



Gladiola bulbs were given to all in attendance as a symbol that we plan now for the fall bloom....now is the time to begin making plans for Fall classes. Kathy Porter distributed a generic press release and gave several pointers on publicity. Hal Margo spoke on various ways of attracting new dancers. A packet full of information was distributed by Florence Margo. This packet is full of excellent information on recruiting. Doc Tirrell led a short discussion on keeping dancers after graduation.

The summer dance schedule is all set...needs a few more clubs to respond for helping.  $\frac{2}{2}$  VP - The graduation packets are all ready for distribution. So far 100 couples and 130 singles will graduate. It callers will be at Spring Fling in May. Dangles will be distributed to all attendees.

3 VP - Read a letter indicating that J & M squares will disband the end of this year and reform dancing on 1,3,5 Sundays with a different name - possibly as "Shamrockers". All but one club has turned in roster of members. Cor/Sec - Regretfully have had to resign as Corresponding Secretaries as their position with the Elks is too time consuming.

GRAND SQUARE - The Porters will handle the distribution at the Spring Fling since the Tirrells will be on vacation. Questionnaires were distributed to all club delegates. Information concerning officers for the coming season and other pertinent info is requested from all clubs. Advertising Rate Sheets and size sheets were also distributed. The questionnaires are to be returned to Charlie/Kathy Porter who will distribute the info to other NNJSDA officers. John Aquino will continue to make labels. The Editor's badges were passed on to the Porters by Doc & Peg.

NEW BUSINESS - Solitaires is reassessing their situation to see if they can continue as a Square Dance Club. (see their write up.)

<u>LUST</u> - It will be conducted Sunday, September 9 at Bloomfield, NJ, Middle School. Flyers will be available soon. It was suggested that clubs send their Executive Boards. New dancers are also welcome to attend the various session on a variety of topics all relating to the square dance activity. Another BLOOD DRIVE will be conducted at this LUST.

ELECTION of OFFICERS- Clara & Bill Sobolewski were nominated to take the place of John & Joan Berg. The slate was accepted unanimously. See page 26 for names, address and phone numbers.

NSDC - Carol Ridings & John/Connie Huettemann volunteered to help transport the NNJSDA display for the "Showcase of Ideas" at TN. The Kelly's will be in charge of setting it up.

GOOD and WELFARE - A discussion was held on the NNJSDA's "One Square Is Fair". Fair". It was suggested clubs plan ahead of time so that more have one square in attendance - especially when people belong to more than one club. Discussion on the dwindling attendance at many clubs. If a club has a problem, it was suggested the club contact the NNJSDA officer for help before closing down. Several sessions as LUST will be devoted to this and other similar problems. The meeting adjourned at 4 PM.

The ladies wear a white dress or white skirt and white blouse. The vest has a white map of the state of N.J. on the back with the initials "NJ" in green and a gold star to be appliqued about where your home-town would be.

LADIES Copies of the patterns, available by size, are available \$ \$2.50 each plus 60% postage. I also have the polyester cotton broadcloth available \$4.00 per yard plus 50% a yard postage. Fabric is 45" wide and I have both the white and green available. With each vest pattern you will also receive the map of N.J., the green letters and the gold star plus instructions.

Before I get to the sewing hint — WOW !! The final count on the 4th NJS&RD Convention was 1866. It was great to see the attendance growing for this super-fun event! It's a time to see "old" friends and make new ones, dance the old dance forms familiar to us and observe some new ones, shop at the old tried and true shops that set up for your convenience and check out the new shops and the new merchandise in the old shops — wait a minute — all this old & new is getting confusing. Suffice to say, a great time was had by all. Bravos to the volunteers who organized and pulled off this huge "Best Party of the Year"!!!

Now, Sewing hints. Last issue I described some ruffle ideas. Here's more. With the 1st your ruffling method will be the same (with either a ruffler or the double basting threads) but joining & finishing-off is different. I hate raw edges with fraying threads & ruffles are the worst offenders. I used trim that was "solid". By this I mean no lace with holes for fraying edges to "leak" through. This could be wide (½"or more) ribbon or woven trims, lace "lined" with solid fabric, thin strips of fabric with hemmed edges or turned under raw edges, or anything else you deem usable. \*\*

I sewed ruffle & skirt with WRONG sides together. (Yes, I know, this goes against everything you were taught, but, as they say, trust me!) Now open the seam out flat. Your raw edge is on the right side of the garment? Then you did it right! Now fold raw seam edges toward non-gathered fabric & sew trim on, one edge at seam & the other on "flat" fabric making sure you've tucked in all raw edges. (See Allustration)

This other method was so easy I felt like I was cheating. I found some fancy clasticized trim (slightly rare anot a big selection). Using pre-hemmed edges of ruffle & skirt, I just stretched the trim as I sewed one edge of it to ruffle fabric (which then made a ruffle as it unstretched) then sewed the other edge, unstretched, to skirt hem or any other part of garment. This is great for "scalloped" ruffle designs or sleeves & necks of blouses.

\*By the way, if you're sewing a ruffle on a curved edge (Like a circle skirt) don't use too wide a trim or you'll have trouble "fitting" the top edge. You can, however, use wide trims on "tiered" skirts or non-curved edges of blouses.

Have I opened new creative doors for you? Good!!

I can hear all those brains & sewing machines clicking into gear now!!



### SOME INITIAL REFLECTIONS



Well, the 4th NJ Square and Round Dance Convention is now history. Evaluations are pouring into our mailbox as we write this (Boy, is our letter carrier glad we have a big box!). We're glad to see so many of you taking time to send us your thoughts. Although a full report will eventually be compiled

and (hopefully) circulated, we felt we should comment on a particular trend we've noticed thus far. We DO NOT HIRE callers, cuers, or dance leaders for the Convention. These people all gave up opportunities to earn money that day (or even that weekend in some cases) and DONATED their services for your dancing pleasure. As such, the Convention can only offer those programs which these professionals can handle and for which a sufficient number of dancers have expressed interest. This year's Convention had fewer dance leaders than previous years. Round dancing was particularly affected - only 9 cuers offered to participate. these constraints, some dance programs were certain to suffer, notably "higher program" squares and rounds. We were especially taken to task by Challenge dancers that were upset over not having more than a star tip at 10PM even though Cl and C2 were listed on the flyer. These complaints must have come from walk-in registrants; had they registered early, something could have been arranged. When it became obvious that a Challenge program could not be offered at this year's Convention, the Registrar tried to contact those dancers that indicated Challenge as their sole interest and offered refunds. Most attended the Convention anyway.

So, if you're among those that participated in the 4th Convention and would like to see improvements in the dance program, let us suggest 2 things you can do: First, if your favorite caller/cuer did not participate, encourage him/her to sign up for next year. Second, if you want to see a particular dance program included, register early. You can always cancel and receive a refund (up to a month before the event) if your plans change. Challenge dancers, please note that the new registration form has no provision for C1; if you're interested, just write it in (we will!). Comments like these notwithstanding, most dancers enjoyed themselves at the 4th Convention and we're glad they did! If you still haven't provided your comments and suggestions, there's still time. Just send them to us and we'll be happy to read them and pass them along to the next General Chairmen.

Once again, many thanks to all who attended the 4th NJ Square and Round Dance Convention. We look forward to seeing you at the 5th!

### NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION



The NSDC Committee reports 14,154 dancers registered for the National as of Feb. 10th. All the downtown Hotels have been filled but there are still plenty of rooms available in the I-240 and West Memphis area and more hotels and motels

are being added to the housing list. The Program Book tells all about the schedules, events and locations of the activities. It can be purchased for \$2 with registration or for \$2.50 at the door. 

### ROUND DANCE HIGHLIGHTS


