NNJSDA From the desk of GEORGE & PHYLLIS COWAN presidents

Each Spring, the 30 clubs of the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association (NNJSDA) graduate between 250 and 300 couples from their square dance classes and bring them into their regular club dance program. We wish to welcome each couple listed in this issue of GRAND SQUARE, on behalf of the Association and its more than 3000 dancers.

The Association is a confederation of clubs in an area ranging from Rockland County, New York to Princeton, and from Warren County on the west to Staten Island and Asbury Park on the east. It was formed to provide certain services and coordinating functions on an area basis. It operates with an annual budget of over \$4,000. Delegates, representing each club, meet three times a year to consider matters of general interest to all dancers in the area. The delegates elect officers to conduct the detailed affairs of the Association under the Constitution, By-Laws and other rules and policies which they legislate. The elected officers, together with the Immediate Past President and advisors appointed by the President, comprise the Executive Committee. The NNJSDA is incorporated as a non-profit organization under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

The Association conducts the following major activities: Special Dances - There is a program of special dances, two or three per year, held centrally and featuring nationally known callers. There is also a summer dance program held on eight Wednesdays in June, July, and August when most clubs are inactive. This latter program is of special interest to new graduates since it provides them with an opportunity to retain their recently acquired skill in preparation for the Fall dance season. To further this objective, the Association has a "Freeloader" program, offering a badge and free entry to all Association sponsored dances in the following season to new graduates attending all eight summer dances.

NEW DANCER PROGRAM - The Association, as you are aware, supports the new dancer program by providing the clubs with diplomas, 100% attendance badges, temporary badges for use in class, and the Manual of Basic Western Square Dance Figures. Every effort is made to assure that each class is visited by a representative of the Executive Committee during the year and at graduation time. The Graduates Ball, a special dance for new graduates, is held every Spring. This year the Ball will be at West Essex High School, Caldwell on Sunday afternoon, April 29th. PUBLICITY - The Association sponsors special publicity programs to help the clubs in promoting square dancing, especially during Square Dance Week in September. For the past several years the Association has applied for and been granted Proclamations for Square Dance Week from the Governors of New Jersey and New York. A counselling service is also provided to clubs needing assistance in their operations or requiring help in solving special problems. A Patron program has been established to give special recognition to those couples who have visited at least 26 of the 30 clubs. CLEARANCE - A Clearance procedure exists to provide for avoiding conflicts among clubs in scheduling their dance programs. GRAND SQUARE - The GRAND SQUARE Magazine is published, and provided free of charge, to all member club dancers five times per year. This magazine provides many special features ranging from club news and special dance information to club rosters, maps, round dance choreography, etc. As you can see, this issue features the names of all the new graduates. This magazine is supported from advertisements, interarea subscriptions, an annual voluntary fund drive and, if necessary, proceeds from Association dances. The Editor is appointed by the President.

<u>EDUCATION</u> - Special education programs have been instituted in the past year. Last June we held our first New Officer Seminar and another is scheduled for this coming June. Organization of a class for new callers is now being planned. Materials providing other useful information are distributed from time to time.

<u>ROUND DANCING</u> - The Association also supports the activities of the Round Dance Leaders Council and disseminates, through the magazine, information on the area round dance activity. One of the advisors to the President provides liaison to the Council.

All of these activities, and many more besides, become available to you as you become part of the organization through your club membership. Support your clubs and keep them strong! Strong clubs lead directly to a healthy and active Association which in turn means more services available to you and all the area dancers.



nominating committee composed of Dietlers (Somerset Hills), McKays (Grand Prowlers) and Blaines, Chairman (Staten Square Set).....







"Did Your Square Break Down?"

Do most of the squares you're in break down? Was it you? This can only be answered by an honest evaluation of your own knowledge and apptitude of square dancing. Ask yourself these questions.

- 1. Do you find that whenever you are in a square it is constantly breaking down?
- 2. Are you always being pulled through?
- 3. Do you more than frequently find yourself saying "I don't know that call" or making the excuse "I didn't hear what he said".
- 4. Do you find that at the end of a dance, you feel like you have worked hard all evening, instead of having an evening of enjoyment?
- 5. Do the other members of your square look as though they are sincerely glad to see you join them, ot do they have a passive look about them?
- 6. Do you find your square almost always the last to be filled?
- 7. And last, but not least, do you ever feel completely avoided as you try to square up?

If you have answered yes to most of these questions, there is something you can do about it.

- 1. Know your level of dancing.
- 2. Know the level of the club or clubs you are attending or wish to attend.
- 3. Do not attend a club that is above your own ability.
- 4. Increase your ability by: (a) attending workshops (many callers have them; and (b) dancing more frequently.

In this area there are many levels of dancing, ie, Easy, Low Intermediate, Intermediate, High Intermediate, Advanced and Challenge. Know your level. Progress from each level to the next gradually, it saves wear and tear on you and your fellow square dancers.

Enjoyment and fellowship are the main ingredients of square dancing, don't hurt yourself or others by dancing out of your league.



Patience, understanding, a helping hand are never more important than now - here is your club's new blood - perhaps new officer material - we urge all to treat them accordingly....



"....As another square dance class starts the downhill stretch, I am prompted to share an experience with other clubs. The shortage of good instructors is becoming more critical and often the shortage of class members is also a problem. I hear clubs telling about not be-

ing able to have a class because of one of these reasons.

Last year ('71-'72), because of Bob's tight schedule, we requested our two neighbor clubs, Y SQUARES and DANCING SQUARES to try a combined class. We had many trepidations - the clubs had been very friendly, would we ruin it by causing problems? Would they fight over the new dancers, over being angels, about graduation night, or something we never even thought about? But we knew the type of members in both clubs. We may not have the market cornered on great people, but we sure have our fair share.

Each club appointed a couple in charge. Bob and I acted as liason to make sure that both had the same information, opportunities, decision making powers. etc. Both clubs went about getting class members in their usual way - only difference, they both advertised the same class. Both clubs had representatives at the first class to welcome new dancers and help with registration duties. They went on an alternating schedule for angels (also would be a help to small clubs with a shortage of angels).

As Christmas time came, both clubs presented invitations (on the same night) to class members for their particular Christmas party. Some could only make one, others came to both...extra experience in being part of a "club". As graduation came near, it was decided to use the class hall on their regular night for a joint party. Two clubs divided up refreshment duties. Both donated toward corsages and all club members were urged to attend. Attend, they did - about twelve squares worth. It was a special night with all attention riveted on the graduates. Bob and I distributed the diplomas, an Association representative the perfect attendance pins and both clubs were represented in a receiving line. Not only did they congratulate the dancers, they both handed out invitations to join their respective clubs. Many people told us it was one of the best graduations they ever attended.

Within a couple weeks, all graduates had affiliated with one club (a few in both) and all felt they had a second "home" if personal situations caused a change in dance night plans.

That was last year's story. This year is going along just as well (with a larger class). Our situation may be a little unusual as the clubs shared a common caller. But with some modification, and knowing how great dancers in general are, I feel this experiment could well be tried in other neighboring areas that may have a problem. Even if your club has no problems, what about your neighbor? Could you help him? One thing I have learned in my years of dancing - no matter how closely you try to "guard" your dancers, they will eventually dance at the club that fits them best (if no choices available, they may drop altogether). What our real purpose should be is spreading the square dance "gospel" to new people everywhere. The more dancers we have, and keep, the healthier all clubs will be!"

Nita's Favorite Petticoat Bag

Cut two skirt gores that measure about 27" at the bottom. Sew these together. Make a casing at the bottom and a casing at the top. Insert cord. This is a simple but satisfactory bag for a single petticoat. For a bag to hold more than one slip, use more gores. Another suggestion: use scraps to make these bags. Sew the scraps together for a patchwork effect and then cut the gores. These make a very cheap and a very useful gift for friends.

If you do not have a suitable pattern for a gore, drop me a note and enclose a self-addressed, stamped #10 envelope and I'll be glad to send it to you.

These bags make for neat compact storage and are excellent for traveling.


A mini-bag made of two gores about 12" wide at the bottom and about 14" in length makes a beautiful bag for carrying dancing slippers. Good for winter when you wear boots to the dance and must carry shoes, or for traveling--takes up much less space than boxes.
