We were among the crowd honoring Betsy Gotta on her 50th anniversary as a caller. It was wonderful to see 30 squares come out and celebrate.



Betsy's tireless devotion to square dancing has touched all of us in various ways – as a caller locally and nationally; as an instructor to both dancers and callers; through service with organizations such as CCNJ, SDCNJ, and CALLERLAB; and as a legend at National Square Dance Conventions. All of square dancing continues to benefit from Betsy's many contributions.

Now imagine what the world of square dancing would be like today if we routinely had dances of 20 or 30 squares. Dancing friends everywhere! Square Dance Classes on a Budget for Small Clubs

Since 1970, the Middletown Ramblers have been teaching square dancing to small classes using tapes and volunteer instructors.

In 1981, Patty and I learned Mainstream and Plus from a set of Curley Custer instructional tapes. Around 1984, I inherited the teaching role. I converted the cassette tapes to CDs and made lesson plans to hit the high points, while doing most of the instruction myself.

When calls were dropped and added (especially in Plus), I started looking for more instructional tapes. This was difficult, because most instruction was switching to videos. I continued with Curley for Basic and Mainstream, and bought tapes from Lee Kopman for Plus. Currently, we are in our second year of using Paul Waters's instructional tapes (1996) for our Mainstream segment.

We were approached by the Monmouth County Park System in 2004 to provide instruction in square dancing. This has been a great relationship. The Park advertises the classes, provides the facilities, and collects the money. A small portion of each fee for a 12-week course goes back to the club.

President: Presides at Executive Board and Delegates meetings; speaks for the Association. (Candidates must have served as an officer on the Executive Committee.)

1st Vice President: Responsible for special events, halls, callers, and cuers.

2nd Vice President: Responsible for items regarding new recruits (liaison with club classes, Midterm Dance, graduation packets, etc.).

3rd Vice President: Responsible for publicity items; assists clubs that have financial or membership difficulties; liaison with NJPAC.

Recording Secretary: Takes and distributes minutes of Association meetings; maintains records of clubs' regular dance schedules; grants special event clearance; keeps Raid and Patron records.

Corresponding Secretary: Prepares correspondence not handled by the Recording Secretary; in that officer's absence, assumes those duties.

Celebrating Dedication - Thaaaank You, Betsy

On Sunday, November 18, a square dance party was held in Somerset to celebrate the 50-year calling career of New Jersey's "First Lady of Square Dancing," Betsy Gotta. And what a grand party it was, with more than 30 squares in attendance.

Tim Marriner, John Marshall, and Tom Miller were honored to call for the event and delighted the crowd with an afternoon of exciting Mainstream dancing. (Betsy even joined the trio for some singing calls!) Mary Pickett was pleased to give Betsy and Roy the rare opportunity to round dance together.

There were photographs and many awards on display, and a few speeches were made recognizing her amazing career. But the day wasn't about Betsy's accomplishments; it was about her dedication to the square dance activity.

It all began in 1962, when Betsy told her father (caller Art Seele – see photo at right) that she wanted to call for her teenage club, "The Church Mice." Since 1963, she has called at every National Square Dance Convention. In 1969, Betsy taught the first set of lessons offered by Rutgers Promenaders, where she continues teaching to this day. In 1973, she taught her first callers' school (sponsored by NNJSDA), and has since taught all over the United States, Canada, and Europe. In 2002, she was the first American woman to become an accredited caller coach.



In 1974, Betsy was a founding member of the Callers' Council of New Jersey, and, in 1983, a charter member of the Square Dance Council of New Jersey. After joining CALLERLAB in 1976, she was the first American woman elected to its Board of Governors (now serving her ninth term), and has served on the executive committee and as vice chair. In 2006, she received its most prestigious award, the Milestone.




In 2001, for her work to bridge the gap between gay and straight square dance clubs, Betsy received the Golden Boot Award at the international gay square dance convention – the only caller to have received both awards.

In Spokane, where Betsy called at her 50th consecutive national convention last year, she became the only caller ever hon-

ored by the National Executive Committee (see photo at left). She has been the chair of CONTRALAB, the vice chair of ARTS-Dance, and on the Legacy executive committee.

Over five decades, Betsy has taught thousands of people to square dance, helped

hundreds of callers to improve their skills, and promoted square dancing worldwide. Through it all, what she still loves to do the most is dance. It is therefore fitting that so many chose to honor her in the best way possible: They came out and danced.

Tips for Your Tips

A series devoted to helping you become a more confident dancer

Walls Are Our Friends

Our favorite pastime is called square dancing. We "square up." Much of the time we are dancing in boxes, lines, and columns. Most of our halls are rectangular. With the geometric nature of many of our formations, it makes good sense to use the walls to our advantage.

Walls are our friends on the square dance floor. They assist us in keeping our square's formations neat, or, as one of my teacher/callers would say, help us "prettify" our formations. Lines/waves/columns that are straight, parallel, and lined up with one another and the walls help us identify where we are in the formation, whom we are facing, who our partner is at the moment, and our circulation route. When everyone is promenading and two couples are asked to Wheel Around, try to complete the call so that the resulting facing lines are parallel to a wall. Why? Your square will execute the calls more easily and smoothly when its formations are parallel to a wall rather than on a diagonal.

How do the walls help us perform calls more accurately? When dancers face a wall, not a corner of the room, they can more easily keep track of how far they have turned. With calls such as Touch ¼ and Cast Off ¾, the two dancers involved can easily tell when they have turned their twosome the correct amount (¼ = one wall, ¾ = three walls). During Bend the Line, a north/south line becomes an east/west line (turning one wall). Spin the Top requires four dancers to move in synchrony: The initial Trade has each pair turn one half (two walls). Then, the new centers turn three quarters (three walls) while the outside dancers move forward in a quarter circle (one wall). Both the original and the resulting ocean waves should be parallel to a wall.

See if you can identify how many walls you turn while dancing the following Basic and Mainstream calls. The answers are below, but don't cheat!



CCNJ President's Message

Student Dances – Often, the first dances that students attend outside their lessons are the midterm or midwinter dances sponsored by NNJSDA (January 27) and CCNJ (February 24). Please tell your class members about these dances and come as an angel to show the new dancers the extent of square dancing in New Jersey.



Shorter Classes – In the last issue, I mentioned a way to increase the number of square dancers by providing a dance program between non-dancers and Mainstream. In this issue, I offer a plan explaining how it can be accomplished with our current teachers and facilities. For simplicity, I call the in-between program "Program X." The complete plan is too long to print here, but the highlights are summarized below.

The calls taught in Program X classes are agreed to by the callers and clubs in our area. The classes and dances described in the plan can be done using only the teachers and facilities clubs provide now for their Mainstream classes. Under the plan, a new Program X class would start every month. Even if a class has only a few new dancers each month, there would be enough people because dancers from the previous two or three classes would repeat the classes as angels. A new Mainstream class can be started every two months, or as needed. Fast learners can start dancing at Mainstream clubs after only three months of classes. More importantly, slower learners can retake the classes as needed until they become competent Mainstream dancers. Enthusiastic dancers can ask their friends to join a class with a wait time of only a few weeks rather than a year, which is today's standard.

The fourth session of each Program X class is a dance (no teaching). Thus, those who so desire can plateau at Program X and dance at least once a month. Note: Dancers can attend a square dance after only three weeks of class instead of three or more months, which is now normal. Those who enjoy quick gratification for their effort to learn should be satisfied. If people want more dancing, they can retake the Program X class or attend the fourth week Program X dance at other clubs in their area. When they want to progress further, they can jump into a Mainstream class, which would start about every two months – no long wait.

All this can be accomplished by splitting the current class time (usually two hours) into two sessions of one and a half hours each (total class time per evening is increased to three hours). The current teachers would call both classes. During times that no Mainstream class is offered, the Program X class could be extended to the current two hours. Detailed time charts and sample plans are shown on the website at newsquaremusic.com/programx.html.

The plan was presented to the Callers' Council of New Jersey at its September 2012 meeting. The callers who were present thought it workable if clubs support it. Club officers have expressed concern over several issues such as providing angels, publicity for monthly class starts, and funds. These concerns are addressed in the detailed plan and are easily resolved.

If you are interested in growing the population of square dancers, please visit the website and read the whole plan (it's not very long). Then contact your club officers to work out a way to implement the plan for your club. If you have suggestions for how to improve the plan or questions that are not answered, please email me.

You can search for dances by zip code, address, type of dance, event type, and date range. The results can be viewed in list format, on a calendar, or on a map. This is a very powerful asset to dancers who travel. If you find any errors, you can report them and they will be quickly corrected.

There is a link to the "Where's the Dance" site on the NNJSDA homepage, along with links to many other useful sites for square dancers including animations and videos of various calls. Check out the website – and watch for a new design coming soon.

Take Exit 8E (Route 59 East). *Continue on Route 59 East to first traffic light. Turn left onto Crosfield Avenue. Continue to end of Crosfield Avenue, turn right onto West Nyack Road, and continue to traffic light. Turn left onto Strawtown Road. Firehouse is just past yellow blinker on the right.

From New York State Thruway 287/87:

Take Exit 13S to PIP South. Go ½ mile to Exit 8E (Route 59 East), and follow PIP instructions * above.

From Garden State Parkway (GSP) North to New York Thruway South/East:

Go to end of GSP/Thruway Exit 14-1; go South/East on Thruway to Exit 13S, PIP South, and follow PIP instructions * above; hall is 7 miles from the NJ/NY border via GSP.

From Kinderkamack Road (NJ):

Kinderkamack Road becomes Route 304 in New York. Follow Route 304 north to Route 59 East, and follow PIP instructions * above; hall is 5 miles from the NJ/NY border via Kinderkamack.
