From the computer of ... Rusty & Richard Ball, NNJSDA Presidents

The time has come around again for the annual President's message welcoming our new graduates into our dances and our clubs. We'd like to take this opportunity to share two things we learned from two good caller/teachers.

The first one is a "non-call" from our "old" caller/teacher, Dick Mazziotti: "mingle." This may not be a recognized call, but it is very popular among newer dancers. When a call is missed, everyone just wanders around "mingling" with the rest of the folks in the square. It seems like the more new dancers there are in a square, the longer they "do the mingle."

Then, there is the helpful hint that is always stressed by caller/teacher Fran Wadel: getting into lines when a square breaks down. From normal lines, a "standing square" is better prepared to get back in the action. During a tip, a caller will call "normal lines" to help squares that have broken down get moving again. One way to keep squares from "doing the mingle" and help new dancers learn how to quickly form normal lines is to dance with them. And experienced dancers have to go to summer dances to do that.

Some good news is that there are a lot of new dancers this year. To keep them dancing and to help your club be strong, we recommend that at least 50% of your seasoned dancers and all of your new dancers come to The Gathering in September. Why? Because the new dancers will learn some exciting things about square dancing outside the world of classes and club activities. The enthusiasm of new dancers is catching. And seasoned dancers could really use that extra boost from hearing what other successful clubs, dancers, and callers have done to make belonging to a club fun again.

This being the 50th anniversary of the NNJSDA, it is the 49th for our beloved *Grand Square*. We have had only four editorial teams since 1965! When you see the Kanters and the Thompsons at the Association's 50th anniversary party on May 31, remember to give them a hug for their hard work over the last eight years on this wonderful pocket guide to dancing. Besides editing the best square dance magazine in the country (we're only a bit proud of it!), this year they have gone from scissors, tweezers, and hot wax to the digital age! An absolutely marvelous job!

Welcome, new square dancers! See you all in a square! And remember: Dance, dance, dance; have fun, fun!

From high school through an active retirement, Jim and Joyce Kelly have shared their lives, love, and laughter. They were introduced at a party as teenagers when Jim lived in Guttenberg and Joyce in nearby Cliffside Park, marrying two years later.

While raising three children (James, Michael, and Karen) in Lyndhurst, Jim was a manager at Economics Laboratories and Joyce worked at ITT Corporation. After moving to Bridgewater, Jim was a production manager at Magruder Color and Joyce was a secretary for the president of Ortho Pharmaceuticals. She later became a travel manager at AT&T, a job that took her to a number of other states and countries.

Jim and Joyce were deeply involved with the children's activities, including their daughter's ice skating competitions and their sons' sports ("lots of fun and tears," said Joyce). When the children got older, the Kellys saw a square dance demo at a fair in Watchung and took lessons at Somerset Hills Squares in 1981. "Little did we realize that square dancing would change our lives," they noted.

Through dancing, Jim and Joyce met new friends. They visit many other clubs and have attended 24 national conventions to date, beginning with the Kentucky convention that drew 30,000 dancers. They've also danced in England, Hawaii, Canada, and Bermuda. "Our most memorable experience (although there were many) was in England," said Joyce. During the *tea* break, the English dancers learned that their visitors had taken the "underground" to the dance and insisted on driving them back to the hotel. On another occasion, they called a club in Washington, DC to confirm the dance location, and discovered the entire group was going to raid another club. The dancers invited the Kellys to join them for dinner and the raid. "We had a wonderful time with dancers we didn't know. This happens over and over again."


Jim and Joyce have tried to share that same good will in their own square dance work, which is considerable. They've been presidents, vice presidents, raid chairs, and class coordinators for Somerset Hills, Valley Squares, and Reelers. In the mid-1980s, they were vice presidents and presidents of the NNJSDA, initiating the honorary life member award and raids by the NNJSDA Board to member clubs. They have chaired four Mini-Festivals and have booked the hall for over 15 years.

The Kellys credit John and Mary Aquino with being their mentors. Still very active in the square dance world, Joyce and Jim also enjoy spending time with their children and seven grandchildren. "Having a wonderful family and great friends are the best things that have happened to us," said the Kellys. "See you in a square!"

Listen carefully to the callers. Ask them for help between tips.
Take the adjacent hands at the end of every call to help reduce goofs.
When you do break down, and we all do, square up, heads slide to the right, form normal lines, and listen for the next call you can do from lines.
Dance to different callers. Variety is the spice of life and dancing.
Go out for ice cream and laugh about what a good time you had.

Wilson Hoff, Caller

We are deeply saddened to inform you that Wilson Hoff passed away. During more than 50 years of calling, he was also a teacher who touched many of our lives.

Wilson was born in 1919 and raised on a farm in Woodsville, NJ. He married Sarah (who went by Sally) and they had a son, Walter. Wilson was a farm manager in various locations and was active in the Grange, a farmers' organization. In 1948, the Hoffs began traditional-type square dancing at their local grange.

In 1952, the same year Wilson switched careers by taking a position with Johns-Manville as a machine operator, he offered square dance lessons to 20 children ages 9 to 16 and started a 15-year stint of calling for adult traditional square dances at different granges. The music was provided by a live five-man band in which Wilson played bass. Though he developed a lung condition due to the asbestos in his work area, Wilson found that square dance calling actually helped his lungs.

In 1963, the Hoffs took modern western square dance lessons in Harding Township. Four years later, Wilson took calling lessons in the new style. He became a member of CALLERLAB and started teaching for Warren Wheelers and Reelers in 1968, later adding Bee Sharps and Hunterdon Flutterwheels, a club that Wilson founded. The Hoffs danced through A1 and also learned round dancing, but he taught only Mainstream and Plus. Sally died in 1989.

At a Lakeland Squares dance in 1993, Wilson met a widow who was also named Sally. They married in 1994. Despite Wilson's health problems, including bouts of pneumonia and two heart surgeries, the Hoffs stayed active. He led the Flemington Golden Squares senior citizen club until two years ago, and continued calling for seniors in Glen Gardner until December 2007. In addition to dancing, they bowled at least twice a week with the Spicy Seniors in Frenchtown. They also enjoyed pinochle and hand-and-foot. "I kept track," said Sally. "We played 2,004 games during our marriage. The night before Wilson went into the hospital for the last time, we tied."

Gardner Patton, a square dance teaching colleague, noted that Wilson was passionate about dancing. "He converted his garage into a square dance hall with heat and air conditioning and parked his car outside." Also, said Gardner, Wilson "would call a dance even when he was in so much pain that he could hardly climb the stairs to the stage. He loved square dancing and the dancers, and they loved him."

Peggy and Steve Koehler of Bee Sharps said that many of their happiest times have been made possible because of Wilson's love for people and square dancing. Ken and Kathleen Heaphy, Bee Sharps presidents, also felt lucky to be among Wilson's students. "He had a great sense of humor, was kind and patient," said Ken. He added: "It is quite fair to say that he changed the lives of hundreds of people. Instead of sitting home watching TV, we are now dancing and enjoying exercise, good music, and fellowship. Wilson truly left this world a better place. Thank you, Wilson." As two of Wilson's students, Mark and I say "Amen." Lise Greene


Poster/Flyer Contest Winners



Colleges Are Square Dancing: Square Dancing as a College Course

(Inspired by an article in the *Chicago Tribune* December 10, 2007.)

About 1 million people worldwide perform some form of modern square dancing. While many are drawn by the camaraderie, there are others who are intrigued by the underlying mathematical concepts. Our activity has something for everyone. It spans from one nighters, open houses, and ABC Dance, which use approximately 20 calls, through Challenge 4, which incorporates nearly 1,000 calls and 100 "concepts."

At its highest and most complicated levels, puzzle lovers, engineers, and computer and math geeks dominate the ranks. It is, therefore, no surprise that square dance clubs at Stanford University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology are thriving. MIT's club, Tech Squares, teaches its class the Basic, Mainstream, and Plus calls in weekly lessons from September through December.

In Naperville, IL, North Central College's fledgling club, the Square Roots, has a different recruiting tool: offering square dancing as a college course! David Schmitz, a math professor at the college, has square danced for more than a decade. Like many square dancers, he worries about recruiting new dancers, and so he pitched a three-week course to college officials in hopes of exposing young people to an activity that lured him when he was a graduate student. Generally, those who signed up for the course were math, science, or computer majors.

Allie Hays' friends had a good laugh when they heard about the class she had signed up for at North Central: Mathematics of Square Dancing. Hays thought it was **Continued on page 53**





pretty funny herself at first. "Are you kidding me? That's a reach," said the senior math major. But after spending three hours a day for two weeks memorizing almost 100 dance calls, then weaving in and out of complicated formations on cue, she changed her mind. Amid constant movement, she had to visualize and use math concepts that many college math majors don't study until their fourth year. During breaks in the dancing fun, the students discussed snippets only math lovers could appreciate: the number of permutations possible in one call or how a rectangle formation could be sheared to create a parallelogram "concept" of a typical call. "It's math in motion," says Professor Schmitz.

David Schmitz likens square dancing to solving a Rubik's Cube. Caller Saundra Bryant compares calling to moving chess pieces around a board to music. "It's like puzzle-solving in real time," says caller Clark Baker. A computer programmer who has been dancing with Tech Squares since 1974, Baker laments that it's a constant battle to fight the stereotype of a jug of moonshine and hay bales.

How to entice college students to try square dancing? Perhaps the answer lies in the expression, "Try it; you'll like it!" Nathan Pierson, a North Central freshman in math who took the square dance course and is considering joining the club, had this to say, "This is a much more intellectual experience than my preconception. And it was just a lot more fun than I thought, too."
