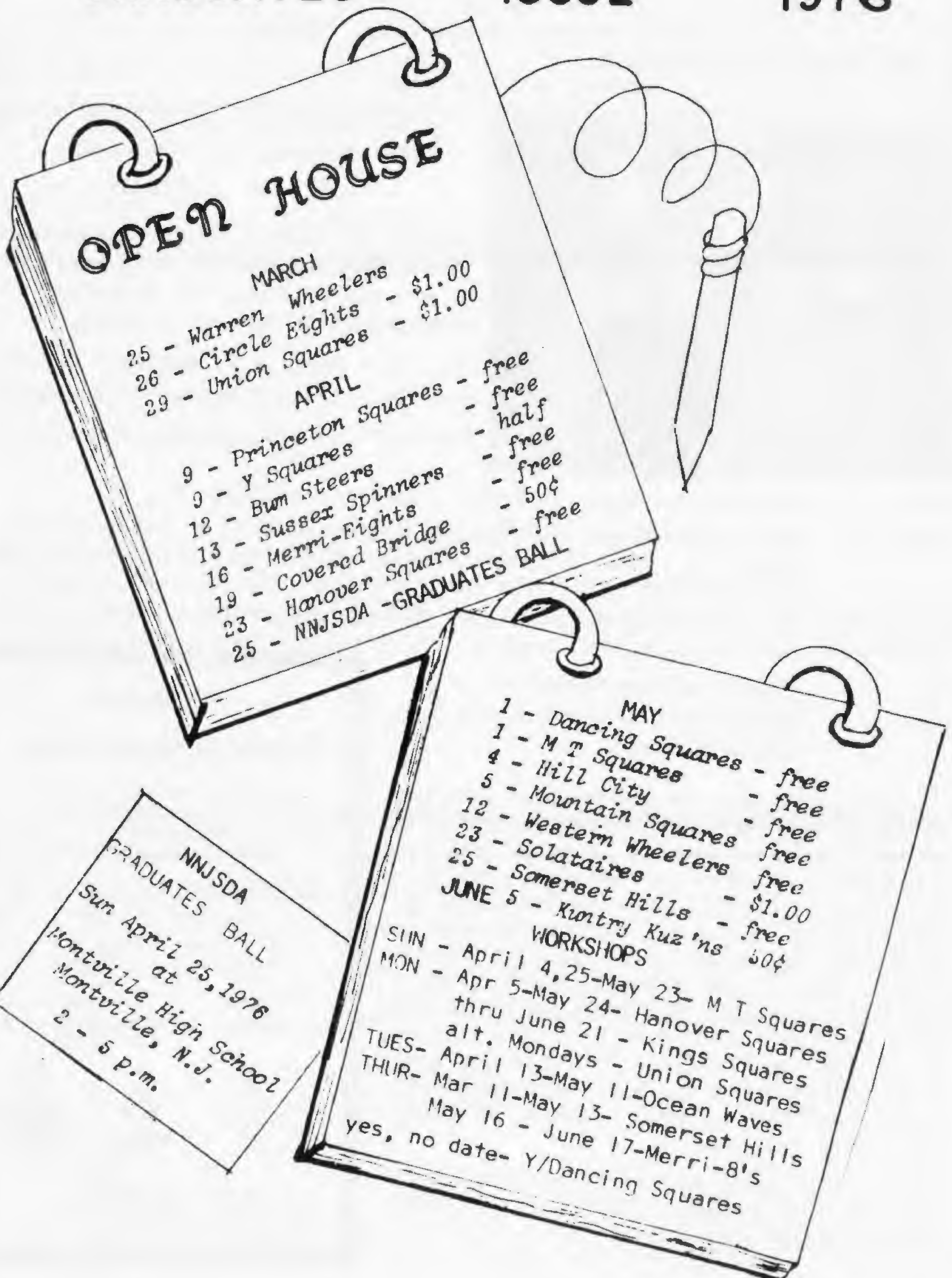

WELCOME GRADUATES! Such a simple greeting but in it is a wealth of significance to the square dance movement.

At this point in the square dance season the entire country welcomes the many thousands of new dancers into a wonderful pasttime that has no parallel. The warmth and friendship that is square dancing is unmatched by any other hobby, any sport and any activity of which we are aware.

Your Association, the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association, is exceedingly pleased to welcome you as members of a fraternity that is dedicated to friendliness and good will. You may join a square, anywhere in this wide world, as a stranger, and a fraction of an hour later emerge with a strong bond to seven others that is characteristic of square dancing -- a unique phenomenon.

The caller and the class angels have carefully guided you through some difficult moments in the more than twenty sessions during which the basic steps were mastered. This point in your square dance career is similar to having learned the alphabet on the road to reading. From here on in it will be a matter of applying oneself and, above all, retaining one's cool. Remember -- keep your eye on the donut and not on the hole.

Most square dancers are essentially a thoughtful, considerate and affectionate group of individuals. (Kissing is a big thing among dancers, you'll soon discover.) They will now provide moral support during the ensuing months of your integrating into the S/D society. They will help you to gain the experience and the self confidence necessary to thoroughly enjoy square dancing.

But, you must participate in the maturing process by dedicating the time and the commitment to make it possible. During the next few months you should dance often -- at least once a week, or more. It is most advisable to visit other clubs, many other clubs --- to attune yourself to the variety of styles and to acquire the necessary practice. You'll love the exposure.

The club is the keystone of the square dance movement. After all, it was a club that sponsored your class and it is a club that provides the will and the zeal to run the many classes. So, be sure to belong to a club --- support it, work for it and give it your allegiance.



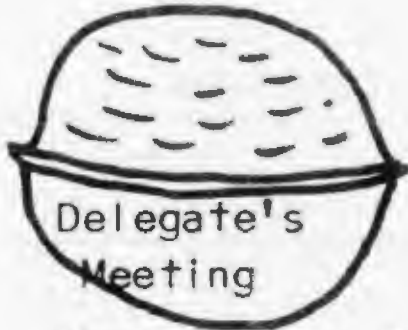

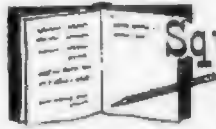

It's hard to remember what the weather was like last October 22nd unless you were one of the more than 100 workers for the '77 Convention who rearranged business & personal schedules on a midweek Wednesday to take advantage of the personally-conducted tour of the Atlantic City Convention Hall, & then you'd remember it was a warm, sunny, Indian Summer day with on-shore breezes that added to the excitement that comes with being in the famous Convention City of the World.

To say the facilities are great is an understatement - they are fantastic! There is over half a million square feet of space which gives a couple of hundred exhibitors, hundreds & hundreds of S/R & Folk dance leaders, & upwards of 20,000 dancers of all ages a chance to enjoy 3 days & nights of varied programs under one completely airconditioned roof.

The tour was 3-hours of walking & viewing various sized rooms in both the original main auditorium (where the pageants are held) & the new addition which is located on the same level & is easily divided into acoustically soundproof rooms which will afford dancing, relaxing, eating, shopping & learning seminars to whet everyone's appetite from 9 in the morning 'til 11 @ night!

There will be 45 solid hours of dancing in 10 spacious rooms; 6 for squares of club level, mainstream, hothash, & challenge; 2 exclusively for rounds & 2 for contra & Folk dancing. The smallest of these rooms will hold about 75 squares & in the main arena 250 squares can comfortably dance together. Teens will have the pageant stage which holds 150 squares & they will also have their own relaxation/refreshment rooms. Eighty hours will be devoted to seminars, clinics on sewing, calling/teaching techniques, roundtable discussion and rap sessions.

Plans are underway for beach parties, a clambake, sightseeing tours, a half day ocean fishing trip & shopping sprees. Every night there will be a "special" in the main arena prior to the open dance during which the Governors from NJ, PA, & DEL will be guests, exhibition dance groups will perform, & of course the Grand March on Saturday Night is a sight you will long remember.'

The last Convention East of the Mississippi was in Philadelphia in 1967 & had a total attendance of 9729 dancers, & since the total s/d picture has grown since then & one never knows where we will be when and if this opportunity of a lifetime comes this way again, we encourage you NOW to plan to be part of this phenomenon, & we offer you a chance to register for the dancing & latch on to priority housing at the same time.

We have preregistration certificates on hand @ \$6.75/person which pays for the 3 days dancing, & can be used to formally register with the Housing Chairmen on or before this May 8th. Seven thousand rooms and two thousand campsites have personally been inspected by the committee, & all are within a 15 minute walk or 5-25 minute ride of the Convention Center. Applications will be available shortly & the earlier you complete the form & send it together with the preregistration certificate, the better assurance you will have of nearby motel/hotel/camping reservations. Every person who enters the Convention Hall MUST be registered whether they dance or not. Special visitor registrations will be available on a daily basis, but families bringing nondancing children must still register @ \$6.75/. 9

It was founded in 1958 as a service organization. It is composed of 33 clubs. You, as a member of a member club, are a member of the NNJSDA.

The three Sunday afternoon NNJSDA delegate meetings are open to all members. Much time is put into these meetings by the club delegates and association officers to see that our activity runs as smoothly as possible. Member club representation averages about 90%. The officers meet a minimum of four other Sundays each year to carry out the directives of the Constitution & the delegates. There is no remuneration for anyone.

To fund these services, the NNJSDA relies not on dues, but on your attendance at NNJSDA Special and SUMMER DANCES. The summer dances are also to help provide you with dancing experience following graduation.

Dance as much as you can this summer-especially your club dances and the association dances. Become active in bettering your club by giving of your time when asked. The fun of the square dance activity is not just the dancing, but more important is the sociability of meeting and making new friends. HAPPY DANCING.

A SQUARE DANCE FLOAT in the Tournament of Roses Parade - "MISSION IMPOSSIBLE" - yet, thanks to thousands of dedicated dancers all over, this mission was accomplished successfully. The idea came from Charles Naddeo & John Fogg aided by 3 committee members. Transferring the design to the drawing board was Rene Tobaldo of C.E. Bent & Co, float designers and builders. Then came detailed plans, including the chassis to carry the load, the engines, animation plans.....the various parts were constructed. The figures which started as a base of wire mesh were covered with paper mache to establish shapes and features and then painted as a guide for the flowers, etc. which would be applied later. After much research, the nine lovely floralgraphs atop the float were created.

The day after Christmas the assembled structures were painted as a decorating guide and than a base of Christmas trees was laid. This was covered with ferns, roses and camelias. Mums were used on the structures & floor. It staggers the imagination, but volunteers very gently & patiently separated every flower from the stem and just as tenderly the flowers, petals, etc were glued to the proper places. Flowers (35,000 roses, 2,000 orchids, etc) needing water were treated differently. Folks not involved in the actual decorating were busy being gofers and keeping supplies handy, coffee pots, sandwich trays and glue pots filled. When the call went out for help, the response was most gratifying with about 670 helping - half of which were teens. Many were there every day working 8 or more hours. By 3 AM, January 1st the last flower was ceremoniously placed. At 5 AM the four riders (Ken & Audrey Parker, Chr. of the 25th Convention and two

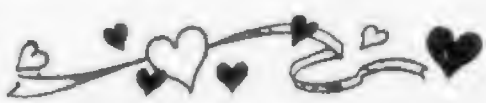


teens selected by votes received for each dollar contributed in their names were at the assembly area where the judging took place. (temperature was 32°F) The rest is history with the S/D

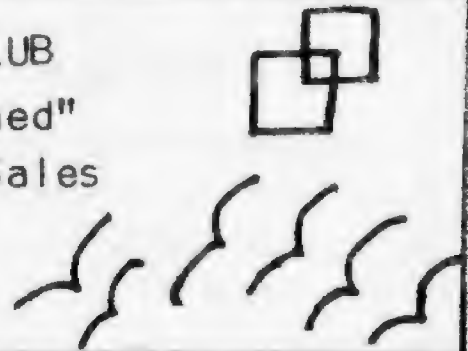
Float being seen on TV all over the world!

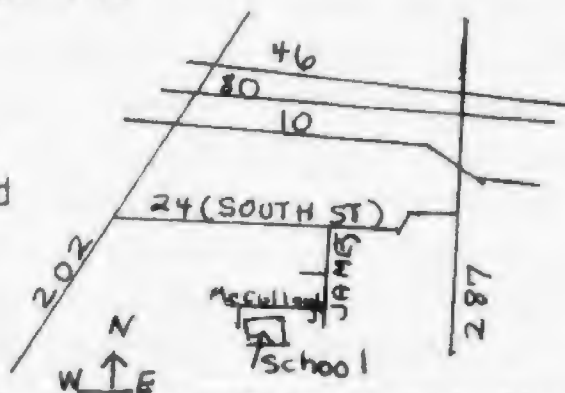

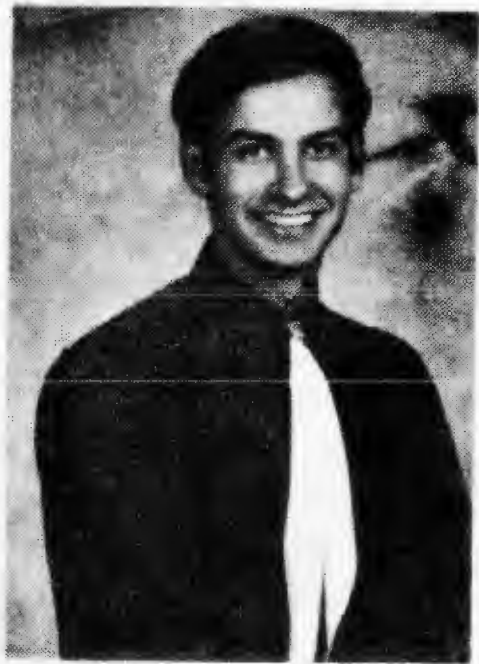

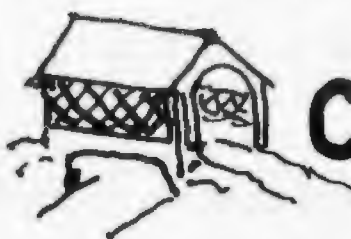

In ye present editors files there is a thick, well worn manilla folder entitled, "Schedule for publishing GRAND SQUARE" by William J. Geier 1963 1964. Although our format and size have changed since then, the basic idea has not. Bill's helpful hints are as valid now as then - the same pitfalls still lie awaiting.

Merri-Eights was never the same after Bill & Kay Geier began square dancing there in 1959. Club secretaries for many years, editors of their marvelous newsletter; folks could always spot the inimitable Geier touch on a flyer, announcement or whatever flowed from Bill's imaginative and talented hands. SETS IN ORDER even devoted an article to his "unique touch." Association delegates for two years, Bill & Kay were elected Secretaries 1962-63 and then succeeded Bob Keck as GRAND SQUARE editor in the fall of '63. Within a year the pressures of business (Bill worked with Boy Scouts most of his lifetime) made it almost impossible for Bill to continue. 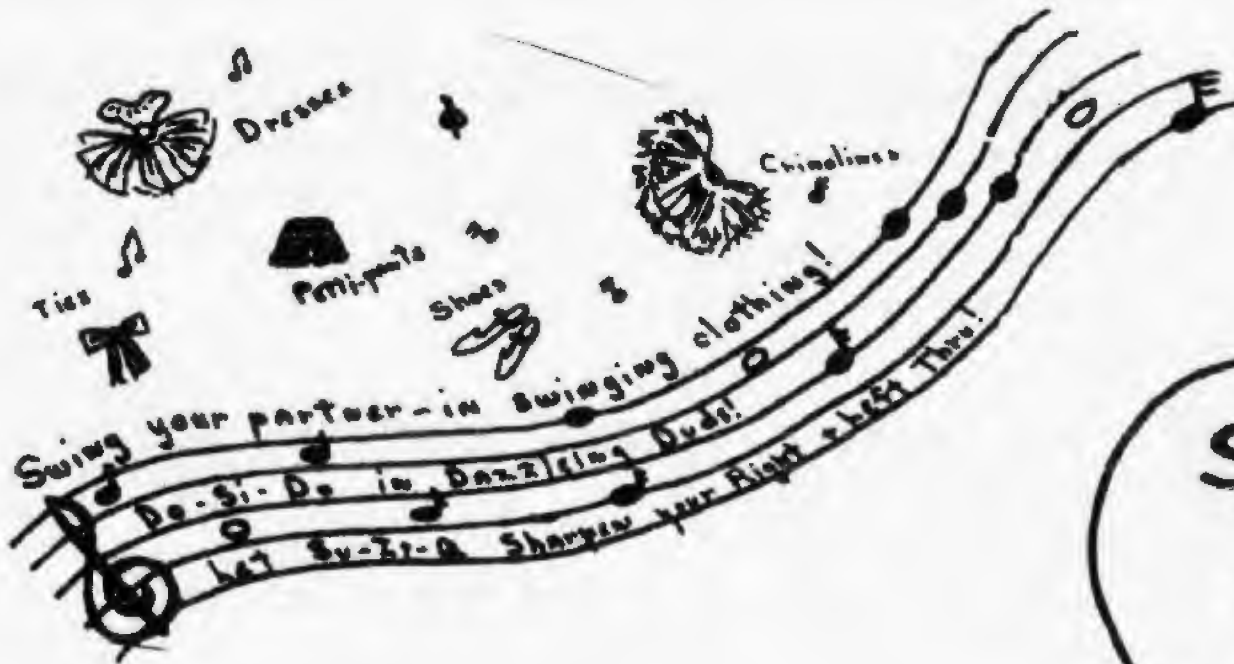
