



GRADUATES!!! Your NNJSDA welcomes you to the Square Dance World. NNJSDA? What is this NNJSDA you keep reading/hearing about? Let us take a few minutes and explain just what IS this Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association. (NNJSDA)

Founded in 1958 as a service organization, the NNJSDA is currently composed of 35 clubs with several membership applications pending. All dancers of member clubs are considered members of the NNJSDA.

The purpose of your Association is to promote square dancing in our geographical area. Briefly-this is done by providing publicity about s/ding and posters and leaflets promoting classes; basic booklets; diplomas; perfect attendance pins; packets of information for graduates; a FREE LOADER dance program for new graduates; PATRON awards to encourage interclub visitation; GRAND SQUARE; leadership seminars; and delegate meetings which are a forum for interclub communication.

The three Sunday afternoon NNJSDA Delegate meetings are open to all. Much time is put into these meetings by the club delegates and Association officers to see that our activity runs as smoothly as possible. Member club representation averages about 90%. The officers meet a minimum of four other Sundays to carry out the directives of the Constitution and the delegates. No one ever receives any remuneration. In your graduation packet was a copy of your Association Constitution and By-Laws.

Club dues are minimal with the NNJSDA relying on income from its special dances and summer dance program to balance the budget.



Have you noticed this badge? It is a red New Jersey with the top part black (signifying northern New Jersey). The wearer is serving the NNJSDA as either a delegate or officer...the cross bar tells in what capacity the dancer is currently serving.




4th Friday







Many local callers belong-identified by their large yellow badge. Executive Secretary is John Kaltenthaler.

CENTRAL REGISTRY OF WORLD DANCERS - (CROWD) - Provides free directory listings here and abroad of square dances and related activities. (P.45)

ROUNDALAB - Newly formed international association of Round Dance Teachers. Tirrells are on Executive Board.

UNIVERSAL ROUND DANCE COUNCIL - Outgrowth of last years first annual R/D Convention in Kansas City. Several NNJ couples are members.

LLOYD SHAW FOUNDATION - Provides school guidance programs and excellent leadership training sessions as well as maintaining an archives center.

SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA - Main purpose is to raise funds, design, & build a S/D float for annual Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, Calif.

NATIONAL FOLK DANCE COMMITTEE - Is working to have Square Dancing officially declared the National Folk Dance of United States.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SQUARE & ROUND DANCE SUPPLIERS; BACHELORS AND BACHELORETTES INTERNATIONAL - their name tells their interest



enough dancing, but everyone seems to have caught up now.



- 1. Perfect attendance pin. It is awarded at graduation time to graduates with perfect class attendance. Class administrators keep the records.
- 2. Freeloader dangle may be earned by 1978 graduates who attend 8 of the 10 summer dances sponsored by the NNJSDA. Attendance is recorded on a special Freeloader Card, which is included in every graduation packet. Dangles will be awarded this year at the August 30th dance. Besides earning the dangle, the dancer is entitled to free admission to all Association dances for the ensuing year, except the Mini-Festival.
- 3. To become a PATRON, a dancer must dance at 26 NNJSDA clubs as stated in section 12 of By-laws on their regular scheduled night and dance to their regular caller (if they have one). Patron's cards were included in the graduation packet and are also available from any officer. There is no time limit. It is awarded at Association dances.
- 4. LUST stands for Let Us Speak Together the NNJSDA leadership seminar usually held in mid-September. This day long session is planned to help newly elected officers, and other interested dancers, better understand the working of a S/D club. An attempt is made to cover all aspects of the club picture with lots of discussion and question and answer time.
- 5. GRAND SQUARE BOOSTER TAG time is last half of January thru February. Any club/class member may become a booster by contributing \$1.00 (teens 50f) per tag which is worn to all dances during the six week period. Between advertising revenue and Booster Tag support GRAND SQUARE manages to operate in the black.

Our first hint comes from Elinor Gurgo from 'Dancing Squares' and her suggestion will save you money by recycling your convention dress, and most successfully



This was accomplished by removing all the red and white striped portions from your dress very carefully. Underneath will be blue just like the basic part of your dress. Add rows of wide embroidered banding and your dress will have an entirely new look.... The spaces could also be refilled with contrasting and/or complimentary prints or checks. If you plan to replace by using fabric, then extra care must be taken in removing your pieces so that they could serve as a pattern. The wide band on the skirt should be no problem, but be careful not to stretch the bodice insert, and be sure to follow the grain lines when cutting its replacement or it won't lay nice and flat. Banding would be easier and give a more delicate look. Maybe this will give you the start of some ideas of your own.......

and now a suggestion to save you time.

There are available some fabrics with calico or Far Eastern overtones in cottons and cotton blends, fabrics that are already smocked, or tiered, or with a deep flounce added. You purchase these by the inch (waistline measure plus seam allowance). Some have additional matching or co-ordinating yardage available. Some give sleeve lengths when you purchase your dress or skirt piece. These pieces require only the closing of the seam, adding straps, sleeves. or what have you depending on the outcome. This could possibly be added to a bodice you're ready to rediscover, add the skirt and new sleeves and WOW! another new look in not too much time. (and the scraps could make a matching tie or appliques for hubby's shirt so he'd be co-ordinated, too.)

Check your favorite fabric shops and pattern books for what's new?- you may be surprised.

After much discussion CALLERLAB has recommended a BASIC PROGRAM of calls for teaching square dancing. Divided into several groups, the program is progressive with classes moving from program to program as they increase in knowledge and proficiency - sort of like grammar school grade

CCNJ has adopted a similar program with slight variations in teaching sequence. Most classes cover the BASIC PROGRAM in the first half of their lessons. The last half is usually devoted to the EXTENDED BASIC PROGRAM and the MAINSTREAM PROGRAM. Workshops after graduation generally cover the EXPERIMENTALS (EXP).

What are the EXPERIMENTALS? CALLERLAB has a Quarterly Selection Committee whose main job is to sift thru new and old calls and recommend one or two as workshop material for MAINSTREAM dancers. Their selections are widely publicized and most callers for that particular three month period workshop this recommended material so that the dancer begins to react automatically to the call. Several times CALLERLAB has recommended no new movements, suggesting instead that callers chose material appropriate for their own groups for workshop. The Next quarterly experimental selection will be for April, May & June.

Where does your club fit in this picture? It has been STRONGLY suggested clubs read thru the listings, consult with their club caller (if they have one), and decide where in the program they fit. Then LIMIT the calls to this level. If your dance is advertised as MAINSTREAM, do not use calls from the Plus I, Plus II programs, etc. (Experimentals should be used during workshop.)

In addition many calls can and should be used from more than one position. Standard Position is taught first, with others added afterwards. The CALLERLAB ALL POSITION CONCEPT, which is an option for MAINSTREAM and MAIN STREAM PLUS dancing is considered automatic for ADVANCED LEVEL. This does not mean a dancer must be an All Position Dancer to begin learning the ADVANCED LEVEL program, but as the dancers progress within the Advanced Program they are expected to become comfortable with All Position Dancing.

The recommended list for the BASIC PROGRAM (calls 1-38); EXTENDED BASIC PROGRAM (calls 1-54); and MAINSTREAM PROGRAM (calls 1-68) was published in GRAND SQUARE Winter '77 and was mimeod and made available to all clubs by CCNJ. Recently CCNJ printed and distributed to all clubs definitions and descriptions of Callerlab's EXPERIMENRAL MOVEMENTS (EXP), MAINSTREAM PLUS I Basics, and MAINSTREAM PLUS 2 Basics.

For next fall's roster, and annually thereafter, clubs will be asked to publish the level of their club dances. This information will be listed in the NNJSDA Roster, as well as elsewhere in GRAND SQUARE for all dancers to know at what level to expect at that clubs' dances. It is suggested clubs include this information on their flyers. Just a reminder - this in not a one person decision - it is a club/caller decision which should be adhered to faithfully.


