ENGLAND REVISITED


Your international correspondents had the good fortune to square dance in England again this year and have a few items to bring the record up to date -

"PATCHWORK" is really 'in' this season...so let's make a patchwork square dance skirt...

To be most effective, it should have many patches, there . fore a light-weight drip-dry type fabric would be ideal.

To determine the size of the squares needed, divide your finished skirt length by the desired number of tiers (rows) and add to this figure your top and bottom seam allowances and thus you have the size..example-a 24" length divided by 4 tiers is 6" plus $\frac{1}{2}$ " top and $\frac{1}{2}$ " bottom seams giving a total of 7" or 7" squares are to be used.

To determine the number of squares needed, figure the number desired for the uppermost tier, example 10. Double the number for the second tier, double this number for the 3rd tier, and double this number for the 4th tier. Example 10 in top tier, 20 in tier 2, 40 in tier 3, and 80 in lowest tier.

Take the number allowed for tier 1 and sew them end to end, leaving end open. Likewise sew the allowed squares for tier 2 end to end, again leaving end seam open. Gather upper edge of tier 2 to fit bottom edge of tier 1, you will notice 2 squares on tier 2 will gather up to fit 1 square on tier 1. Proceed in this manner with tiers 3 and 4. Close up open seam to within allowance for a skirt placket zipper. Insert zipper according to package directions.

Gather upper edge of skirt to fit waistline. Cut strip of fabric for waistband 2" longer than waist measurement and double the desired width. Fold in half lengthwise, sew closed both ends and turn. Right sides together, sew band to upper edge of skirt with extra bit to be underlap for button or hook and eye. Tack on wrong side by hand. Finish with desired closing.

Finish lower edge with machine hem, or lace-edged hand sewn hem, or a little ruffle of gathered lace.

For a variation, make a gathered flounce in place of lowest tier, this could have a blouse to match.

A sleeveless blouse to match one of the squares and a blouse with either long sleeves or puffy shorter ones would make two changes using the same skirt.

Another added touch could be a wide sash to tie into a large bow in back, and belt carriers on the waistband.

How about matching bloomers?
