Although the CALLERLAB 1982 Convention is but a memory, the decisions made at that time are very muc alive. One of the decisions that seems to be the least understood is the one that combined the Plus 1 & 2 levels together into one PLUS PROGRAM. hind this in its degree if controversy is the suggestion that dancers dance at the MS level for a minimum of one year before they proceed to the PLUS PROGRAM.

In AMERICAN SQUARE DANCE Magazine last January they reported on a survethat pointed out that the largest single factor stated as the reason for quitting S/D was the amount of material dancers were expected to learn after graduation.

Most callers at CALLERLAB agrees that at the conclusion of a MS class the dancers have NOT learned the MS material. That it takes another year of low pressure practice before they have mastered the material. It does not matter whether you believe the fact or not. It was this fact that prompted the CALLERLAB membership to pass the resolution that recommends a minimum of one year of dancing after class graduation before advancing into the PLUS level.

It is only a recommendation - CALLERLAB does not order, it only makes suggestions. CALLERLAB has no copyright on the right answers. But it is their function to address problems facing S/D & to make group decisions for the best interest of the activity & to put these decisions in the form of suggestions, recommendations or guidelines. Whether you follow their lead or not - that is your decision.

Canada at their convention, which is held biennially, debated the "TWO YEAR PLAN" and how they planned to follow the suggestion. It was a most interesting discussion - one in which we like the suggestion made - to stop using the words - "Moving UP" to Plus - UP to advanced - but moving "OVER" to Plus...This new concept of only a PLUS program; remaining in MS longer; will cause adjustments in thinking to be made by many clubs & persons. YOU will make the choices that you deem appropriate or yourself and your club.




Everyone loves a new party outfit-but we don't want it hidden in the closet till next year....

QUARTERLY SELECTION COMMITTEE reports ...

The International Association of Square Dance Callers

For the quarter beginning Oct. 1, CALLERLAB has selected CRAND SPIN. It is not a new

movement, but offers interest to the MS dancer. The move was first introduced before the call Pass the Ocean was written, & the use of this call makes the figure easier for the dancers to complete. It is a 64 beat timed figure, written by Ross Crispino. Starting formation- Static Sq. Heads Part - Pass the Ocean, Spin the Top, Star Thru, step forward & California Twirl at the sides of the square to become new sides. Sides Part - Face your partner & back away (as in GRAND SQUARE-take 3 steps

& turn on 4th step). Turn in & walk toward your opposite & do a DoSaDo.

Star Thru with that person & become the new heads.

Each part takes 16 beats to complete; each dancer will do each part

twice to complete the figure. This figure cannot be rushed.

CALLERLAB has also added something else. At their Reno convention '82 the membership voted to establish a new program called the PLUS QUARTERLY SELECTION (PQS) - aimed at the Plus Program clubs & dancers who desire to expand their dancing to a limited degree but who do not choose to enter into a more elaborate program. The PQS Program will operate under similar guidelines to the MS/QS Program. The PQS for Oct 1 is TRACK TO A DIAMOND-(From columns, the #1 & #2 dancers do a Track II, Each of these dancers becomes one "point" of the final twin diamonds. At the same time, the #3 & #4 dancers Single File Circulate once (to a momentary box of four) then Cast Off 3/4 forming an ocean wave. Movement ends in parallel, center-to-center diamonds. Also ZING (4 beats) - (Starting from a DPT, completed DPT, or Box Circulate formation, the leaders in each foursome do a Zoom 3/4 (270%), as the trailers step forward into the vacated spot, then turn a quarter to face the center of the foursome. Movement ends in facing couples. (Woops, forgot to say-TRACK TO A DIAMOND - is 8 beats)



From the desk of.......Betsy Gotta, president CCNJ

Many people were against the program designations introduced by CALLERLAB because they were afriad of

levels labeling the dancers. Levels do not, of themselves, label dancers, but I have seen dancers labeling themselves and others both before and after the current terms were introduced. This labeling, to my mind, defeats the purpose of identified and

listed dancer programs.

CALLERS' COUNCIL OF

The idea of programs which are named and have the included figures listed is to generate dancer success. Too often a caller or club leader had one idea of "Hot Hash" while the dancers attending had another. These differences often caused many dancers frustration and pointed a need for clearer identification.

This identification with its carefully considered figure groupings can be likened to a restaurant menu which describes the dish. The description allows the customer to make a choice, it should not be used to label him. CALLERLAB programs have been used to label dancers instead of allowing for free choice.

Many dancers who enjoy dancing at a variety of levels find themselves labeled Advanced because that is the level they dance often. People in the square dance world should try to realize that learning a certain level will not guarantee a successful square dancing experience or make a better person of a dancer. Obvious, you say? I say too many people have invested feelings of status and personal worth in their level identification.

Dancing any program and being willing to help others (either newer dancers or those with problems) is to me a better measure of achievement in square dancing than level jumping. I also wish to point out that I have known many Advanced & Challenge club members who were willing to help as angels. Dance at whatever level you enjoy, but don't brag about it. Look for the enjoyment of fellowship rather than for who made the goof which "broke" the square and embarrassed you (only you?).
