 to meet the couple on their right with a Left Hand Star one full turn....heads will meet back in the center of the set to Star Right 1/2 Way to meet the other sides with a Left Hand Star One Full Turn....Heads meet in the center for a Right Hand 3/4 Star back to home position. It takes 32 beats to execute STAR THE ROUTE."

The National S/D Convention Executive Committee feel that Education is a large part of their responsibility to the S/D activity. Arrangements have been made for CALLERLAB to again conduct the annual Callers Seminars at the NSDC in Detroit next June. Topics covered during the scheduled 12 hours are taken from the CALLERLAB approved curriculum and are decided upon by the CALLERLAB Executive Committee based upon who is staffing the sessions. These six two-hour periods are staffed with CALLERLAB approved Caller-Coaches whenever possible. Tho each session is geared towards general calling skills, they are independant from the others. All choreography sessions are limited to the use of MS figures & terms since this has the widest applicability within the S/D picture. This may not provide the same degree of education as a full Callers College, it does bring the expertise of several well qualified Caller-Coaches to various parts of the country at a convenient time. LEGACY has also received permission to coordinate a Dancer-Leader Seminar under the umbrella of the Education Committee. They will have two two-hour segments Friday & Saturday from 1 to 3 PM. ROUNDALAB is making arrangements to conduct sessions geared for R/D teachers. Something for everyone! And we urge all who have registered for the NSDC in Detroit to attend one or more of these free seminars.

To Whom It May Concern.....

"..On a recent holiday weekend, I was requested by a local club to donate my services for a demonstration....I believe it to be the obligation of a caller to give of his services whenever it is possible, & once a commitment has been made, I am honor-bound to do everything in my power to keep it, regardless of what (paying) offers may arrive after the commitment has been made. It is also my belief that most professional callers believe the same as I do.....As a fairly new caller, it is a source of great gratification to have so many & willing dancers turn out to dance on these occasions when I am donating my time. I believe that this is one of the best tools we have for gaining new dancers if a proper demonstration with non-dancer participation is given. How many new students we actually gain in this manner is difficult to ascertain. However, on these 2 days...I do know the clubs obtained a good number of names of people..... We had between 4 & 5 squares of regular dancers, which speaks very well for the dancers interest in helping obtain new students. Also we had dancers from at least 6 different area clubs, as well as most of the officers from 3 of the 4 local clubs on each of the 2 days. I find it to be a case of poor conscience & bad manners for the officers of the club involved in contacting me for this assignment, which I was happy to fulfill, not to even bother to take the time to at least participate in some part of this affair. I do understand that everyone has commitments to fulfill, but I also feel it is most unjust to ask me for my services when they are not willing to give at least a little of their own time. Even this lack of good manner can be acceptable if they explain in advance that they cannot attend...No, this does not mean that I won't gladly give of my services in the future...it only means that I find bad manners from anyone quite objectionable. Thank you for your time & patience in reading this letter explaining my feelings. I think we should all think more seriously of what we do, lest we should be ill mannered to our fellow dancers. After all, one of the biggest attractions to this wonderful activity of ours is the friendliness of those involved. I believe we should all try to keep that one of the big attractions....." A Caller
