Our recent graduates have been honing their skills at NNJSDA and club dances, so they have had more experience and fun with different callers and new friends. They are discovering what a great activity square dancing is around the country and world.

One of the Association's main tasks is providing a variety of dance opportunities. Our policy is to hire out-of-area callers to offer the new voices and new ways of mixing up calls that make square dancing so much fun. If you experience an interesting caller from another region at a festival or elsewhere, let Nancy or Ralph know.

Note from Vic: Speaking of other places, Nancy and I have square danced in Texas and round danced in Germany, where we did have some difficulty conversing during breaks (Nancy says the same thing about the Texan accents). # Friends Don't Let Their Friends Not Square Dance! 

I know, I know! A double negative will make your Lit and Comp 101 professor knock points off your final grade. But isn't that title catchier than: "Why you should grab your friends by the collar and drag them kicking and screaming to square dance lessons for their own good"?

In their book Younger Next Year, Chris Crowley and Henry Lodge explain that exercise is important to our physical health as we pass into middle age and beyond. Why? Forgive me for being blunt, but when an older person stops exercising, he tacitly gives his body permission to shut down ... permanently! Have you ever seen someone recover from a long illness? When my father suffered a heart attack, he was bedridden for several months and lost coordination, muscle strength, and bone density. His first steps, made with the help of two nurses, reminded me of a toddler learning to walk.

The good news is that any regular weight-bearing exercise - including walking sends your body all the signals it needs to know that you're still vital. But if walking can keep your body healthy, why take up square dancing?

Well, if the idea of spending more time together isn't a good enough reason for your friends, you can share the results of a 21 -year study on recreational activities and aging conducted by the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, which was published in the New England Journal of Medicine in June 2003.

The study shows that the best recreational activities keep the mind working as well as the body. At the top of this list are actions requiring split-second, rapid-fire decision-making. Doesn't that sound like modern western square dancing?!

The old-time square dancing, like ballroom dancing, involves performing learned patterns. While good for the body, these dance types don't keep the brain elastic or build the new neural connections that can help fight off dementia. Modern western square dancing requires you to respond to the unexpected patterns delivered by the caller while keeping your body moving in time to the music - literally what the doctor ordered to fight off the negative effects of aging.

Bottom line: Square dancing is good for your body and brain, and you usually get a slice of pie, too! So if you really love your friends, nag encourage them to sign up for lessons this fall. Don't let your younger friends off the hook either. Square dancing will start building up their neural bank accounts well in advance of the onset of aging.

## Guide to Being a Great Angel

1. Smile! Be encouraging. Be gentle with your attitude and words.
2. Wear your name badge; it helps to make things more personal and friendly.
3. Do not talk during the tip. The students need to hear the caller/teacher clearly and without distractions. Save any comments you want to make until after the tip.
4. Do exactly what the caller/teacher calls. For example, do not do a Swing before a Promenade unless it is called.
5. Do not rush through a call. Students need time to process what they hear the caller/teacher say, and then they need more time to react.
6. Help to keep the formations neat. For example, lines and columns should be relatively straight. Try to keep your lines and waves parallel to the walls (not diagonal) and to each other. This will make it easier for the students to identify both the formations and their position in them.
7. You are the example the students see. Do the calls accurately, without taking short cuts and without adding flourishes. Examples: During Dosado, a dancer faces the same wall throughout the call. Circle to a Line is not defined as Slap and Veer. There are no hand contacts in Weave the Ring. Do not add a twirl after a Swing.
8. Use hand contacts consistently to establish formations and keep them neat. Establish eye contact with everyone in your square, especially the person with whom you are about to interact. (Refer to Tips for Your Tips articles at nnjsda.org/grand square.)
9. If you notice someone repeatedly making the same mistake during a tip, at the end of the tip you can (a) give the student the name of the call and suggest he/she approach the caller for clarification, or (b) give the caller the student's name and the call involved and let that person handle the matter as he/she sees fit.
10. Try to review the call definitions before the classes in a handbook or at a website such as tamtwirlers.org/tamination/info/index.html or callerlab.org/Dance-Programs.

## Letter from a Reader

I've noticed that some dancers add flourishes to their steps, such as "bouncing" and kicking their feet out. Unfortunately, one of the times that I was kicked in the ankle, I fell down because of it. Please be considerate of your fellow dancers.

It is dangerous to bounce or kick so much that you injure others. I work with handicapped individuals, and we have seen that even a slight mishandling can cause a fracture. Many dancers are older and have osteoporosis - making it easier for them to break a bone, and taking longer to heal when they are injured.

If a dance floor (such as a hard cement surface) does not "give," your feet take a pounding with every step, and bouncing intensifies the pounding. As we age, this can lead to foot injuries such as plantar fasciitis, in which there is pain along the entire sole. Untreated, it becomes a chronic condition that may not be helped even with surgery. Bouncing could end your square dancing activities.

Bouncing never was, and never will be, essential to square dancing. It is, after all, called square dancing, not square bouncing! Let's demonstrate the steps as defined in our manuals and codified by Callerlab. If we execute the steps smoothly and in precise time with the beats of the music, the square will hold together better and no one will be inadvertently injured by a flying foot. Modern western square dancing is an art form and should be treated with dignity. We do not need to add anything extra to the dance form - except grace. Along with their love of square dancing, husband-and-wife team Nancy and Vic Ammons share duties in the NNJSDA: Nancy as 1st vice president and Vic as co-president.

Then Vic entered the Army, and their first child, Dan, was born in Heidelberg, Germany. Dan is now an emergency room doctor married to a pediatrician, and they have two children. Returning from Europe after three and a half years, Vic and Nancy completed MBAs at Rutgers University, and expanded their family with two more children: Becky, now a special education teacher and mother of two, and Jon, an attorney with an 18-month-old.

Nancy and Vic have a dog and many cats. They also care for a colony of feral cats, and Nancy recently worked with a local animal shelter to trap, neuter, and release 10 of them. In addition, she caught and found homes for nine kittens.

With their busy schedules, Nancy and Vic look forward to their dance time. Indeed, square dancing is a family affair; Nancy's sister and brother-in-law, Jeanne and Dan Hart, are dancers, and they often spend Labor Day weekend at Cherry Ridge.

CCNJ President's Message

Folks: Late this past spring, I stepped down as president of CCNJ with a heavy heart. By the time you read this, Kathy and I will have moved out of New Jersey and a new CCNJ president will be elected shortly.
Our sincere apologies for the disruption this has caused; it was not the way we had planned to make the move, but sometimes you just have go with the flow and timing of life changes.

A new dance season is starting and many clubs will be gearing up for "progressive dances" (also referred to as classes or lessons), with an eye on recruiting new people into our activity. The officers, club members, and caller should be working together to make your progressive dances as enjoyable and inviting as possible. (Dances are much more fun than classes or lessons, hence the suggested name.) Interacting with many friendly people who are helpful and supportive should go a long way toward making dances successful. Think about what a kind word, a guiding (but never shoving) hand, and a smiling face did for you when you started. Please remember to "pay it forward" with the new dancers.

Communication among all parties, including the newer dancers, will ease the work and prevent difficulties that put the club, caller, and dancers off track. Talk about what is expected by all concerned (what the club expects of the caller and vice versa, what the new dancers should expect of the club/caller and vice versa).

To me, a successful recruitment is not in the number of new dancers who start, but in how many of them complete the season and then become active club members. Also, dancer success should not be measured by the number of programs in which one is proficient, but by how much fun one has when dancing. Officers, dancers, and callers should speak together (and listen to one another) about what will make the progressive and club dances they sponsor more fun, entertaining, and inviting.

I will leave you with a couple of final thoughts. If you find yourself stressing out at a dance, take a step back, and then a deep breath. Remember that we frequently cannot change what happens to us or how others behave toward us, but we can choose our reaction and the attitude we display. If you see another dancer who is stressed, step up and offer the kind word and friendly face he or she needs. You may find an unexpected new friend when you follow this guideline both on and off the dance floor.

I will be back in the area now and again as time allows. Take care, and I hope to see you all dancing soon.

We vividly recall dancing to that wonderful number in the main hall with thousands of other Mainstream dancers.

We came back on the Parkway from both events with many happy memories, so delighted that we had discovered a wonderful recreational activity that we knew would transform our social life.

## TIPS FOR THOSE WHO BOOK CALLERS

Thank you to all club members who take on the task of booking callers. What would a dance be without them?! Some tips to ensure a smooth process:

- Hire each caller/cuer at least one year in advance.
- Provide at least two cell phone numbers that can be used in case of emergency en route to a dance.
- Obtain the caller's cell phone number.
- Contact the caller two weeks prior to the dance to verify or update all details, ensure that cell phone numbers for club and caller are current, and provide driving directions if needed (especially if construction has caused detours). Following these suggestions could save both the caller/cuer and the club from potential problems on the day of the dance.

## In Memoriam: Lucille Ims

Lucille Ims, a square dance caller esteemed by many in our region, passed away on June 10, 2015, following multiple battles with various types of cancer. Her determination, optimism, and love of life have touched countless people.

When Lucille was 10 years old, her square dancing parents took her to lessons. She continued to dance while earning bachelor's and master's degrees in music. As a teacher in Pennsylvania elementary and high schools, she also worked part-time in her father's accounting business. Later, she became a certified public accountant and worked full-time in the business. Her musical expertise was employed in writing and arranging music as well as directing plays and choral groups. She also enjoyed hiking.

After years of dancing, Lucille attended a Callerlab school in Connecticut. Upon completion, she got equipment, sent out cards announcing a class in the Elk Mountain resort area of Pennsylvania, and began teaching. The Elk Mountaineers Square Dance Club was thus formed in 1994, with Lucille as both teacher and caller. Two years later, Lucille met a neighbor named Ed, a professional engineer. She informed him that, in order for their relationship to continue, he would need to attend her square dance class. It took no persuasion, since Ed was already a barn dance caller. They married in 1999.


Lucille's generosity is legendary. She accepted no payment from her own club, and gladly drove long distances to be a guest caller in New Jersey and elsewhere. But that generosity was perhaps most appreciated by fellow cancer patients, who have benefited from Lucille and Ed's presence, wisdom, and unfailing encouragement.

We successfully graduated a Mainstream and a Plus class this year, with both held on the same night (Mainstream followed by Plus). This worked out very well due to the excellent organizational skills of our class coordinators, Diane and John Festa, the talented teaching of Dan Tapper, and the enthusiastic assistance of many angels.

Our May Day event looked particularly festive, thanks in part to the floral head wreaths made by our talented Matty Sharkey for many of the women.
