






WELCOME! GRADUATES! to the wonderful, wide world of the Square Dance activity. Described below briefly are a few organizations whose names you will become more familiar with as time goes on. Their main purpose is the promotion, preservation & protection of S/Ding & its related activities.

CALLERLAB - The International Association of S/D Callers is the professional callers communication organization which has provided immediate & much needed leadership to the field of calling. Meets annually just prior to Easter. LEGACY - The International Assembly of Trustees representing ALL facets of the S/D activity. A non-legislative service, leadership, communications organization. It is Leadership, Education, Guidelines, Activities, & Commun-

ication. Meets biennially - next meeting, May 1983.

NATIONAL FOLK DANCE COMMITTEE - Is working to have s/ding officially declared the National Folk Dance of the United States. Several states have similar bills already passed. Cavanaughs are reinstigating a similar bill in New Jersey. Last bill passed both houses but Gov. Byrne did not sign it. LLOYD SHAW FOUNDATION - Provides school guidance programs & excellent leadership training sessions as well as maintaining archives S/D center. NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION - begins 4th Thursday in June...entirely run by s'ders. It's Executive Committee comprised of former General Chairmen. Runs for 3 days with something for everyone. 1982 is in Detroit, MI; '83-Louisville, KY; '84-Baltimore, MD; '85-Birmingham, AL. (Plan to attend) ROUNDALAB - The International Association of Round Dance Teachers formed to promote, protect & perpetuate the general R/D movement as a compliment to the overall S/D activity. Only teachers may belong. Meets annually-Oct. SQUARE DANCERS of AMERICA - Raises funds thru sale of roses (stuck on badges) designs, builds the S/D float for annual Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, CA. See p. 24 for how to apply to be chosen to dance on float. UNIVERSAL ROUND DANCE COUNCIL - Outgrowth of annual R/D convention. Membership open to both teachers & dancers. Convention in July held annually. UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA - Newly formed organization representing just dancers. Headquarters in California. Meets at NSDC in June.



Every convention has its own theme with an appropriate costume & logo. In January many delegates picked up instructions on sewing the BALTIMORE in '84 (or 33rd National S/D Convention) costume. Page 10b in our Winter Issue enlarged upon this information. Some dancers have asked for an explanation of their logo - which is displayed to your left - and is featured on the BALTIMORE BOOSTER

BALL (Saturday, July 24, 1982 in Whiting, NJ) flyer.

The overall concept combines landmarks of Baltimore with S/D symbols.

S/Ding is represented by the 2 dancers & the musical staff. The staff also reminds us of the Star Spangled Banner, whose history is so entertwined with Baltimore, as well as bringing to mind George M. Cohan's,,"IT's A Grand Old Flag", the convention theme.

Imagine yourself standing on the deck of the "Pride of Baltimore" sailing around the Inner Harbor. Looking from left to right you will see: First, a collection of building typical of the downtown area; next, the dome of the Administration Building of Johns Hopkins Hospital; the top of the Maryland National Bank Building (most noticeable because of flashing lights which spell MN); the Bromo-Seltzer Tower (with a clock face using the trade names & numerals to mark the hours on all four sides); The Washington Monument in Mt. Vernon Place (memorial to our first president situated in an elegant residental area just north of downtown); the roundhouse (part of Transportation Museum); World Trade Center at the Inner Harbor (excellent panoramic view from its 27th floor of Baltimore!); & finally the dome of the Baltimore City Hall (Recently restored post Civil War Bldg.). There you have it - Baltimore's essence captured in the blue & white logo and repeated on their badges, stationery, etc. Although the convention is mot until June '84, you can show your support July 24, 1982 in Whiting, NJ. Once people have a good time, the possibility is excellent that they will visit that club again.



Most graduates have received copies of the Illustrated Basic Movements of Square Dancing and/or the Mainstream Plus handbooks.put out by SQUARE DANCING magazine & dis-

tributed, at cost, by the NNJSDA 2nd VP.
As you've discovered, there is a pattern to square dancing with certain 3/D calls grouped together to make the learning process easier. These groupings, or LEVELS, are progressive as well as cumulative. CALLERLAB (page 44) has given these levels names - Basics - Extended Basics - Mainstream - Plus - Advanced - Challenge.

In NNJ our graduates have a fairly good working acquaintance with the calls that comprise the Basic & Extended Basic levels. Most graduates lave also been exposed to the calls that brings one into the Mainstream (MS) program. Graduates in this level of dancing may prefer to stay dancing at clubs in this MS level for awhile to develop confidence in their newly acquired language and the necessary skills.

Every 3 months, except in summer, CALLERLAB suggest 1 or 2 calls callers may want to workshop as an extra at the clubs that dance at Mainstream(MS). These extras are called Quarterly Selections (QS) and clubs that regularly

include these calls in their club program dance at QS level.

As dancers become comfortable in a certain level, they may want to move into the next level of calls. To do this, a dancer usually attends a series of workshops which are periodically held by callers to help the lancer learn the new terminology & become proficient in the calls.

We strongly suggest a dancer truthfully examine their dancing knowledge and attend the clubs or dance in the halls at festivals & balls where you are most comfortable. Every well run festival, ball or club will let you know the level they are dancing. It makes no difference at which level ou dance - many dancers can be comfortable at different levels - you'll find the same friendly, congenial people among those of the same dancing The enjoyment of the dance is the interaction among the people.

In NNJ most clubs advertise their level in GRAND SQUARE. Their caller ias been instructed to stay within the advertised level, although this does lot exclude a workshop tip of another level call if a club so desires. 25 of the Winter '82 issue....We have been dancing for 14 years, & we hope we know how to dance at MS level. We can assure the writers of the previous letter that the discrimination is not directed soley against beginners - it excludes anyone not in the select group. We have been in one club for a long time, & supported all their activities to the fullest extent. We have been "angeling" with the beginners class for several years - certainly not unalloyed pleasure. We noticed a strange thing. At the LAST class before graduation, several of the exclusive couples appeared as "angels" (for the first time.) Their real purpose was to judge the new crop of graduates, as the one or two best couples were then invited into the closed squares. We were never invited in, although we think we dance as well as a new graduate.

How does one cope with this situation, when all the club officers are

How does one cope with this situation, when all the club officers are in the elite squares? No use to protest to an officer. Once we were rash enough to suggest computerizing our club. The intensity of the negative reaction was amazing. By making such a suggestion, we were against America, the flag and motherhood. Oh well, the only thing left was to vote with our left. with our feet. Currently we are going to an Advanced Workshop run by Dick Jones, He uses computer cards to set up the squares; everyone is learning. We don't think we would be going there, if it were not computerized. We are quite willing to see our names signed.....But if you do a number of people will know exactly which club we are talking about. Use your own judgement. At least, mention that this is NOT written by the authors of the previous letter, so there are at least two couples who are unhappy with prefabricated squares."

"The letter....regarding pre-squaring elicits mixed response. We have all been guilty, at one time or another, of passing a square that we think won't make it, or being asked by another couple to dance & finding that 2 other couples have been asked too. It's sometimes funny to watch 4 couples converge from all parts of a room onto one single spot at the same time. Even NASA could not arrange a rendezvous with greater precision.

NASA could not arrange a rendezvous with greater precision.

Of course there is the other side of the coin, when you help a less experienced couple through & they latch on to you for the rest of the night whether you like it or not. Neither of these options is good for S/Ding. The result is many discouraged dancers & dropouts. Clubs get undeserved reputations. Callers wind up calling to holf the floor, & the other half broken down, waiting for an allemande left. There are several answers.

... Some are very obvious, yet remain unused.... Experienced dancers; next time ask I other experienced couple to dance with you. Then go out on the floor, take up opposite positions & dance with who ever comes along..... New Club Members!, don't limit yourselves by floor position. Don't stand to back & hide & don't ever be afraid to ask a more experienced couple to dance with you. If you ask, they will! "Angels"!, set a good example. Don't use short cuts, even with each other. This only adds to the confusion that new dancers naturally have at learning what is essentially a whole new language. Class Members!, listen, listen, listen. I have seen so many cases where vital this buctoons are missed because dancers are discussing what went wrong.... If you break down, square up or get in lines of four and listen for the caller to get there. (continued on page 43)

too short skirt can be saved with the addition of a ruffle or a flounce of a contrasting fabric, add a bow to your blouse and perhaps a ruffle to the sleeves to take a co-ordinated look.

Skirt too long- shorten and make an easy hem with the help of binding or ribbon or decorative stitching.

ront seams of sleeves cut into upper arms-bodice is too ight across shoulder. Sleeve seams need letting out.

Sleeve seams cut into underarm-armholes are too small. Sleeve seam allowances need clipping under the arms to expand armhole dimensions. Restitch a new line.

If back zipper stands out from the neck-bodice is too wide cross the back. Zipper seam needs taking in.

odice of a co-ordinated fabric. Use some of the discarded top to add touches (such as a collar, bow, sleeve edge or applique) to complete the new look.

Bodice too short but too nice to throw away-add an inserted sumberbund, again from a contrasting fabric-perhaps add a matching vest.

ong sleeves that are too tight to allow arms to rise over lead-cut off to a generous 3/4 sleeve; finish with a casing and add elastic or finish with a small band from the fabric that was cut off.

pen waistline seam and add darts about every 10-12, make larts about 8 long-this should take up much of the fullless and the rest can be gathered softly and resown to the podice or waistband. If darts are wide, they can be trimmed before gathering.

neckline can be spruced up with the addition of some uffles, or a removable jabet or just some embroidered ride banding.

(continued from page 41) "Encourage home workshops. Most callers are eager to have class members tape classes for their use at home. Get 3 others meet in a basement... & review....." Another answer is computer squares to "pre-square everyone. This is only a partial answer...primary disadvantages are; - couples who want to dance together once or twice during the night may not get the opportunity. 2- Couples who desire to sit out a tip may not be able to, while some who want or need to dance are required to sit out. 3- Many people have an inherent dislike of an inanimate object determining who they'll dance with and what floor position they will dance in.

In all honesty, however, if dancers, both old & new, will take the suggestions in this letter to heart, there would be no need for square dance computers nor for frustrated, disappointed dancers." Wayne Applegate

"Hi graduates! Welcome to the Square, Dance world! Have you been exploring that world by attending class level dances, or are you still lingering close to home afraid to venture on to the floor? Well, I want to talk about mistakes and perhaps ease your minds. All of us, dancers & callers alike, make mistakes. The

biggest error you as new square dancers can make is to always blame yourselves. Look around, see if others didn't come out right — perhaps the caller goofed. Yes, it happens and we don't always admit it. (Its twice as embarrassing to be in front of all and say'I goofed'.) Experienced dancers also goof and since no one likes to show their errors, maybe they won't acknowledge their goof (or maybe they don't realize it.) So, new dancers, square up without panic, don't hide in the back, dance to many callers with many different people, and say 'Sorry' and square up again when you goof. If other dancers try to help don't resist — maybe you can help someone next time."




