The 40th NNJSDA Mini-Festival almost didn't happen because the planned hall became unavailable. Kudos to Nancy Ammons for doing the legwork to find a suitable location at Bloomfield High School. The callers and cuers did a fantastic job of keeping dancers happy all day. Thank you to callers Tim Marriner, Will Larsen, and Dan Koft (who filled in for Glenn Matthew at the very last minute) and cuers Tom Denniston and Ellen McCabe.

Two days after the Mini-Festival, Glenn Matthew passed away, and he will be deeply missed. Please see the article on page 16 of this issue. In addition, a website has been set up for everyone to contribute memories of Glenn: *glennmatthew.blogspot.com*.

The 41st Mini-Festival will be held on November 8, 2015. The caller lineup consists of Jet Roberts from California; Pat Carnathan, also from California; and Jeremy Butler from Virginia. Pat plays in a five-man band in which four of the musicians are square dance callers.

The annual dinner-meeting for NNJSDA club presidents is planned for February 21 (location to be announced). The dinner is free for club presidents, with a nominal charge for others who wish to attend. A delicious meal will be provided by Sullivan Catering. Details will be distributed via email to club presidents.

Don't forget our incentive programs for the clubs: One Square Is Fair and the Raid program. Completion of either program provides your club with a reduction in the dues assessment for the following year. A recent revision allows clubs to complete either program twice in the same year and receive twice the reduction in the dues assessment, up to a maximum of 100% (no dues). Both programs end on May 31, and the new season begins on June 1.

Afterward, Mary Lundin and I went to a diner for dinner – because who has time to eat when you're having fun dancing? We saw other square dancers there.


To the clubs that made One Square Is Fair, that is a great team effort. Those who earned a Freeloader dangle can proudly display it.



From Pennsylvania to the Big Apple: A Square Dancer's Journey

I joined the Times Squares Mainstream class on a whim, not expecting much from it. My partner and I had vacationed in Seattle that summer and enjoyed watching two-stepping and line dancing at a gay bar there, and it looked like something we'd like to try. However, there weren't many opportunities for that in New York City.

At a Labor Day weekend party, a friend suggested that we give square dancing a try. A Times Squares member, he told us about the upcoming September open houses. I had done some very basic square dancing as a kid with my church youth group and in college as part of a mandatory folk dancing class, but hadn't been all that impressed. Nevertheless, I agreed to give it a try, not really expecting to follow through with the classes. I was so wrong!

Growing up in semi-rural Pennsylvania in the '50s and '60s, I had struggled with my sexuality all through high school and college. I was the stereotypical gay youth - a good student, into music, not at all interested in sports, physically uncoordinated, and always dealing with my weight. Throughout public school and college, I endured what would definitely be classified as bullying by today's standards.

After graduating from college with a music education degree, I taught in the suburban Philadelphia area for three years. In 1975, I enlisted in the Army as a musician and played with the 26th Army Band stationed at Fort Wadsworth, Staten Island – which was my strange method of getting to New York City! Those three years in the Army became my "coming out" period as a gay man. I met my first long-term partner (a civilian) while still in the Army, and after discharge in 1978, remained in New York to begin a new life and career with him.

We were together for 17 years when we started square dancing in 1993. Quite to our surprise, we both loved dancing and the camaraderie of the Times Squares club. We attended all the classes, workshops, and dances available to us. I discovered that I actually had an aptitude for a physical activity, even though it didn't always come easily and I had to work at learning the calls. Unfortunately, Paul became terminally ill during our second year, and died in June 1996. Times Squares was vitally important in helping me to get through one of the darkest periods of my life.

After Paul's death, I became even more active with Times Squares, gradually taking additional classes to progress to the C2 program. Some weeks I attended two or three classes and dances. I also went to various weekend Fly-Ins, and have attended every annual convention since 1994. I met my current partner in 1997; because he realized how important square dancing is to me, he agreed to take classes as well. Seventeen years later, we're still dancing, although not as frequently.

Square dancing has definitely helped me gain the physical confidence that I lacked all those years in school, struggling with sports. Progressing through the various programs, it became much more of a mental challenge. As I get older, it has become a great activity for combining physical movement with the all-important intellectual challenge. Attending annual conventions has allowed us to combine our love of travel with a fun and mentally demanding activity, while meeting many great square dancers, both gay and straight.

As I discovered though the gay square dance world, square dancing need not be the way it is often portrayed in the media, done in matching fussy costumes to tacky music. It can be an exciting activity done to great music by exceptional callers with fantastic vocal performances and challenging choreography. I definitely recommend giving it a try; you might just get hooked on it as I did! Larry Eppley, Times Squares

So You Think You Know Mainstream and Plus – Part 1

Quick: The call is Flutterwheel; if you are the right-hand dancer, what do you do? Chances are, you would say: "To begin, I walk forward and pull by the opposite dancer with a right hand." Although this is the way most people dance the call, we are told by CALLERLAB, the final arbiter in all such matters: "The right hand dancers go in to the center and turn by the right forearm." [Note: Where a portion of a CALLERLAB definition is italicized, the emphasis is mine.] So, it is clear that the manner in which a call is commonly danced does not always coincide with the official definition of that call. (I find it interesting to note that, in my experience, more men than women initiate a Flutterwheel or Reverse Flutterwheel with a forearm turn, per the definition.)

My purpose in this article is to highlight some of these discrepancies between square dancing theory and practice. Indeed, the very same CALLERLAB that makes the rules advises us that it "recognizes that regional differences in styling exist" and that there is a distinction to be made between "bending and breaking the definition(s)." So, again, fellow dancers, it isn't that what you are doing is *wrong* so much as that it simply may not conform to the official CALLERLAB definition of the call. My good friend, the caller Paul Ingis, put it this way: "I often tell my class to think of square dancing as a game. When learning a game like Monopoly or poker, you need to learn all the rules of the game in order for the play to be interesting and fair. If somebody who doesn't know the rules is playing, he can cause the game to stop working right and being fun. So while some rules may seem unimportant, all the rules are really necessary to keep things in balance."

In addition to the above, let us consider:

- 1. For our Plus-dancing ladies, you hear "Head ladies center for a Teacup Chain." You move to the center and do exactly *what*, with the opposite head lady? I'm sorry, but if you said, "Turn three-quarters by the right *forearm*," that is *not* what CALLER-LAB had in mind when it wrote: "The specified ladies (both Head ladies or both Side ladies) move to the center and *Star Right* three-quarters to meet their corners for a Left Arm Turn." Fancy that; you're supposed to be *starring* in the center!
- 2. How many of you men really twirl the lady under your raised arm to complete a Circle to a Line? Chances are, you both take the path of least resistance and do little more than a "slap and slide," to get where you're going just as quickly as possible.
- 3. There is a subtlety to Dixie Style to an Ocean Wave that few dancers consider before executing the call. Have you ever wondered why some callers actually preface the command with "Put the lady in the lead" before completing with Dixie Style to an Ocean Wave? It's because, according to the definition, before the right-hand dancer (usually the lady) advances and pulls by the opposite dancer with a right hand, each is supposed to *move to the left*, in front of her partner, briefly forming a *tandem*, before stepping *straight forward* and pulling by with a right hand.
- 4. This is one of my pet peeves. When you form a right-hand or left-hand star, do you just throw your arm straight forward, palm down, forming a sort of wagon wheel? That is *not* a palm star, which is defined for this call. The styling section of the CALLERLAB Basic Definitions manual tells us that a palm star is formed by "plac[ing] all hands together *with fingers pointing up* and thumbs closed gently over the back of the adjacent dancer's hand to provide a degree of stabilization. *Arms should be bent slightly* so that the height of the handgrip will be at an average eye level." Not what you're doing? Trust me; it will look so much more elegant the correct way.

5. This one, I'm afraid, is aimed at the callers. Please don't shoot the messenger, but you're really not supposed to be calling, "Roll Away with a Half Sashay." CALLERLAB tells us that you ought to be calling Rollaway when, well, you want the right-hand dancer to quite literally *roll away*, and Half Sashay when you want him or her to simply slide over to the left, in front of her or his partner. One might wonder, when callers do intone, "Roll Away with a Half Sashay," whether they want us to roll away, do a half sashay, or do both!

6. When you're next to your partner and hear U-Turn Back, do you give much thought as to whether you should turn 180 degrees by facing *toward* or *away* from your partner? You should! The definition tells us to turn *toward* our partner (unless the body flow dictates otherwise). Yes, I can hear the protests: "What difference does it make, so long as I turn 180 degrees and face in the opposite direction?" Well, in Plus, if the U-Turn Back call were immediately followed by "and Roll," it definitely *would* make a difference. Think about it.

Moral of the story: Do it right all the time, and you won't get into trouble.







In Memoriam: Glenn Matthew

The square dance world lost one of its favorite sons on November 11, 2014. Glenn David Matthew, 55, was an avid dancer, fantastic caller, and friend to all. While dealing with cancer and the related treatment, Glenn kept a positive attitude and looked forward to seeing you at his dances, accompanied by his faithful black dog (aptly named Shadow). When Glenn collapsed at home, he was getting ready to leave for a dance in northern New Jersey and was excited about calling for the Mini-Festival the following day.

Glenn drove buses for a local grade school and a college. In addition to this work and square dance calling, he had a wide range of interests. This fact was demonstrated by the more than 300 people who attended the viewing to pay their respects, many of whom returned for the burial the next day. His friends included adults with fond memories of him from 4-H youth square dancing, home school dances, school bands, etc.

Glenn's parents, Anna and Russ, were original members of Dixie Derbys, a Pennsylvania club formed in 1980, and Glenn was one of the callers. An excellent caller, he loved teaching at any level. Excitement always came through the phone as he described how well his current class had done the night before.

Born in Philadelphia, Glenn resided in Bear, Delaware. Preceded in death by his mother, he is survived by his father, brother, niece, nephew, and great-nephew. In lieu of flowers, the family has suggested contributions in Glenn's name to the <u>American Melanoma Foundation</u>, 4150 Regents Park Row, Suite 300, La Jolla, CA 92037.

While we knew he was battling melanoma, a terrible disease, we had hoped for a chance of his overcoming it. His sudden passing was a shock to all who knew him. Full of love for family, friends, and life in general, Glenn and all of his friends were deprived of many more years of his life.

Tips for Your Tips A series devoted to helping you become a more confident dancer

DBD (Dance by Definition) - Which Hand Do I Use?

To start many calls, you must know with which hand to begin. Right and Left Thru tells you in its name: Start with the right hand. Allemande Left is another easy one: Extend your left hand. With Do Paso, usually the caller will say, "Partner by the left, corner by the right." But, what if the initial hand is not explicitly named?

- 1. **Swing Thru** *always* starts with a *trade by the right hand* regardless of whether the dancers are in a right-hand or left-hand wave. Therefore, when in a left-hand wave, first the center two dancers trade by their right before they and their adjacent end dancers trade by their left. Only when the caller specifies **Left Swing Thru** is the first trade done with the left hand.
- 2. **Spin the Top** *always* begins with *each end dancer trading with the adjacent center dancer* regardless of whether the dancers are in a right-hand or left-hand wave. From a left-hand wave, the initial trades are done by the left, followed by the new centers cast three-quarters by the right while the end two dancers travel forward (counterclockwise) around the outside in a quarter circle.
- 3. Spin Chain Thru, Spin Chain the Gears (Plus), and Spin Chain and Exchange the Gears (Plus) all start like Spin the Top (i.e., each end dancer of the wave trades with the adjacent center dancer). NOTE: The names of these four calls all start with the word "Spin." The definition of the call is the same for right- and left-hand waves; what changes is the hand by which you do each successive part.
- 4. **Fan the Top** (Plus) and **Peel the Top** (Plus) both have the center dancers cast three-quarters, regardless of the handedness of the wave just as with Spin the Top. What differs is the action of the end dancers of the wave while the centers cast. NOTE: The names of these three calls all end with the word "Top." One can think of it as Top = Centers Cast Three-Quarters.
- 5. **Square Thru** always begins with a right hand pull by. Only when the caller specifies **Left Square Thru** is the first pull by done with the left hand.
- 6. **Flutterwheel** starts with the right-hand dancers going in to the center and turning by the right forearms. Although the right-hand dancer is frequently a woman, gender is not part of the definition. **Reverse Flutterwheel** is initiated by the left-hand dancers going in to the center and turning by the left forearms.
- 7. **Scoot Back** begins with the in-facing dancers stepping straight forward to join adjacent forearms (i.e., the arm to the center of the box). From the more common right-hand box, the turn is by the right forearm while the out-facing dancers run right into the vacated spots. From a left-hand box, the turn is by the left forearm and the run is to the left. The caller does not have to say Left Scoot Back since the action is defined by the handedness of the box; callers who use that term are trying to help the dancers know by which forearm to turn and which direction to run.
- 8. **Follow Your Neighbor** (Plus) is similar to Scoot Back regarding the arm used to turn and the direction in which to loop.

Aren't you glad we have only two hands?

Proper Square Dance Attire

Adapted from an article by Ray and Sandy Hutchison, presidents of the National Executive Committee (sponsors of all National Square Dance Conventions)

The issue of proper square dance attire has been a controversial topic for the 25 years we have been dancing. As current presidents of the National Executive Committee and past general chairs of a national convention, we have opinions on the subject.

The terms "Proper Square Dance Attire" and "Dressy Casual" were developed to prevent people from coming to the convention dance halls dressed in tank tops, ripped jeans, obscene T-shirts, short shorts, etc.

During the daytime, many people come to the convention center to dance after returning from a convention-sponsored tour, a seminar, the fashion show, or other activities they have arranged on their own. Knowing that they would then want to dance without going back to the hotel/RV and changing into full square dance attire prompted the Dressy Casual code. Nice shorts and shirts with sleeves (long or short) are perfectly acceptable during the daytime sessions for both men and women.

In the evening – after all of the day's extra activities, when the dancer has been to dinner and taken a nap and is ready to return to the convention center for some serious dancing – Proper Square Dance Attire is suggested. The definition can vary by region across the country and around the world, so we don't put one on the NEC website.

However, for the men we *prefer* long-sleeved shirts (you know the old sweaty arms problem) and slacks or good jeans; we *prefer* no shorts. A long-sleeved T-shirt is not the best choice, but will not get him a request to leave the dance floor – as long as it is clean and does not have an offensive message or foul odor. The same holds true for a short-sleeved shirt. While we *prefer* to see shirts with a collar, a dancer will not be asked to leave the floor if he is wearing a short-sleeved T-shirt if it is clean and does not have holes, a smell, or an offensive message. Bolos, ties, boots, and hats are the man's choice; they are not required.

For the women, our *preference* is a petticoat and short skirt or a prairie skirt. No tank tops are allowed. If she is consistently dancing the man's part, then she may dress as the men do, if that is her choice. Suggesting that she change clothes each time she changes her dancing position is arguing the point for the sake of arguing.

If dancers use common sense in their attire choices, no one is going to bother them. They have spent their hard-earned money and vacation time to attend the convention. The old adage "The customer is always right" prevails, unless their attire is completely unacceptable. As you and I know, those dancers also know if they are pushing the envelope when they enter the dance hall. If that is their intent, shame on them. If all they are seeking is to see if they will be escorted out, how rude is that and what kind of fun is that for them, or for the committee members who have dedicated themselves to hosting a fun event?

The convention committee members have much more on their minds: doing their job to ensure that dancers have a good time. As long as dancers understand and respect the convention committee, no one will question the way they are dressed.

We are more concerned about the person who enters the convention venues, to attend seminars or to dance, without registering for the convention. That is most unacceptable! Those dancers, if caught, will be escorted from the dance floor or classroom, taken to the registration table, and asked to purchase a ticket or leave the facility. No one can argue with that policy. Putting on a National Square Dance Convention is a costly undertaking, and paid registrations are vital to ensure the bills get paid.





NEW JERSEY STATE OUTFIT

Square dance conventions and other gatherings hold a Parade of States or Grand March, during which dancers march in by state. Dancers from a given state usually wear the same outfit or color combination. Let's have a sea of green at the National Convention in Massachusetts this June!

The New Jersey state outfit colors are kelly green and white, based on the "Garden State" concept. (Examples of kelly green are the *labels* on Schweppes and Seagram's ginger ale bottles.) Each dancer should also have a New Jersey emblem (see picture on left). It can be purchased for \$7.50 at any NNJSDA dance or through the website.

The state emblem consists of a 9" kelly green and white embroidered outline of New Jersey, with an embroidered gold star

(to be placed at the location of the dancer's home club) and an embroidered "NJ." The emblem should be sewn or pinned in a prominent, but tasteful, location such as:

- Back of a kelly green vest with white top-stitching, worn over a white shirt or blouse
- · Back of a kelly green or white shirt or blouse
- · Side or center front of a kelly green or white skirt or dress
- On a green overskirt/apron trimmed with white eyelet

Vest patterns (for men and women) can be borrowed from the Association's assistant treasurer. Pants for both men and women should be white, kelly green, or black. Possible outfits can be seen on the dolls on the NNJSDA carousel, which are displayed at each Mini-Festival. Photos are on the website (nnjsda.org/state_outfit).
