



The wonderful response of our dancers to our Keokuk Disaster Relief Fund is another example of cooperation. Splendid participation in all Association functions and appeals such as our Grand Square Booster Drive proves conclusively that our members are eager to promote square dancing throughout their Association...

One area that requires additional vigilance by all clubs, is the matter of special dances sponsored by our member clubs on nights other than their regularly scheduled dance nights. For the most part the Clearance Committee has proven to be very helpful in reducing the malcontent that comes from conflict. Orderly growth depends to a large degree upon the judicious planning of special dances, with an appropriate understanding for the well being of other member clubs that may be adversely affected. This holds true for an arbitrary change in the regular dance night of a club. It is hoped and strongly advocated, that all member clubs cooperate fully. The well being of our member clubs is best served, individually and collectively, when full cooperation is given to the Clearance Committee enthusiastically.....

It is made up of its member clubs!! It is therefor its duty to safeguard the welfare of all its clubs. If a special dance by a member club is scheduled and a conflict results with one or more other member clubs, a situation arises that is not in the best interest of all the other member clubs. The Association must protect the interests of all its clubs and therefor, in all due conscience, it cannot support the action of any club that arbritarily trespasses on the dance time of another.....We hope and feel that all member clubs will help each other with complete cooperation and understanding, in this vital area......
