

According to our recently ammended By-Laws -"...any member club planning to hold a special dance on a night other than their regularly scheduled night shall notify the Secretary. The same procedure applies to any member club desiring to change their regular night or location of dancing dates will be recorded as received ... in no event will the Secretary acknow-

ledge any specific date for more than 3 years in advance...a regularly scheduled dance of member clubs have priority over dance classes, workshops or any extra-curricular activities by any member club or Association caller." A 15 mile radius from the dance hall has been established as the accepted area of conflict. In the event of difficulties, the 3rd vice president shall attempt to effect a mediation, following the procedure as outlined in the By Laws, that is satisfactory to all concerned.


Our round dance program is especially promising this year with a half hour of instruction in new dances from 8-8:30 pm and two rounds cued by Dot Keller between tips.





Same set arrangement but lower price is STATEN SQUARE SET (50ϕ) and GRAND PROWLERS (50ϕ).

Extending a welcome to all teenage square dancers who have completed satisfactorily an NNJSDA approved instructional course in s/ding are: Cornwall S/D Club, Hi Taws, Hill City, Ironia Reelers, Princeton Squares, Ramapo (reg. member rate), Rutgers Promenaders, See Saw Squares, Sussex Spinners, Swingin' Stars, Warren Wheelers, Y Squares (\$1.50 per teen). Same welcome but with a lower admission rate: all NNJSDA dances, Cali Hoes (75¢), Circle Eights (50¢), Cloverleafs (75¢), Hix & Chix (75¢), Isle Squares (\$1.00), Squarenaders (50¢), Tenafly Squares (65¢), Tenakill Twirlers (50¢).

Special note from DANCING SQUARES: "...the members declined to vote on the question. The feelings -- both pro and con -- were so definite that we feel welcoming teenagers to dance with us would cause too much dissension. However, if competent, congenial teenager dancers should visit the club, they would be accepted as are our other guests..." From COLONIAL SQUARES: "...We feel this to be a question of little concern in Colonial Squares, inasmuch as we meet on Wednesdays -- a night that most teenagers would be at home with the school-books, but it was the consensus that older teenagers would be welcome as guests if they are able to dance at our challenge level..."

No replies were forth coming from: Country Promenaders, Hanover Squares, M T Squares, Merri-Eights, Mountain Squares and Somerset Hills. Happy dancing!!!
