It was a pleasure to welcome George/Rose Dock & Pat/Don Stephens from the Central NJSDAssociation who brought along a delicious platter of special cookies in honor of the occasion.

A highlight of the evening was the awarding of the Association ANNIVER-SARY awards to the 5 clubs who had "raided" all 3 of the NNJSDA specials in 1982-83....Covered Bridge Squares, Hix & Chix, Sussex Spinners, West Milford Flutterwheels & non member Kuntry Kuz'ns. NINE clubs had qualified for the FELLOWSHIP award by raiding 10 NNJSDA member clubs within the year. Interestingly enuf the very first to qualify was a non member group who call themselves the HAPPY SQUARES. This group of 10-12 couples, under the leadership of Helen/Art Rellinger, spend much of their spare time entertaining senior citizens, at nursing homes, hospitals, etc but still managed to circulate about to earn the award for their banner. 8. Dress properly - conservatively at first, then as the class progresses a little more elaborate attire. Discuss dress code with dancers.

9. Remember when you were a beginner - what were your fears, etc???

10. SMILE. Show you are glad to be there meeting new friends.





QUARTERLY SELECTIONS COMMITTES REPORTS ...

For the quarter beginning Oct. 1,
MAINSTREAM QS - has selected "RIPPLE" From facing couples: Facing dancers join

both hands with each other & circle half, then pass thru. End with the dancers back to back. "Ripple Right, Left, In, Out". After doing the Ripple dancers face in the direction indicated by the caller.

PLUS QS - "SPIN CHAIN & EXCHANGE THE GEARS" - From parallel ocean waves (right hand, for ease of description)- start like a normal Spin Chain the Gears - Ends & adjacent dancers turn ½, new centers turn 3/4, while the ends U-turn back, & the very 2 centers of the wave Trade. All form two Left-hand stars (but before turning them, the out-facing point should raise raise a hand, indicating "follow me" --they'll be the 'leaders of the exchange' will now lead the star out to the right, around the outside of the other star, like an S pattern, then into a momentary single file column of four. Lead dancer in the column does a right face U Turn Back & Touch 1/4 with the second dancer in the column, as the third dancer in the column quarters right face individually and the 4th dancer in the column quarters left face individually. The movement ends in 2 parallel right hand ocean waves (at the Sides of the square if started from a Heads Box 1-4.)

This is a very smooth-flowing pretty dancing figure once mastered that

takes 24 beats.

They also chose "MIX TO A DIAMOND" - From a two-faced line ( or any wave or line of four) Centers Cross Run, the new centers Single or Partner Hinge (as appropriate), to end in a Diamond. From right handed two-faced lines, it ends in right hand diamonds; from left handed two-faced lines it ends in left hand diamonds; from ocean waves, it ends in facing diamonds; from lines, various "funny" diamonds result. Timing is 6 beats.

ADVANCED QS - "SHADOW TO A DIAMOND" - From two-faced lines or waves, or 3 and I lines with the centers facing out, the ends do a normal Cast The Shadow, the center facing in will Extend & Trade, the center facing out will Split Circulate 1½ to become the end of an ocean wave. The result will be diamonds in one of their various forms, right-handed, left-handed, facing, etc.

Traditionally, in most parts of the country Fall is the time for recruiting new dancers & starting S/D Classes. Great enthusiasm is shown & much time & effort is expended by

dancers & callers in trying to attract more people into the wonderful world of s/d. This is to suggest that, along with this annual nurst of enthusiasm there should be a time of serious reflection on what is to be accomplished the next 9 to 12 months. This should be A TIME FOR SETTING GOALS.

Goal-setting should include an evaluation of past experience. What has been tried before? Did it work? If not, what went wrong? What improvements can be made? How many previous class graduates have we lost? Why? For many clubs, it is shocking to see how few graduates of the past several classes are still dancing with the club. Is it because those dancers were poorly taught & not prepared to cope with the real world of modern S/D? Is it because they received the cold shoulder when they tried to integrate into the club? Questions such as these take courage to answer honestly. But

honest answers can lead to positive change.

Clubs & caller/teachers who rush new dancers through class simply so they can begin contributing to the club treasury & to "build up the clubs" are short sighted, indeed. Those short-term graduates may pay dues sooner, but the statistics from around the country show that a disturbingly large percentage of them will pay a much shorter time & will soon be gone from S/D. Some of our best, most respected caller/teachers, whose names are well-known to the dancing public, continue to tell us that they cannot teach the Mainstream program thoroughly in much less than one year. One wonders, therefore, how much less experienced caller/teachers claim to teach that program (& usually some Plus movements in addition) in classes of 15 to 30 weeks duration. Classes are the very foundation of S/D, where dancers learn, or do not learn, the basics, customs, courtesies, traditions, dress, & all the other things that go to make a complete S/Der. They should not be looked upon routinely but should have definite goals with the good of the club, the new dancers, & square dancing in mind.






