with Art & Betsy Seele calling as well as moderating several panels. Jerry Schatzer was there on a "bus man's holiday". The Bonnetts, Buccos, Cavanaughs, Haags, Jamisons, Jensens, La Vines, Lunas, Norwids, & the Szabocsiks were among the NNJSDA members who attended. Our exhibit was set up by the Jensens and drew favorable comments..... It appeared to be one of the better conventions...housed within the new Salt Palace....as

usual, the city police were pleasantly surprised by the well-behaved delegates ... all levels of R/D & S/D were available, as well as many panels contra dancing drew a considerable number of participants..... at the fashion show one of the big hits was the modeling of womens styles by men of various figures and sizes....the 1977 convention was awarded to Atlantic City and is under the sponsor-

ship of the Delaware Valley Association. In view of the NJ location, some assistance from NNJSDA may be requested by Delaware Valley for the convention."





A little over 15 years ago, square dancing in NNJ was at a low ebb. Six couples decided that if s/ding was to survive, the area clubs must work together collectively. 11 clubs shared their beliefs and sent delegates to a meeting where a good promotional program, clearance conflicts, beginners classes and summer dancing opportunities were discussed and appropriate action initiated. (These same goals are still uppermost in our minds today.) Then, as now, delegates had the responsibility of keeping their clubs informed. As a means of further communication between the widely scattered membership, GRAND SQUARE was created in

March of '59 by Bob Keck. He was succeeded by Bill Geier. When business pressures caused him to resign, Bill turned the task over to Doc & Peg Tirrell. Now 30 clubs strong and still growing, the Association can look back proudly on its accomplishments from sponsoring the 7th (and last) Atlantic Convention ('61), securing the first official proclamations of S/D week in NJ & NY, publishing its own basic manual of s/d figures and providing other helpful aids for the promotion of square dancing, providing the impetus for a new caller's class and setting up a seminar for new officers. Last year over 700 graduated from area classes. There are 3 vice presidents - one whose primary job is programming Association dances, a second who is in charge of beginner class activities and a third whose primary function is promotion, publicity and liason work to the public as well as members. It is interesting, officers in this couple activity were not listed thataway until '63 - past presidents are Al Aderente, Bob Keck, Bud Sibbald, Bob Kellogg, Frank & Hazel Preston, Doc & Peg Tirrell, Gene & Grace Lucarini, Jack & Carol DeCoste, Ray & Pam Zeliff, Lyle & Edna Hopper and George & Phyllis Cowan.

NNJSDA liason to NNJ Round Dance Leaders Council - Art & Lucille Kelman

Under Association sponsorship the NNJRDLC was formulated in 1965 to help straighten out and consolidate a rather confused round dance picture. With membership open to all interested area r/d leaders, this council meets bi-monthly to exchange information, plan special events, & select the rounds-of-the-month (ROMs) for use September thru May. With the leaders including a majority of the selections in their programs, a dancer is assured of knowing most of the dances played at any NNJSDA club.

The official publication of NNJSDA is distributed free to all members thru their club delegates.

Circle Skirt

We must first make 2 newspaper patterns. Measure down from point 'A' for waist measuresee chart. Mark down required inches for length plus 1" for hem. On line 'A' set edge of tape measure and measure evenly several places. Connect marks and cut out along hem line.

Before cutting waist edge, back up 1/2" for seam allowance make a second row of markings and cut on that line. Repeat for second pattern.

Use fabric with small pattern or design or none at all. this eliminates matching large designs. Using 45 fabric this skirt will have a seam either side and down the back. For a skirt with no back seam more fabric must be purchased to allow two folds. The extra fabric can then be used for bodice, sleeves and tie for "him".

Sew right side seam and back seam. Sew left seam leaving opening for zipper. Insert zipper. Measure waist band piece, allow for seam. Sew band ends, turn and stretch waist of skirt to fit waistband. Add hook and eye closing and belting on inside of band to pre-KFOLD

vent slipping of blouse. Sew hem. Trim of all kinds may be added, including a flounce if made too short either by accident or on purpose.

WAIST MEASURE CHART 22" waist measure 3" from 'A' 3 1/2" 24" 26" 4 10 28" 30"




A skirt 24" length finished, 26" waist takes about 2 1/2 yards 45" fabric. It is best to lay it out on an old sheet and measure beforehand. Any questions, just ask, your SQUARE PINCUSHION
