All square dancers want to dance enjoyable tips without forming "pat" squares (four couples who arrange ahead of time to dance a tip together; fun to dance with particular friends, but considered snobbish and ill-mannered if done tip after tip). There are two ways that experienced dancers can help the newer dancers become as adept and confident as they are. The first way is to go to classes and be an angel. If your club does not have a class, then go to another club and angel for them. Being an angel

not only helps the students, but it helps to keep you on your toes, also. We have been dancing for 16 years, and we still learn something in class every year.

The second way to help newer dancers is to encourage them to attend the NNJSDA dances with the new format, especially the Early Mainstream (MS) from 7:30 to 8:00 at all NNJSDA dances. With MS singers in all tips, all dancers can dance part of <u>every</u> tip. If you take them to the Association dances, the newer dancers will have the opportunity to dance to out-of-area callers, and you can show them how really good you are. We all look up to role models – become one!

Our NNJSDA Square Dancers Survey

The eternal challenge: Attracting more people to square dancing and maintaining their involvement. A survey taken in 2008 via the NNJSDA email list generated a response rate of 50 percent; the answers to three questions are summarized below.

- **1. Finding out about square dancing** Nearly half of all respondents heard about square dancing by word of mouth. In some cases, friends and relatives took them personally to an open house or lessons. (One dancer got a full square from the same block.) The next highest source was adult schools, followed by newspaper ads and demos. Flyers, radio spots, and church events were mentioned by a few people. Individual respondents discovered square dancing through a Dear Abby column, a conversation overheard in Macy's, a Toastmasters convention, and the Internet. (My hunch: The Internet will become increasingly popular for locating leisure activities.)
- **2. Wanting to continue dancing** The most frequently cited reason was friendliness/friendships. The second highest reason was fun. Physical and mental exercise and the sheer love of dancing ranked next. ("It's the feel-goodest fun way to exercise I can imagine!" "It is a total mind and body workout, which I love.") A significant number of people valued the social aspect of dancing, including having an evening out with their spouse. Smaller numbers mentioned being welcomed or encouraged by others to continue; having a great teacher; and the pleasures of meeting new people, traveling, and becoming competent in the challenges of dancing. Individual respondents continued dancing because of a dancing girlfriend, the "yummy food," absence of alcohol, and inexpensiveness of a dance.
- 3. Joining the club The top reason for joining was loyalty to the club providing lessons. Many dancers became members automatically upon completion of classes, and for others it felt like the natural next step. A sizeable number of respondents cited the opportunity to continue dancing; meeting new people and socializing (both at dances and at other activities with square dance friends); the friendliness of club members; and the desire to continue associating with friends made during lessons. Other significant reasons for joining a club included having fun, encouragement from members, the club's proximity to home, the desire to belong to a group, receiving free membership for a year or a member's discount on dances, and continuing the exercise of dancing. Three individuals joined because of "dating several girls from the club," wanting the particular program danced by the club, and enjoying an activity shared with a spouse.

What else? Dozens of insightful comments were offered by the respondents, though space does not permit sharing them all. Two people urged clubs to clue in new dancers on how things "work" – prepare welcome booklets explaining the benefits and responsibilities of joining, the reasons for paying dues, how the club functions, who does what when, how they can become involved, raiding, and various square dance organizations ("what all the letters stand for"). Several respondents noted the value of square dancing for singles, seniors, and teens, encouraging clubs to actively include them in club activities. Another suggested promoting square dancing to fulfill physical education requirements for homeschooled youngsters. One couple advocated teaching all new dancers by definition (DBD) to lay the groundwork for strong dancing at all program levels. Someone

The Gathering 2008



Numerous optimistic and encouraging comments were offered by the 145 participants in The Gathering 2008, which was held on Saturday, September 27 at Douglass College. The afternoon began with a keynote address by Tim Marriner, an enthusiastic caller from South Carolina. His topic was "Winning Ways to Approach our Future," and attendees were excited by his informative and energizing talk. Tim remarked afterwards, "Sharing thoughts and ideas unifies and strengthens the activity. The folks [who attended] are motivated and energized to get the job done."

After the keynote address, dancers selected two sessions from among the 10 available throughout the afternoon. Speakers came from NNJSDA clubs as well as other clubs and organizations. The 10 topics included: What kind of dancer are you; Classes, callers, and halls; Club business tools; Anticipating and coping with disaster; Is your club exclusive or inclusive; A gentle (not pushy) way of doing business; Organizing special club activities and fundraising; Print media beyond the flyer; Club officers/roles; and Square dancing on the road. After the discussions, Mickey Weiss of AleMo Squares said, "I came away understanding clearly that *square dancing is square dancing*; the program you dance is not what's important. The fact that you dance is important."

The wrap-up session provided an opportunity to hear about national square dance organizations and to summarize what was learned during the afternoon. In addition to the formal sessions, there was plenty of one-on-one sharing of ideas in the hallways. Handouts for most of the topics as well as other resource materials were available in the main hall and are now on the NNJSDA website. Following the dinner break, Tim Marriner and Roy Gotta called and cued a superb evening dance.

At the end of the day, one dancer summed up the experience: "Some great ideas to try out." And that was the point of the 10-hour event – giving dancers the chance to discuss stories of success and failure while providing inspiration for experimenting with new ways of sharing our activity with current and future dancers. Among the attendees were 19 callers and cuers whose presence demonstrated their professional dedication and willingness to work with dancers to explore new ideas to keep square dancing alive.

The Gathering 2008 was co-chaired by Donna Poyer, Mike Szekula, and Sharon and Charlie Kittner. Committee members were Rusty and Richard Ball, Kay Davis, Betsy and Roy Gotta, Lise Greene, Kathy Keener, Ken Robinson, and Ruth Seaman. The event was cosponsored by the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association, the Square Dance Council of New Jersey, and the Callers' Council of New Jersey. Experienced callers who attended both to help and learn included Ron Kapnick, Gardner Patton, and Fran Wadel. Partners and friends who attended to dance for the fledgling callers included Ruth Edison, Roy Gotta, Freddie Kaltenthaler, Betsy Tapper, and Alice Winnick. Thanks are given to all who helped and apologies to those whose names were not included. Some of the newer callers are working with mentors and can be heard calling a tip at lessons or occasional club functions. The CCNJ also holds an education session (at 9:30 am) prior to their quarterly meetings. Meetings are the second Saturday of March, June, September, and December each year. "One Square is Fair" Program: The New Format

The "One Square is Fair" Program is designed to encourage NNJSDA clubs and dancers to support their Association's events. By meeting certain requirements, clubs are rewarded with a dues reduction.

Prior to September 2008, clubs were required to attend all of the events with a full square during a summer or winter "season" in order to qualify for a dues reduction. As a result, some clubs stopped participating in the program once they did not have a full square in attendance at an Association-sponsored event. Therefore, the Executive Board has revised the "One Square is Fair" Program. For the dues year 2009:

- The program includes every event run by the NNJSDA from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.
- A club must attend only 7 of the 12 scheduled events with a full square. (The exact number of events that must be attended to earn the dues reduction will be reevaluated annually by the Board since the number of NNJSDA-sponsored events changes year to year.)

Support your NNJSDA! While having fun at Association events, you help your club qualify for the "One Square Is Fair" Program dues reduction next September. The remaining qualifying events are January 25 (Mid-Term Class Level Dance), January 31, April 26 (Spring Fling), May 30 (Live Music), July 8, July 22, August 12, and August 26.

President: Presides at Association meetings; spokesperson for the Association. (Candidates must have served as an officer of the Executive Committee.) 1st Vice President: Responsible for special events, halls, and callers. 2nd Vice President: Responsible for items regarding new recruits (beginner classes, dances, etc.). 3rd Vice President: Responsible for publicity items; assists clubs that have financial or membership difficulties; liaison for disputes between clubs. Recording Secretary: Takes and distributes minutes of Association meetings; maintains records of clubs' regular dance schedules; chairs the Clearance Committee. Corresponding Secretary: Responsible for correspondence not handled by the Recording Secretary; in that officer's absence, assumes those duties. Treasurer: Keeps record of income, moneys on hand, and expenditures; presents the financial status at Association meetings. Assistant Treasurer: Assists the Treasurer at events; assumes those duties if the Treasurer is absent from a scheduled function.

Officers serve without financial remuneration, but the rewards of working with like-minded people to keep square dancing in our area great are priceless!





Our GRAND SQUARE History



Peg and Doc Tirrell

The Tirrells, 1965-1990

In April of 1959, *Grand Square*, the official publication of the NNJSDA, was born with the Association's second president, Bob Keck, doing the lion's share of the writing and set-up. This triannual 8½ x 11 publication was filled with local and national square dance news. In 1963, Bill Geler became editor, and the *Grand Square* went from being mailed individually to every dancer to distribution via the club delegates.

The number of pages in *Grand Square* increased with square dancing's growth. When Bill resigned in 1965, the NNJSDA presidents, Peg and Doc Tirrell, searched unsuccessfully to find a replacement. Unable to let this valuable publication die, Peg moved from northern reporter to editor, and Doc became part of the team. Charlie Bogart, a local square dancer who was also a printer, volunteered to help turn the newsletter into a true magazine.

A corner of the Tirrells' living room became an office. Charlie was their mentor, supplying them with specially marked paper on which to type articles and create ads, critiquing, and then running the presses. The northern and southern reporters and an advertising editor completed the staff. Hot wax made adding art work and corrections easier, and a file of "clip art" was started.

As the NNJSDA expanded, a western area reporter, an associate editor, and a distribution coordinator were added. Manny Amor and Clete Polk volunteered their artwork humor; traveling dancers brought back stories and articles to share. The NNJSDA displays at the National Conventions included the *Grand Square*. Poster contest entries became issue covers. The manual typewriter was eventually replaced by an electric model. However, it wasn't until 1985 that Peg received help with the typing from Donna Anderson, Dot Loewenstein, MaryAnne Mosseau, Kathy Porter, and Shirley Sherlock. The production staff proofread, hot waxed in ads, made corrections, and inserted clip art before the final issue went to the printer. From this hardworking group, the Tirrells recruited their successors, Kathy and Charlie Porter, who brought *Grand Square* to a new high.

Peg and Doc Tirrell treasure the sign they were given for their front door – "WORK HAZARD! Stay around here long enough and you'll have to work."

The Porters, 1990-2000

In 1987, Kathy Porter joined the staff of *Grand Square* and, in 1989, Charlie Porter became responsible for the ads. In 1990, after spending nearly three years traveling from Staten Island, NY to Cresskill, NJ and toting a memory typewriter to work on the issues, the Porters became editors of *Grand Square*. Although Kathy and Charlie both worked full time, they were committed to taking *Grand Square* into the computer generation. The NNJSDA bought a Mac computer, software, and printer that were ultimately donated to a school after almost 10 years of use.

The Porters made many changes with their first issue, all of which are still part of the current editions. The biggest addition was the Calendar of Advertised Dances, which elicited rave reviews from the dancers. They also instituted indexes for advertisers' ads and the articles that appeared in each issue. The issues were standardized so that the NNJSDA presidents' letter, the calendar of events, and ads appeared on the same pages in every issue.

The *Grand Square* was made all the better by its fine staff including Karen Kushla, Lois and Leo Bichler, and many others who served for 10 years.

Reducing the publication frequency from five to three issues a dance season reduced the printing costs for the NNJSDA and the cost of ads to the clubs, and enabled the Porters to continue as editors. After a long search for new editors, the Porters retired in 2000, thrilled that two very capable couples, Barbara and Norman Kanter and Jan and Louis Thompson, would assume the reins.

Although Florida residents for the past five years, the Porters still enjoy reading every issue of *Grand Square* cover-to-cover. *Kathy Porter*

Barbara and Norman Kanter and Jan and Louis Thompson inherited a wonderful publication from the Tirrells and the Porters. During the present editorship, the most dramatic change has been the digitalization of the *Grand Square*'s production. Thanks to Rusty Ball and Lise Greene's countless hours of hard work and perseverance over the past two years, the *Grand Square* is now completely assembled on the computer. 


