

from the desk of GEORGE and PHYLLIS COWAN, presidents

We are very honored to be selected by the clubs to lead the Association in the coming year. We will do our best to deserve the trust and

responsibility you have placed with us.

We hope during the coming year to achieve one major goal which we feel will make the Association stronger and more responsive to the needs of the member clubs and their dancers. Basically, we feel that the clubs should participate more actively through their delegates this year. We expect to assign every delegate to some functional element of the Association's operations. We expect that each officer will have a committee to assist them in their activities. While the Executive Committee is responsible and has more-or-less "run the show" in the past, there are times when more hands are needed and also, more importantly, more ideas and club input is desirable. But by far the most important aspect of establishing wider committee activities is delegate involvement. We feel very strongly that the delegates should do more than just come to meetings and take notes. Judging from the results of the last Callers Festival and the response to the GRAND SQUARE Booster Drive in February, the feedback to the clubs by the delegates, on the whole, has been poor. We feel that as the delegates become more involved, they will better represent the Association at the various club dances. In turn, more club involvement strengthens the Association.

There are several areas where special committees should be beneficial: 1. Program under the leadership of the 1st Vice President. As we widen our activities into more dances, manpower and new ideas are mandatory.

2. Beginners classes chaired by the 2nd Vice President. There is a lot

of work involved in keeping this program going.

3. The constitution requires an administrative committee to review the constitution and by-laws. The Executive Committee has uncovered certain

problems which may need attention in this area.

4. Under the leadership of the 3rd Vice President greater activity could be considered, such as leadership clinics to counsel new club officers on the problems of running a successful square dance club, broader activities in publicity, and accumulating statistics and trends within the member clubs.

These are some of our thoughts as we assume the office of President. We hope to translate these thoughts into more concrete actions as the year begins.


Executive Board at planning session





In January '58, 6 couples became so concerned over the s/d need for a good promotional program, clearance conflicts beginners classes as well as summer dance opportunities that they drew up and instigated a plan of action. 





The Square Pincushion sewing feature this issue will be:

A PURSE....

Materials needed-1 1/2 yds. upholstery webbing 1/4 yd. fabric for lining 9" zipper thread and yarns small piece cardboard



Cut webbing into 2 pieces each 21 1/2" long and leave a piece 11" (this will be the bottom).

Embroider these 3 pieces as desired with yarn scraps. Daisies, cross-stitch, monograms, dance emblem, club name, are but a few to get you started.

Sew (by machine) the 2 long pieces together, side by side, to form a rectangle 21 1/2 by 8" wide. Cut lining piece same size. Join ends of each piece to form

a tube. Press seam open.

Cut 2 lining pieces same as ll" piece of webbing.

Machine sew small piece of webbing to

tubular piece, centering seam to be

center back, rounding the corners.

Sew zipper to upper edge of purse.

Pin lining to purse, wrong sides together. Blind-stitch all around upper edge. Baste lower edge in place within seam allowance.
Cut a small piece cardboard to fit bottomof purse.
Sew the 2 small lining pieces together to form a pocket. Insert the cardboard, turn ends in and slip-stitch closed.

Hand stitch the slip-covered cardboard section to the bottom of purse.


Turn to right side. Add a tassel to zipper pull and PRESTO.....

Variation- omit zipper and from an additional piece of webbing make a handle, lined of course.

or- make a tab with a button and loop closing in place of zipper.

or- add a handle of a chain from hardware store or one crocheted from yarn.


