We wish to express our thanks to Jane Carazo for her work in teaching the class. They have been active visiting Dick Maddocks' class, Homer Quick's class and a trip to Tenafly Squares. Come and welcome them to the wonderful world of square dancing.



Let's make the old stand-by...the 3 tiered skirt with a few suggested variations.

Whether it's to be a regular skirt or the skirt portion to a new dress the method is basically the same.

To determine amount of fabric needed we must do a bit of arithmetic. Measure from the hemline to your waist to determine your skirt length. Divide that figure by 3 and add to it your seam allowances, top and bottom. This will give you a 'cutting length'. Example- a 24" skirt length divided by 3 is 8" plus 2 seam allowances of 5/8" each is a total of 9 1/4". You will need 2 widths of fabric for the top tier; 4 widths for the middle tier, and 8 widths for the lowest tier or a total of 14 widths. The doubling of each tier makes for both a very full skirt and easy assemblage of the gathers. Note- be sure to allow an additional 1/8 yd. for the waistband if this is a skirt.

Sewing directions— Join together, end to end, the 8 sections of the lowest tier to form a large circle. Then join together, end to end, the 4 sections of the middle tier to make a medium sized circle. Join the 2 sections of the top tier only by 1 seam leaving open the other for the zipper.

Gather the upper edge of large circle to fit the lower edge of medium circle. Then gather upper edge of medium circle to fit lower edge of top tier. Insert zipper in left—side opening.

Gather upper edge of skirt to fit waistline and sew to waist—band. Attach snaps or other fastener to waistband.

Finally, put a narrow hem on lower edge of skirt.

Tiers may be embroidered, appliqued, trimmed with ribbon, lace, bandings, rickrack, fabric paints or whatever pleases you, either before gathering or after skirt is completed.

If a deeper hem is desired, then the 8 sections of the lowest tier should be cut about 2" longer each, to allow for the hem.

A skirt of graduated tiers can be made by subtracting l" from the cutting length of the top 2 sections, and adding l" to the cutting length of the 8 sections of the lowest tier, however this will require more fabric.

Perhaps you would prefer top-set rufflesno problem...add about 2" as your top seam allowance to tiers two and three to allow for the extra turned under piece.

Many interesting variations are possible, including 4 and even 5 tiered versions all working on the same principles. Food for thought- how about a white or pastel skirt brought to a club dance, autographed in pencil by all your friends, then the signatures retraced in ball-point paints in many colors....original, and pretty, too.....


