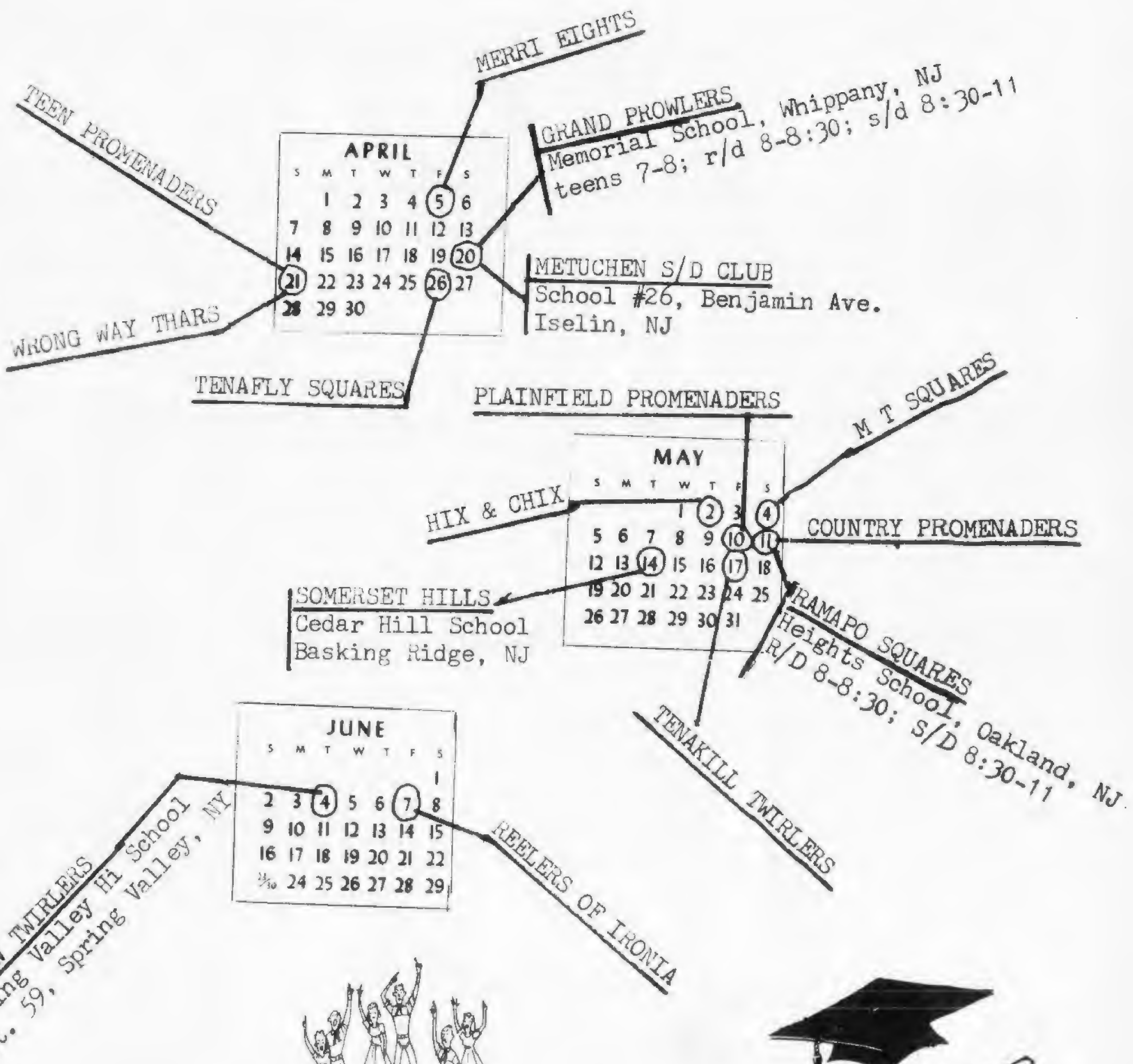

".....100% attendance.....our official publication, GRAND SQUARE, was given to the delegates for distribution at their clubs.....next issue to be dedicated to graduates.....Peg requested the names and addresses of graduates by March 4.....plans for 6th annual callers carnival were revealed...13 callers, 2 R/D leaders, Chip Hendrickson's demonstration group from Connecticut will participate...Hix & Chix and the Cloverleafs volunteered to host the 2 refreshment stands....Ed & Elsie Rice announced the ROM for Mar is Rag Doll; the ROM for April is Hello Faithless ...Tom Duncan reported 329 people enrolled in classes with graduations being scheduled from now thru June....Rosemary Brixie reported that the Clearance Committee has adopted a policy of using a 15 mile radius from the dance hall as the area of conflict between a club dance and a special dance held on the same night as the club...patron record cards were distributed for dancers desiring to become a NNJSDA patron...Dick Lighthipe reported that a meeting was held with the purpose of updating the list of basics to be covered in beginners classes.....(see page 12)..SQUARENADERS of Livingston, N.J. was accepted into full membership of the Association...this brings our total member clubs to 26....Grand Square booster information was distributed, due to a press breakdown the tags themselves will be available later...the nominating committee is composed of Ed & Myrtle Ramsey (Y Squares) Chairman, Lou & Helen Hardy (Ramapo) and Lou & Jo Cavanagh (Staten Square Set)..... Frank Cavanaugh introduced Dan Jones, president of Rutgers Promenaders who requested info concerning admittance to the Association....the Rutgers Dean of Student Activities requests a meeting with an Association representative Peg Tirrell will attend this meeting February 15...the secretaries requested names and addresses of new officers as soon as possible...information concerning Teen Age Clubs was requested by Ed Shearwood (hi Taws). Grand Square Editors stated they would gladly publish any (see page 27)....Banner pinning, as opposed to stealing, was discussed...a committee will be formulated to crystallize the various suggestions and report back in April...Y Squares, Colonial Squares and Country Promenaders hosted the refreshment break.... Next meeting APRIL 21 at the same place - Plainfield Trust State National Bank in Fanwood, N.J....."



BEGINNER CLASSES - If you haven't done so yet, please notify Tom & Zena Duncan(212-EL1-7897) as to your diploma and perfect attendance needs. A representative of the Association will be glad to attend your graduation. The April-May issue of GRAND SQUARE is dedicated to the graduates and always includes a listing of graduates. It is hoped clubs will personally invite them to join with them.

SQUARE DANCE BASICS COORDINATOR - The committee met and discussed not only updating the list of basics, but also the failure of classes to provide more lasting square dancers; the drop out situation; workshops; reactivating the Callers Association. They recommend - teaching well and thoroughly so that dancers really know the call and do it well, emphasis on quality no quantity; more post graduate courses; gearing of summer dances to the graduates; minimum of 25 lessons; instructors adhere to the newly formulated list of basics (see page 12) Their list is divided into 3 parts - a must be taught - a may be taught in workshop - style suggestions (the latter two are not published yet).

FIGURES 'n FACTS - guest editor *Beulah Samec*

FAN THRU: (by Tom Tarleton, Marysville, Ohio)
explanation: On command to Fan Thru 2 facing couples start a pass thru, the 2 in the center do a forearm swing, half around, then pull by while ends step forward ending with the couples standing back to back with opposites as partners. (Equivalent: 2 ladies chain, pass thru).

FAN THE TOP: (by Deuce Williams, Dearborn, Michigan)
explanation: From ocean wave, centers swing $3/4$ around, ends move up $1/4$ to form another wave. From facing couples, on call to FAN THE TOP make a wave (like fan thru), centers swing left $3/4$ around while ends move up $1/4$. FAN THE TOP is like Spin the Top without the ends swinging in first.
