

Callers Carnival set for October 30, 1971 with 2 halls at Maywood....NNJSDA planning ahead 5th Friday/ Saturdays belong to NNJSDA first- all clubs should clear any specials thru Clearance first GRAND SQUARE will list dates three years in advance.....Sept. 30, 1972 and March 31, 1973 set for Association...27 clubs had classes with 545 graduates.....145 received 100% pins....all graduates admitted to one NNJSDA summer dance free..... scrapbook of publicity releases put together by Braly's was displayed for all to see....a reminder to keep publicity flowing..... National S/D week September 19-25 - Governor will proclaim the week again clubs asked to plan demonstrations, articles, etc....publicize the week to let out our well kept secret of western square dancing..... See Saw Squares application announced.....Westwood Wheelers application received..... auditor is Les Davis....Cornwall S/D club is having trouble getting a group....a concentrated effort will be made in the fall to get a class going back in that area....delegates are reminded to pass along their delegates badges to their successor....please wear the badges at all dances....insurance policies of several kinds were discussed....a full report will be given in the fall Cross Trail Squares presented with a mini banner for club banner problems of callers having to cancel out at last minute were discussed slate as presented by nominating committee unanimously accepted by delegates.... Let's make some ties for the man in your life. A tie that uses some of your dress fabric and or trim co-ordinates your outfits.



First of all, clean out your husband's tie collection to see which ones could use replacing. Be sure to save the old clips as they will be reused.

The neckerchief style- Carefully open the sewed seams on the old tie, saving the plastic clip. It is not necessary to open the hem as we'll figure that in when making our pattern. Trace the long piece onto tissue or brown paper, mark the grain of fabric as it is important for the tie to hang correctly and the grain is necessary. Cut out the traced pattern 3/8" beyond the tracing line, this will allow a rolled hem. From a scrap of interfacing cut the small piece that was tacked in the center. (if your fabric is sturdy you can sometimes omit the interfacing). Narrowly hem your new tie the same as the old one, hand hems look much nicer than machine ones, however a decorative stitch to match your dress would be most attractive. With a few blind stitches tack the interfacing to wrong side in the center. Fold unseamed edges in, bring folded edges together and hand sew blind stitches to edge. Using another tie as a guide fold tails to loop over plastic clip and come thru center. Fasten in the back with a few stitches to secure. Press tails. Note: If a lightweight fabric like whipped cream is used, it can be cut double with one piece serving as a lining and elinating the rolled hem and the interfacing.

The colonel style- Open the little piece in the center that is holding the whole thing together.

Carefully remove the metal clip.

Open any threads that are serving to hold the pieces to each other.

Measure each piece, adding the seam allowance and enough to double it when sewing; cut the necessary pieces from your scraps of dress fabric. If you're making one with a double top RAW EDGES to bow, the uppermost bow can be made of a piece of trimming as on your dress. Sew each piece fold fold folds.

making a small belt. Leave an opening for turning. Trim seam, turn and press. Make one long piece for the tails, and one or two to be made into rings for the bows. Join the seams on the smaller ones to make a ring. Place one ring on top of the other, center seams down, fasten with a few strands of thread. Using the old tie as a guide, cut in the

underside of bottom ring and insert metal clip you saved from old tie. Fold tail in half to be even and attach to center of tie with a few stitches. Over all now put on center piece by hand. press.

readers' views I'd like to talk to those of you who have been dancing for more than a couple years. You have, I am sure made many friends in s/ding. You probably enjoy a certain amount of challenge in your dancing as you have grown more proficient and relaxed in dancing basics. Are you now starting to get cliquish with who, you dance? It can easily occur since you talk with those you know best and naturally square up with them for the next tip. New dancers are also relucant to break into squares of more experienced dancers.

Are you going out of your way to cultivate these new dancers of the clubs at which you dance? Recently I heard of a couple who entered a club at which they sometimes danced and found to their dismay that they knew only one couple. Their crowd had not come. How many of the dancers do you have a nodding acquaintance with in your club? If you are a regular attendant and cannot answer at least 80% then you are not introducing yourself around. As you visit your clubs this month look around. Go out of your way to square up with those not in your clique. Talk to others between tips. Sure some may be less proficient dancers, but they also may be much more interesting people....and given encouragement who knows what can happen. Time out for a scatter promenade.....

Due to space limitations we will paraphrase comments from Charles Harrington..."A great deal has been written about another the warmth & fellowship of s/ding with criticism, from time to time, of people who seem to only "come to dance".. The basic reason for and purpose of s/ding is dancing - the enjoyment & satisfaction of being part of a group of people successfully doing intricate figures in time to the music & thoroughly enjoying themselves. Anything else that s/ding provides are fringe benefits. As in all forms of physical & mental endeavor there are many levels of competence...this was true back in the simpler old days of Eastern-style dancing but it is true today. It could very well be a mistake to drag people into s/ding who either have no aptitude or who won't apply themselves enough to gain some competence. Western style has gotten complicated & undoubtedly this is a part of the problem. .. you have to work at it, & you have to stay with it. Some do not think it is all that important; they feel left out & resent pre-arrangement of -sets. Most competent dancers do not object to dancing with beginners but they do not enjoy dancing with poor dancers. We all know people who have been dancing for years but are still not fun to dance with ... and beginners who have a feel for it, who are working at it, who are fun to help...there will always be problems but, please, let us worry a little more about the quality of dancing and a little less about the fellowship, et al.


