


At this writing our first all-Ramapo baby has not arrived and our whole tribe is waiting (almost as nervously as the grandparents - Hardy's and





We would like to express our thanks to you for the excellent support given to the Association summer dances. Also our thanks to the callers and r/d leaders who made these dances so successful.


As this goes to print, we have received application from two outlying clubs to join the NNJSDA. This is a very healthy sign and shows the con-

Det's Square Dance



a first hand report by Dorothy and Paul Pullman

As in everything else in England, as American feels at home square dancing, but....there are always those fascinating differences to remind us that we are abroad. Just as our little grandson sleeps in a "cot", rides in a "pram" and requires all too frequent changes of "nappies", so do English practitioners of what they call "American Square dancing" introduce their variations into the art.

Essentially it is square dancing as we know it. The sets and calls are the same (although we had some trouble with pahss through"). One is met with the same warm welcome and good fellowship. First names are in order which is extremely informal there. Dances are all open with all comers

most graciously received.

Most English dances are at a somewhat slower pace (not Tommy Cavanaugh!), but the callers tend to belt out the songs with great fervor - the emphasis is on singing calls and often the dancers know the next call as well as the caller does. On the other hand they are accomplished round dancers and would not dream of being cued - the record goes on and the whole floor dances. Their clothes are similar to ours, though many wear ordinary clothing and nobody gives a second thought. Children of all ages dance with the adults with style and grace - there is no generation gap here. There are also many singles and those friendly Englishmen on seeing a lady disengaged will politely invite her to dance.

After our experience, we would heartily recommend to any travelers that they inquire in advance about dancing on their way. We only promise a heartwarming contact with dancers of another nation. We do not promise that you will follow the example of John of Australia whom we met in London-when he returns home he will take with him the English bride whom he found

in the square dance hall.
