There's no time limit to earn this coveted badge, and tho it does require a bit of effort & scheduling, it is fun, & especially so when you share the travelling with another couple - but be sure it's a regular Club dance (not a Special) on their scheduled night with their regular caller.

Your Executive Board meets 7 times a year (3 of these meetings are with your Club Delegates) to handle affairs concerning all phases of s/ding in our area. If you are interested in knowing more about the workings of the NNJSDA as a nonvoting observer, the door is always open at our Delegates' meetings & the dates are printed in the Fall Issue of the Grand Square.

The Callerlab Experimental Workshop Committee has made the following selections for the coming quarter: Transfer the column and Half tag trade and roll. The quarter has been adjusted to coincide with the calendar year and the present

selections will be for the April, May and June quarter. The committee feels that these selected workshop figures are the best of the experimental ideas explored over the past several months. By no means should a caller feel obligated to teach any experimental basics even those selected by Callerlab if the selected figures do not fit into your club level. For instance, it would be foolish to attempt to teach transfer the column to a group of new dancers who just formed a club after graduating from 30 weeks of lessons. The selected workshop figures are aimed at the mainstream dance program that finds itself overwhelmed with experimental figures and just plain tired of having every dance turn into a workshop.

Our aims and goals are to help the mainstream caller and dance leader in the selection of worthwhile experimental figures as we recognize that they are part of the square dance picture. By selecting only a few figures each quarter (no more than two), the average dancer will get a steady flow of good workshop ideas but not be snowed under.



By very popular demand, The SQUARE PINCUSHION repeats how to make a crinoline



Crinolines are not the easiest of projects to sew. They are a bit more challenging inasmuch as the fabric you work with is stiff and resistant to you. The end result is definitely worth the time and effort you extend. Do try it. If you find yourself getting frustrated, walk away from it for awhile. Going back to it will be easier.

Materials:

85 yards pre-hemmed nylon marquisette 5" wide.(available from Nita Smith Fashions, 2011 College Avenue, Bryan, Texas 77801-note new address...write for color sample and current price-last price was 11¢ a yd. plus \$1.00 additional for postage & handling.) about 3/4 yard soft material for yoke(broadcloth, etc.) matching thread heavy-duty elastic for waist casing

heavy-duty elastic for waist casing 48 yds. hemming lace or ribbon (optional)

Directions: Cut marquisette into following lengths: one each- 48 yds.; 24 yds.; & 12 yds. that should leave 1 remaining yard for practice to adjust your ruffler to gathering 2 to 1;1.e., 12" unruffled will be 6" gathered properly. Practice till you achieve this.

If you are adding the optional lace or ribbon, sew this to one edge of 48 yd. piece first. This will be the hem. Leave all tier ends unjoined, they will be sewn at the end in one seam.

Gather the other edge of the 48 yd. strip. Sew the gathered edge to one edge of 24 yd. strip. Gather the other edge of 24 yd. strip. Sew this to one edge of 12 yd. strip. NOTE: If you sew the gathered edges top-stitched

to the flat side of the tier above,
it will be less scratchy when wearing.
Before you gather top of 12 yd. piece,
we must measure for the yoke. Measure
from top of 12 yd. piece to lace hem edge
remember your petticoat is 1" shorter
then

than your dresses. Subtract this from your desired length. Add 2" for seams & casing- cut 2 crosswise strips of 36" wide soft fabric-join to make 1 long strip. (ex. if slip desired is 24" & marquisette total is 14" then 10" plus 2" makes 12" strips to cut) Sew 2 rows gathering stitch to edge of 12 yd. pc. Pull tightly to fit 72" soft strip. Top- stitch in place. Now sew entire back seam. Make a casing at top, leaving small opening to insert elastic.

Insert elastic, checkin fit before making secure. Heavy-duty elastic is a must, the other stretches out of shape too soon.... Good luck... Any questions, call me

IT'S YOUR ASSOCIATION



There is a tendency for many of us to feel that organizations to which we may belong, will run themselves very well without our participation in them. This may be so where the purpose of the organization is just fund raising, done by professionals. Not so the Northern New Jersey

Square Dancers Association. It's purpose is to promote square dancing to our dancers, and prospective dancers, and promote cooperation between its

member clubs.

WHO MAKES UP THIS ASSOCIATION? You, and the clubs to which you belong. Delegates from each member club meet three times a year to review the actions of the Executive Committee, determine policy for the Ass'n., relay requests of their clubs, and report back to you and the club Executive Boards what is happening in the NNJSDA. These meetings are always open to anyone interested in attending.

WHAT DOES THE ASSOCIATION ACTUALLY DO? There are several committees

within the association structure which perform the actual work.

1. Classes are coordinated (not interfered with)

a. Printed matter is made available promoting and explaining what square dancing is, to the non-dancer.

b. Square dance basic manuals are printed and distributed to classes

c. Diplomas and other supplies are made available for classes.

2. Clear dates of special dances and mediate any other conflicts which may develop between clubs.

3. Develop means of publicity to the non-square dancing public.


4. Publicize club activities via an association magazine (Grand Square).

5. Finance the printing and administration of the above activities. Let's dwell a bit on the last. There are many ways your association could raise its funds to pay for its functions. It could assess the clubs a share of each project. It doesn't (Dues are \$5/year). It could let the clubs do all the work - only act as advisory. (If it did this, why have an ass'n). It could charge for each issue of GRAND SQUARE or make it a magazine of advertisements rather than information; this is not its purpose.

What is does do is run dances throughout the year, giving the dancer something while raising funds. The profits of these dances are what keep the association solvent. The major series of dances are the Summer Dances. Their purpose os two fold - helping the treasury, and keeping the new graduates dancing over the summer. Your attendance is necessary to ensure sufficient monies for the coming year. The NNJSDA also reserves 5th Fridays and/or Saturdays thruout the year for its Special Dances. These also are to produce funds, as well as to have interclub dances. Again your attendance is necessary to make them successful.

WHAT CAN YOU DO? Soon the summer dance program will be starting. you feel that the program is not for you; consider again. It is not just another dance. It is a dance with a purpose, the purpose of promoting the growth of square dancing in Northern New Jersey. Supporting the association dances are easy ways for you to help. Doc Tirrell
