from the desk of GEORGE & PHYLLIS COWAN, presidents NNJSDA

Last year, the key words discussed in this column were "participation" and "involvement". While not downgrading these words at all, we would like to place emphasis in a new direction this season...and the word is EDUCATION.

As many of you know, a New Officers Orientation Clinic was held last June. More than fifty dancers representing 15 clubs attended. A staff of thirteen local square dance leaders presented a variety of topics intended to acquaint new officers with some of the more important considerations in running a square dance club: subjects ranging from club finances and beginners class programs to special dances and how to treat your caller. While we personally feel this initial effort was a success, and comments we have received so far have been favorable, we have sent a questionnaire to all of the attendees to get their reactions and suggestions for future clinics or seminars of this type. We plan to publish the papers presented and distribute them to the clubs.

The dissemination of educational materials and sponsoring clinics are services which your association can provide to the clubs perhaps more efficiently than each club could do on its own. Once more, only through participation by all of the clubs, however, can future events continue to be successful.

Another area of emphasis this season will concern the retention of new dancers. For several years, our beginner class programs have been resounding successes. The clubs promote square dancing through Square Dance Week, hold introductory dances and demonstrations and put much time and effort into supporting the new classes. Yet the overall size of our association (i.e., number of dancers) has not increased substantially. What happens to these dancers? Do we lay too much stress on quantity rather than quality? Are our new dancer indoctrination programs a failure? Solutions to this perennial problem are needed. With the help of the clubs, we hope to investigate the reasons new graduates do not stay in square dancing. Perhaps such statistics will be revealing and sobering. We shall see.

Elsewhere in GRAND SQUARE are articles on the National Convention and our Patron program. Regarding the former: only 84 people from New Jersey attended this year. Phyllis and I were fortunate enough to be there and can only recommend the experience highly to all of you. Let's try to double the New Jersey turnout in Salt Lake City next June.

The Patron Program is perhaps our most misunderstood promotional activity. Please read the article carefully. Become a Patron and get involved.

A happy season of dancing to all of you.

How to become a NNJSDA PATRON



The purpose of the PATRON program is to foster greater cooperation and familiarity between the dancers and the various clubs of the Association through increased visitation. It is hoped that dancers undertaking this program will consider themselves ambassadors of good will and make a special effort to meet the officers and members of the clubs they visit. Becoming a PATRON is a special honor and should be approached with an attitude of spreading the gospel of all that is best in square dancing.

Although Section 12 of the NNJSDA By-Laws is quoted verbatim on the back of the Patron Record form, there has been considerable confusion over the last few months on what one must do to become a patron. To clarify this, the following is offered for your guidance:

- a. First of all, a prospective PATRON couple must be members in good standing of an Association club.
- b. They must visit 26 clubs of the Association (out of the 30 currently comprising the Association).
- c. They must visit these clubs on a scheduled dance night at which a regular caller is featured. The roster of clubs issued each fall as part of the September issue of GRAND SQUARE lists all the clubs, the nights they dance, and their regular caller or callers. Some clubs feature a special caller once a month. Such dates DO NOT count toward the PATRON Badge. Those clubs which feature all guest callers are, of course, exceptions to this rule. If the regular caller is not calling due to sickness or other unexpected reasons, the visit will be considered valid as long as the prospective patron couple had no reasonable way of knowing of the change in plans. Since clubs sometimes cancel dances or change locations for a particular dance due to conflicts with PTA's etc., the couple would be wise to call ahead and verify that the dance is being held as scheduled.
- d. The president or other official representative of the club should sign the Patron Record and print their name legibly together with the date of the dance and the name of the club. The caller's signature is not appropriate. Each club should establish a procedure for this to assure that the Patron Record is reasonably uniform. It is the responsibility of the visiting couple to assure that the Patron Record is properly filled in.
- e. There is no time limit for becoming a PATRON. While it is physically possible to visit all of the clubs in one season, becoming a PATRON is not a speed contest. Further, visiting these clubs all in one season would probably overly interfere with the couple's obligation to their own club or clubs. It is suggested that a Patron Record be completed over a period of two or three seasons.
- f. It is not recommended that recent graduates embark at once on a Patron Badge campaign. Many clubs dance at a level of competence beyond that a new dancer would find comfortable. It is suggested that a couple get a full year of club level experience before undertaking serious completion of the Patron Record.
- g. When completed, The Patron Record should be mailed or given to the NNJSDA President. The Patron Record will be reviewed by the Executive Committee at its next meeting and the couple will be officially advised by phone or mail of the acceptance of their application. The badges will normally be presented at the next Association dance with appropriate recognition in the GRAND SQUARE magazine.

A little over 14 years ago, square dancing in NNJ was at a low ebb. A group of six couples decided that if s/ding was to flourish, the area clubs must work together collectively. Eleven clubs shared their beliefs and sent delegates to a meeting where a good promotional program, clearance conflicts, beginners classes and summer dance opportunities were discussed and appropriate action undertaken. (These same goals are still uppermost in our minds today.) Then, as now, delegates had the responsibility of keeping their club informed. As a means of further communication between our widely scattered membership, GRAND SQUARE was created in March of '59 by Bob Keck. When business pressures caused him to resign 4 years later, Bill Geier assumed the Editorship. Two years later, because of business reasons, Bill turned the task over to Doc & Peg. Now 30 clubs strong and still growing, the Association can look back proudly on its accomplishments from sponsoring the Seventh (and last) Atlantic Convention ('61), securing the first official proclamations of S/D Week in NJ & NY, to publishing its own "Manual of Basic Western S/D Figures and providing other helpful aids for the promotion of square dancing. Last year over 674 graduates were listed in GRAND SQUARE. Another first was a successful new officers orientation clinic. Due to the increase of new responsibilities, the NNJSDA has found it necessary to have three vice presidents - one whose primary job is programming Association dances, a second who is in charge of beginner class activities and a third whose primary function is promotion, publicity and liason work to the public as well as members. It is interesting, officers in this couple activity were not listed that-away until '63...past presidents are Al Aderente, Bob Keck, Bud Sibbald, Bob Kellogg, Frank & Hazel Preston, Doc & Peg Tirrell, Gene & Grace Luca-rini, Jack & Carol DeCoste, Ray & Pam Zeliff and Lyle & Edna Hopper.



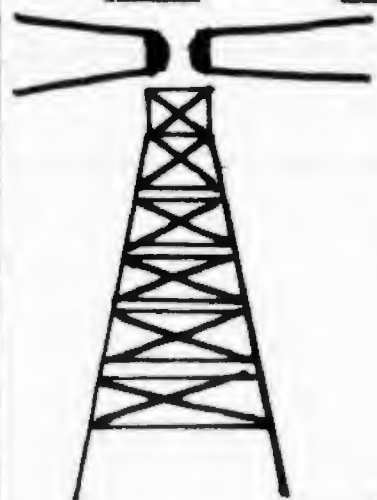

Let's make a shawl.....

Shawls are very much in fashion and quite simple to make.

Materials needed: 1 1/2 yards
lightweight wool fabric
Knitting worsted weight
wool yarn for fringe
Crewel yarns for embroidery



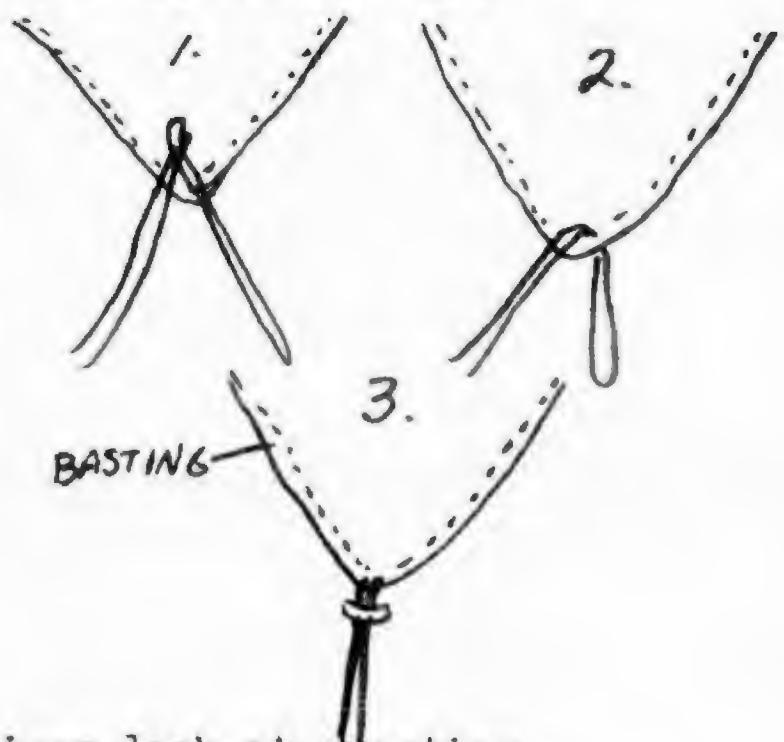
Be sure fabric is cut square- test by folding in half on the diagonal, fabric edges should all meet.

Scatter designs of flowers, mushrooms or whatever on one half, using colored tailor's chalk.

Embroider designs using crewel yarns in any of favorite crewel stitches. Embroider through single layer of fabric only.



When embroidery is complete, fold in half, diagonally, wrong sides together. Baste along cut edges. Using a steel crochet hook and knitting yarn strands cut in 12" lengths, add fringes along both open edges. Work with 1 or 2 strands as desired, start by inserting hook on back portion of shawl, hook yarn, pull loop through, then put ends through loop and pull tight, Continue working till entire edges are encased in fringe. Do not do the fold edge. Press lightly with steam iron and press cloth.



Tips: For ideas for embroidery designs look at greeting cards, gift wraps, children's books, almost any design that is not too intricate can be used.

Use your library's books on crewel for illustrations and easy directions on how to do the different stitches.

Background fabric in neutral shades (white, eggshell, beige or black) goes with most costumes and will show most color arrangements to best advantage. Fringe can match or contrast as desired.

Use coasters, glasses, coins etc, to trace around for a circular design, then fill in freehand with stitches. Then wear with pride.

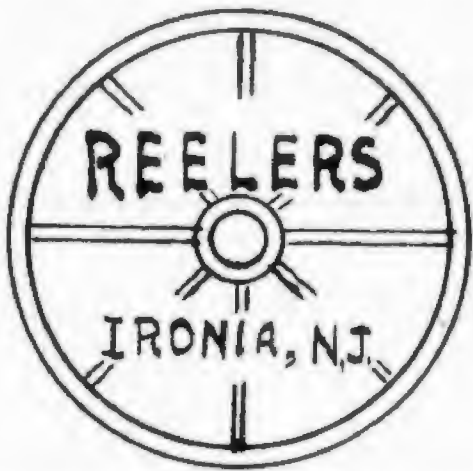

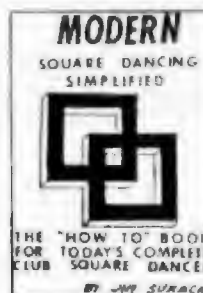

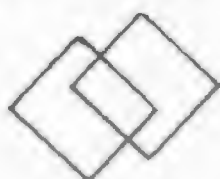
