NNJSDA President's Message

This past winter was very difficult with the bad weather. As soon as you thought you were finished shoveling, another storm came roaring in with more snow and ice. Now that spring is here, it's time to get back into the regular square dance routine.



An ongoing problem within our activity has been: How do we tell everybody else about square dancing with all its benefits? In the

past, the written word reigned supreme, and advertising in local newspapers seemed to be the way to go. Today, because of the internet's capability to reach a lot of people rapidly and in far-off places, it would be advantageous to advertise our activity in the social media, such as Facebook, Twitter, and Pinterest. Give it some thought and come up with ideas. Our website is already connected to Facebook and Twitter.

Along the same lines, how can we attract more young dancers? A survey of the average age of square dancers over the years would probably show the number steadily increasing, even with new members joining in the activity. We really need to think about how to attract and retain youthful dancers.

The annual Presidents Dinner was not held as planned on February 21, due mainly to a scheduling conflict with the tentative location. As it turned out, there was significant snow that day, so it probably would have been canceled anyway. At the time of this writing, I am scheduling a meeting in April.

Has your club been keeping up with the Raid program at member club events and One Square Is Fair at Association dances? Remember: If your club completes both programs, or either of the programs twice, during the current dance season, you will earn double the reduction in next year's dues assessment. We're talking about free club membership for a year. What a deal!

Check out ARTS (<u>arts-dance.org</u>), a nonprofit dance association that includes various square dance organizations. A new way to provide financial support to the ARTS Foundation is by using <u>smile.amazon.com</u>. Registering, logging on, and making purchases are the same as for Amazon. The difference is that when you buy through the Smile website, half a percent of your eligible purchase total is donated by Amazon to the charity of your choice. Before finalizing your transaction, be sure to verify that the "supporting" organization is the Alliance of Round, Traditional, and Square-Dance Inc.

Summer is almost here – starting with the 64th National Square Dance Convention from June 24-27 in Springfield, Massachusetts. If you've never attended a National Convention before, this is a great place to begin. Springfield is within easy driving distance of New Jersey, and the city has a lot of opportunities to explore. NEW GRAND SQUARE PUBLICATION SCHEDULE

The *Grand Square* team and the NNJSDA board have discussed changing the magazine's publication schedule – to lessen the vast time commitment in preparing three issues a year, and because information is now readily available online. Beginning in 2016, *Grand Square* will be published twice a year.

The main issue will continue to be distributed just before the regular dance season begins in the fall, and will cover events taking place from September through June. This will provide the full schedule at a glance for the 50% of NNJSDA clubs that do not dance in the summer.

The second issue will be distributed at the spring Delegates meeting and cover the five "summer" months of May through September, thereby overlapping with the main issue to offer continuous coverage. It will include the annual listing of CCNJ callers and the map supplement.

Both issues will be posted on the NNJSDA website, as always. In addition, to ensure that information is current, modifications to the online version will be posted as needed, together with a list of changes for easy reference. Readers will always have access to up-to-date information.

Other methods of notifying dancers will remain available as well: the NNJSDA email info-list, club and Association websites, and flyers.

Important: Dancers without electronic access should *confirm details with the club*, especially when raiding or when in doubt about weather cancellations.

Ad makers: For the next issue, please include dates for September through June. Those who have had half-page ads in the September and January issues may wish to consider a full-page ad in the new (combined) September issue.

SECRET FOR NEW DANCERS

Welcome to the big and beautiful world of square dancing! As you venture from your home club to dance at other club and Association events, here's a secret for good dancing: *Try to get into squares with experienced dancers* rather than with your classmates and other recent graduates. The veterans will help you (gently) when needed, speeding you on the way to proficiency.

Square Dance Marketing 101

At the NNJSDA Midterm Dance earlier this year, a topic that came up during a break was how to market square dancing. At the request of the *Grand Square* editor, I've put together some thoughts about this. Let me state: I have no degree in marketing. But I have been involved with square dancing since 1989. I've seen clubs do things that work very well ... and I've seen clubs do things that left me scratching my head.

Idea 1: A problem many clubs face in attracting new members is their location in small towns or communities full of retirement-age people. The only time new people move into town is when someone dies and a property becomes available. Or is that really the case? Think for a moment. Who is the first person a prospective resident meets when planning a move? The local real estate agent. My suggestion is to turn these agents into recruiters for your club. Here's how: Every new student who shows up with the agent's business card stapled to your dance flyer earns that agent \$10 after the dancer has completed "x" weeks of lessons. (Each club sets a number that won't break the bank!) There's no limit on how many bonuses the agent can earn.

Idea 2: Another untapped source of new dancers is young parents. How about doing some recruiting at day-care centers? Offer free babysitting for the toddlers while their parents are in lessons. The parents get a night out of the house and a chance to socialize with other adults. They also get exercise, free babysitting, and a slice of pie – talk about a win-win situation! And once the kids know their right from their left, put *them* through lessons, too.

Idea 3: To generate more young dancers, let's get square dancing back in schools. Encourage physical education teachers to attend your fun nights/open houses/barn dances/intro dances. Offer them teaching modules that can introduce square dancing to their current curriculum. "Oh? You wouldn't feel comfortable teaching dancing in your gym class? Well, let me introduce you to our class instructor who, I'm sure, would be happy to plan a square dance event for your school."

Idea 4: Every fall when we review the class attendance forms at Times Squares, we notice that the greatest source of new students is referral from our recent graduates. Why? Because even though they love their new square dancing hobby, they still have one foot in the "real world" of non-dancers. Their friends trust them enough to give it a try. Make sure you treat your new graduates as the valuable resource they are. Encourage them to show up and have a good time. Do *not* try to lure them into club leadership positions right away. Why? According to former CALLERLAB Chair John Marshall, the number one reason people quit dancing is club politics.

Idea 5: Many clubs offer fun nights free of charge. Even though the people walking through our doors don't have to pay, we should still ask them for something – their email address! As a former database administrator, I can tell you that this information is pure gold. Find a club member willing to keep the addresses on file. Send these people notices for upcoming fun nights and classes. In an article on why we should stop apologizing for square dancing, I stated that just because we have a skill-based activity that requires participants to attend class to learn the calls, it doesn't make square dancing a flawed activity. Conversely, the fact that people don't have time to take lessons *now* doesn't make them bad. Some day they may have the time, and we need a way to reach them, rather than lose them to bowling or basket weaving.

While all of these ideas may have merit, they do not constitute the final word on Square Dance Marketing. I'm sure there are readers with more ideas. Please share them!



So You Think You Know Mainstream and Plus – Part 2 Continued from January 2015 issue

From Part 1: My purpose in this article is to highlight some of the discrepancies between square dancing theory and practice – with a bit of humor!

- 1. Two more pet peeves, just because my experience is that these simple commands are frequently danced incorrectly: (a) When you Slip the Clutch, *everyone* is supposed to walk forward, not just the inside dancers, to meet halfway. The outside dancers (usually the ladies) don't get to just *stand there*; they're supposed to walk forward, too, and meet the insides halfway. (b) From a quarter tag formation (where an ocean wave is sandwiched between two couples facing it), the call Extend is an invitation to *all dancers* to walk forward and step to an ocean wave. The outside dancers do not wait for the insides to come to them; they're supposed to *step forward* to meet the insides halfway. And while we're on the subject, a note for callers: In Mainstream, you really should call Extend *only* from a quarter tag formation. If you call it again, after that, you're actually into Plus territory.
- 2. Do you know what the in-facing couples are supposed to do when they Ferris Wheel? CALLERLAB: "In-facing couples form a *momentary two-faced line* in the center, and without stopping Wheel and Deal." Along with most of my fellow dancers, I confess to being guilty of not complying to the letter with this definition.
- 3. At the risk of catching flack from longtime dancers for this one (please don't shoot the messenger): When the call is [Put] Centers In, do you centers expect to hook arms with the outside dancers, who form a sort of jughandle for you to slip your arm through? CALLERLAB tells us: "As center dancers step between the outside dancers they take hands with them, as appropriate (couple handhold if facing the same direction or ocean wave styling if facing opposite directions)." So, outsides, please don't get testy when I simply offer you my hand and politely ignore your jughandle.
- 4. While we're on the subject of holding hands, this one is bound to cause some grumbling, especially among our Advanced and Challenge dancers who may not actually be complying in the following situations. CALLERLAB describes a couple handhold, at least in Mainstream and Plus, as men with palms up and ladies with palms down. But what if we have a same-sex handhold? Now who does what? It is my experience, when holding another man's hand, that regardless of whether he is to my left or my right, he usually tries to put his palm up because, well, that's what makes him most comfortable. But CALLERLAB doesn't care what feels right; rather it wants us to do the following: "Inside hands joined. Men should always hold palms up, ladies palms down. In the event of a same-sex couple, the left-hand dancer turns palm up, right-hand dancer turns palm down." This may be one of the most generally ignored rules in square dancing! However, Advanced and Challenge dancers have an entirely different concept, that of "belles" and "beaus," in which gender plays no role. The dancer on the left (whose hand goes palm up) is the beau, while the dancer on the right (whose hand goes palm down) is the belle. So, for a sashayed couple in A2, for example, the lady's (beau's) palm is up and the man's (belle's) palm is down. But that same couple in Mainstream or Plus has the man's palm up and the lady's palm down (see definition above). Confusing? You bet!
- 5. I'll go out on a limb and say that many Plus dancers are unaware that Crossfire may be called from outfacing parallel lines of four. Therefore, when it is, the call often catches dancers off guard. After the center dancers of each line have traded correctly with

each other (remember, they're facing in the same direction, so it is a partner trade), and they then step forward, it is very likely that they will gaze at the couple they are facing and ... do nothing! They are actually supposed to "... step straight forward forming an ocean wave with the dancers they are facing." [And, since the ends of the original lines have cross folded and are now facing in, the resulting formation is a quarter tag – see 1(b) above.]

- 6. Now for a little humor: Quick, how many parts are there to the definition of Linear Cycle (a Plus call)? Too easy, right? Four, of course: Hinge, Fold, Follow, Peel. Bzz. Wrong! You might be surprised, but CALLERLAB defines it as a *three-part* call: "Part 1. The ends and adjacent centers hinge. Part 2. Those facing out fold behind those facing in and all dancers will then move forward in a Double Pass Thru action. Part 3. If the hinge is right-handed, peel right; if the hinge is left-handed, peel left to end as facing couples. From a right-hand hinge, all will pass right shoulders. From a left-hand hinge, all will pass left shoulders." Yup, according to CALLERLAB, not only are the Fold and the Follow just one "part" of the call, but it's not a Follow at all; it's a Double Pass Thru that precedes the Peel. Truth be told, I've always found Hinge, Fold, Follow, Peel rather silly. This four-part mnemonic first applies to everyone (Hinge), then twice just to the out-facing dancer (who Folds and "Follows," after the Hinge), and finally, again to all dancers (Peel) at the end. Kind of odd, no?
- 7. A little more fun: In Single Circle to a Wave (admit it; you thought it was *Ocean* Wave, right?), we're told: "When joining hands for circle, gents turn palms up, ladies palms down." Fine and dandy. And when *same sexes* are facing, now what? Whose palms go up and whose go down? There is that awkward moment when both men instinctively want to put their palms up, because it's more comfortable and natural, while both ladies want palms down. That can't happen, of course, so, ultimately, one person in each pair has to "give in." It happens in a split second, and it's all good fun. But for once, CALLERLAB offers no help on the subject; interestingly enough, it remains completely silent as to what to do in this situation. In fact, in their excellent "Teaching Tips for the Plus Program," apropos of this situation, Tim Marriner and Andy Shore write, ironically: "If you're working with the same sex, all bets are off."

I hope you got some amusement from testing yourself, as you read along. If you learned a thing or two, and managed to have a good time in the process, I shall have accomplished my goal.

Dancers and callers who wish to check definitions can visit the CALLERLAB website at <u>www.callerlab.org</u> and click on Dance Programs. The definitions of calls are prefaced with a list of changes to the program over time so that you can confirm updates, if any, to your printed manual. (For example, the definition of Spin Chain and Exchange the Gears, a Plus call, was updated in 2014.)

Do you have pet peeves of your own? Have I left out your favorite contradiction between an official call definition and how that same call is usually danced? Please write and let me know. See you in a square!

Be Kind – Be Clean

I read old square dance magazines looking for ideas for my articles. This idea is from a 1985 article that quotes a 1975 article as its source.

Dancers are very active. It may not seem that we have danced up a sweat, but we have. People cannot smell themselves the way others do, so we must ensure at the least that we are very clean upon entering a dance. Because we have unique body chemistries, soaps and deodorants react differently on various people. Try several brands until you find ones that work for you. (Ask a trusted friend for feedback!)

Be careful about wearing a garment more than one night. Hang it on the porch after a dance, rather than in a tight closet. The fresh air will dry it and reduce odors. A light spray of fabric refresher can help this process when an item can't be washed between wearings.

Some fabrics seem to trap perspiration and smell more than others. Even after careful bathing of the body and washing of the clothing, as the body warms and moistens the fabric, old smells can be released. One way to reduce this problem is to keep a spray bottle of full strength white vinegar next to the washer. Vinegar will not hurt any type of fabric that can be washed, and it helps to remove sweat and deodorant stains under the arms. Saturate the underarm area of the garment generously before tossing it in the wash. Yes, it will smell funny when taken out of the washer, but the dryer will reduce or eliminate the vinegar smell. If needed, hang it outside overnight.

Trying to cover body odor with perfume, cologne, or aftershave is not the answer. Many people are allergic to fragrance or simply find it unpleasant. Dancers have left the hall because someone else was wearing a perfume, cologne, or aftershave that made them nauseous. It is always better to go without fragrance than to overpower other dancers with a scent they have not chosen.

Fresh breath is important. If you stop to eat on the way to a dance, bring a toothbrush and small bottle of mouthwash to the restaurant. As a special consideration for your fellow dancers, avoid spicy foods and raw onions before a dance.

Don't forget your feet in this assessment. Allow all shoes, not just dance shoes, at least 24 hours to dry between wearings, slowly and away from direct heat. Thorough drying will help to kill fungus and reduce odor. A light anti-fungal spray in your shoes after wearing is a good idea.

A few words on the proper attire for gents. Research has shown that men sweat much more than women, so don't forget the advice passed on at beginners' class: long-sleeved shirts for men. Nothing is more disagreeable than to Left Allemande a dripping wet forearm. For those men who prefer to go without an undershirt: Don't. The outer shirt must then absorb all the perspiration and, before the dance is minutes along, the shirt is sopping wet. Wear lightweight cotton undershirts and lightweight long-sleeved shirts. Undershirts will make you more comfortable by keeping the dress shirt from sticking to your skin. Men who perspire heavily should bring a second set of shirts to a summer dance and change halfway through.

Dancing is a total contact sport. We get up-close and personal with a lot of people, which is wonderful. The skin is the largest organ of the body, and the best way to keep it healthy is with lots of greeting hugs and swinging of your partner. In this impersonal, germophobic world, we are special. We hold hands and move together in time to the music. We put our arms around each other to say "thank you."



Mary and John Aquino

It took only one lesson to get Mary and John Aquino hooked on square dancing.

"We were new to New Jersey, having moved from Westchester, New York, and we saw a small blurb in the town newspaper that Hix & Chix was giving lessons."

They graduated in 1981 with 100 people in their class; a year later, they became presidents of the club, dancing five to six nights a week. The following year, the Aquinos were elected first vice presidents of NNJSDA (1983-85), and then became presidents (1985-87) and chaired at least four Mini-Festivals. They were the founders of Motiv8ors (an NNJSDA club that started as J & M Squares).

Their first job as presidents of NNJSDA was locating a hall for the Association's 25th anniversary dance, which was just a few months away at the time. Over the years, they've hosted dances, classes, and lessons in their basement. For many years, Mary ran Happy Squares, a group that featured square dance demos at nursing homes.



Currently living in West Nyack, New York, John and Mary are still members of Motiv8ors as well as Hi Taws. They are also very active with a 200-member group called Seniors of Clarkstown. Every year, they look forward to their annual Senior Citizen Show. Mary makes the costumes while John videotapes the production and distributes the tapes.

The high school sweethearts were originally from Worcester, Massachusetts. Married 63 years, they have three daughters, one son, 10 grandchildren, and two great-grandsons. The whole family reunites at their home on every holiday.

An engineer and USN/USNR Korean War veteran, John spent his career in the family business, selling new and used injection molding machinery, while Mary raised the couple's four children. In addition to square dancing, John enjoys photography and videography, model airplanes, and ham radio. Mary enjoys line dancing, baking, and sewing (she made all their square dance outfits).

A highlight of their dancing years was Liberty Weekend in 1986, which celebrated the 100th anniversary of the dedication of the Statue of Liberty. Dee Dee Wood, who choreographed *The Sound of Music* and *Mary Poppins*, came to John and Mary's basement with caller Dick Pasvolsky to see square dancing for herself, and then choreographed the dancing for the bicentennial celebration weekend.

The Aquinos fondly remember 65 squares at Bergen Community College with Marshall Flippo calling for Hix & Chix, and having to limit an NNJSDA dance at Rutgers University to 75 squares for the Red Boot Boys, a callers' quartet.

"We love everything about square dancing," they say. "The music, the exercise, and mostly the people we have met. We are still in contact with some of the people we met more than 30 years ago."

In Memoriam

Audrey Bolin

Audrey Bolin, a longtime square dancer and NNJSDA officer, passed away on March 2, 2015. Her husband, Norman, died in 2005, just after their 60th anniversary.

The Bolins started square dancing with Sussex Spinners in 1974. When the club disbanded, they joined Reelers. They held five positions within the NNJSDA: recording secretary 1982-84, 2nd vice president 1984-85, 1st vice president 1985-87, president 1987-89, and Mini-Festival registrar for more than 10 years.

In 1985, Audrey and Norman were surprised with a square dance on their 40th anniversary. In 1986, they were selected to dance at the Statue of Liberty 100th anniversary closing ceremony. Their leadership and guidance have contributed greatly to square dancing throughout the region. Georgi Flandera, NNJSDA trustee, remembered the Bolins as "a wonderful couple – they were tireless workers!"



Norman was employed by General Precision Laboratories, Singer-Kearfott Aerospace, and Lockheed Martin (the same company under different ownership). Audrey worked at Standard Brands before raising their two sons. Later, she was a part-time administrative/financial assistant in an air conditioning company. She was also a fashion designer who made most of her own clothes (including her wedding dress and


matching square dance outfits for her and Norman) and enjoyed knitting and crocheting. Audrey was a Cub Scout den mother for both sons and an avid bowler, serving as league secretary for more than 50 years.

John Callahan

John Callahan, who for more than 65 years was one of the most beloved callers in Rockland and Bergen Counties, has passed away at 90 years old. He began to call professionally in 1947, and his passion for American folk and square dancing remained for almost 70 years. Fittingly, it was at a square dance that he met his wife, Edith. They had two children, Susan (now deceased) and Andrew, and were together for 43 years, until her passing in 1989.

After graduating from Cornell University, John was a chemical researcher with Lederle Laboratories (American Cyanamid). His custom home in Orangeburg, New York, included a dance floor suitable for two squares. He founded Rockland Reelers, holding lessons and workshops at his home for more than 25 years. Cathy and I were privileged to be a part of "Tuesday nights at John's" since 2006. Up to 20 close friends would gather to socialize, celebrate special occasions, and dance to John's melodious calls.

CCNJ President's Message

Welcome to all the new dancers joining us this year! Those in my classes will have heard it before, but everyone needs to keep this thought in mind:

If you are having fun, you've got 95% of square dancing correct, so don't sweat the small stuff.

Square dancing is a recreation, not brain surgery. You should relax and have fun. No one will ever be 100% perfect when dancing. Experienced dancers are simply able to recover from errors more quickly, and this skill develops only with accumulated dance time. From behind the microphone, I've seen experienced dancers make mistakes and move on, while newer dancers presume that they were the cause of the square's breakdown and give up. Additionally, I can state with complete confidence that no caller is error free, and a square's breakdown might be the result of caller error. (You'll know it was caller error if most of the squares are making the same fix!)

The point to all of this? When – not if, but when – something happens in a square, don't panic or argue about who is at fault, as this only wastes dance time; just reset and get back to dancing as quickly as possible. If you and another dancer are going for the same spot, both should look for the open spot. The closer dancer (preferably) should get there to keep the square moving. Your fellow dancers or the caller will fix the issues while you dance or when you get back home.

If a correction cannot be made quickly, then everyone should square up at home. Once there, you can either wait for the beginning of the next sequence or get back to dancing faster by forming lines. To make lines, have each head lady take hands with her partner; then both slide over next to the side couple to the right to make lines at the sides. Once there, wait for the call Lines Forward and Back or something similar (such as "We've got normal lines"), and rejoin the dancing. You may have to fix things on the Promenade home, but at least you had more dancing time.

If a stoppage or breakdown happens during a singer, and you are not sure how to correct it, find your next corner and wait for the Swing and Promenade. For those dancers not yet aware, the normal pattern of a singer is for the lady to progress from her partner to her corner, then the next two corners, and eventually back to her original partner. Therefore, you want to look for your (next) corner if a breakdown occurs during a singer. If you can't find your corner quickly, look for the other open dancer (there will be someone else looking for a corner, I promise) and swing that person. Again, this way the square keeps moving, and eventually you will get back to your original partner. Just keep going, folks!

These suggestions will keep the square and the caller much happier – yes, callers really do want you to have fun and keep moving. Some of the most fun I've had dancing has been when my square was within inches of coming apart, but quickly regrouped and kept going. So, from an experienced dancer, the point of this message is: Just square up and keep dancing.



TIPS FOR THOSE WHO BOOK CALLERS

Thank you to all club members who take on the task of booking callers. What would a dance be without them?! Some tips to ensure a smooth process:

- Hire each caller/cuer at least one year in advance.
- Provide at least two cell phone numbers that can be used in case of emergency en route to a dance.
- Obtain the caller's cell phone number.
- Contact the caller two weeks prior to the dance to verify or update all details, ensure that cell phone numbers for club and caller are current, and provide driving directions if needed (especially if construction has caused detours).

Following these suggestions could save both the caller/cuer and the club from potential problems on the day of the dance.

CLUB PRESIDENTS - CLEARANCE FOR NEW EVENTS

If your club plans to hold an event outside its regular dance program, location, day, or time, *you must request clearance from the NNJSDA*. This helps to ensure that conflicts between events are minimized. Please check with the Recording Secretary for clearance or for regulations regarding new events. Contact information is on page 2 of every *Grand Square*.

Thanks also go to our refreshment team, led by Georgi Flandera and Connie Huettemann, for all the goodies at our dances.


Barbara and Norman Kanter enjoyed their trip to the Winter Festival in Lakeland, Florida, which they combined with visits to their family.

Square dance conventions and other gatherings hold a Parade of States or Grand March, during which dancers march in by state. Dancers from a given state usually wear the same outfit or color combination. Let's have a sea of green at the National Convention in Massachusetts this June!

The New Jersey state outfit colors are kelly green and white, based on the "Garden State" concept. (Examples of kelly green are the *labels* on Schweppes and Seagram's ginger ale bottles.) Each dancer should also have a New Jersey emblem (see picture on left). It can be purchased for \$7.50 at any NNJSDA dance or through the website.

The state emblem consists of a 9" kelly green and white embroidered outline of New Jersey, with an embroidered gold star

(to be placed at the location of the dancer's home club) and an embroidered "NJ." The emblem should be sewn or pinned in a prominent, but tasteful, location such as:

- Back of a kelly green vest with white top-stitching, worn over a white shirt or blouse
- Back of a kelly green or white shirt or blouse
- · Side or center front of a kelly green or white skirt or dress
- On a green overskirt/apron trimmed with white eyelet

Vest patterns (for men and women) can be borrowed from the Association's assistant treasurer. Pants for both men and women should be white, kelly green, or black. Possible outfits can be seen on the dolls on the NNJSDA carousel, which are displayed at each Mini-Festival. Photos are on the website (nnjsda.org/state_outfit).

"Where's the Dance" Website Update

<u>WheresTheDance.com</u> is a "one-stop" website that enables travelers and others to find dance events all over the United States and in 39 other countries! You can search for dances by zip code, address, type of dance, event type, and date range. The results can be viewed in list format, on a calendar, or on a map.

WheresTheDance has recently taken a big step forward to assist the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association in helping its clubs promote their activities.

View a selection of just NNJSDA clubs: Use the *Clubs* menu bar link and then click on the *Modify Search Criteria* tab. You will now be looking at the *Find a Club* page. In the upper right corner, click on the *Advanced Search* button and then the *Select All in an Association* button. Use the drop-down menu to select *Northern NJ SD Assoc*. Press *Search*. You will now be looking at a list of all NNJSDA clubs. Note the last column (*Verified*). This is the date that the club last entered events. If your club does not have a recent date, please ask someone to add the upcoming dances.

Add and edit your club's dance events: Amazingly efficient forms enable clubs to do their own event entry and editing without outside interference. Many clubs are finding this helpful to get their dances on the calendar quickly and easily, often in less time than if they communicated it to WheresTheDance. If your club has not yet added any events to the calendar, send an email to info@WheresTheDance.com to get an invitation to add your events. This enables WTD to ensure that only authorized club representatives add events.

Run a schedule for all NNJSDA clubs: Another awesome new feature is the ability to run a schedule showing all dance events that an association's clubs have on the calendar. It is so very easy to coordinate big events in your area when you know what each club is doing and when! Simply click on the *Schedules* link and enter "Northern New Jersey" in the *Club Name* box.

A final point: Watch our Facebook page for announcements as we continue to spend more time coding new features and less time entering events.

In response to suggestions from dancers, the NNJSDA Raid and One Square Is Fair incentive programs were changed to allow clubs to complete each program twice per dance season. Completing either program once earns a club a 50¢ per member reduction in NNJSDA dues for the following season. Completing both programs once, or either program twice, earns a \$1 per member reduction (which currently equates to no dues at all). The new dance season begins on June 1, 2015.

Raid: The number of points remains 200. Clubs may complete the program twice by earning at least 400 points, using two separate forms.

OSIF: The number of NNJSDA dances at which a club must have at least one square of official members has been reduced to 50% (rounded down).
