The following seventeen members of C.C.N.J. attended the fifth CALLERLAB Convention at the Chase Park Plaza Hotel in St. Louis, Miss ouri on March 20, 21, and 22, 1978: Ron Bessette, Al Brundage, Bruce Busch, Mike Foley, Betsy \& Roy Gotta, Jim \& Doris Howatt, Dick \& Cookie Lighthipe, Wes Morris, Dick Pasvolsky, Jules Pozsar, Art \& Anida Seele, Bob Tarrant and Ralph Trout

The three day convention was a complete working convention with no dancing involved except for demonstration, where necessary.

The three major topics of Callerlab at this convention were:
(a) Instituting an extended basics program.
(b) Review of mainstream program.
(c) Review of mainstream plus program.

Also up for consideration is the method of joining Callerlab from invitation to application method. The change was defeated by the membership at large. Another question was - Should any figures on the plus one or plus two lists be put on the Callerlab experimental list?

The following changes were made in the Callerlab Experimental List Recycle - moved to Mainstream list; Crossfire moved to Plus 2 1ist; Follow Your Neighbor moved to Plus 2 1ist. Follow Your Neighbor and Spread was moved to Plus 2 list as Anything and Spread. It was suggested that Anything and Spread be used with the following calls - Follow Your Neighbor and Spread; Wheel and Deal and Spread; Ferris Wheel and Spread; and Star Thru and Spread.

A more complete report will follow when the members of CCNJ have had an opportunity to meet and digest the tapes they made of most of the sessions. (for more on Callerlab and its Programs, see pages 48 and 49)

this letter in the GRAND SQUARE - everyone reads it:
We have danced for five years in many places and have never heard of such an incident. Upon our recommendation, our class members attended this dance intending to hear many callers and have a good time. At the end of the dance, along with many others, one of our class members went to get her coat in the gym. Her coat was a BRAND NEW brownish-grey suede with white fur collar. In her pockets were her scraf and gloves. Her coat was not there! In its place was an identical coat -- but OLD and "worn". And in the pockets of this old coat were her gloves and scarf! This was not "taken by mistake".

I can't tell you how badly I felt upon having this incident related to me, when I had previously spoken to our class many times telling them how "great" square dancers are -- including honesty and kindness. Caring for others with real concern has been one of the qualities we have found in square dancers wherever we go. Being one of the 26,000 at the National Convention in Atlantic City, we left pocketbooks, cameras, sweaters and other belongings all over the halls -- nothing was ever touched.

We are ending a two-year term as President of Hanover and have nothing but praise for the dancers we work with, associate with, dance with, and have become friends with . . . I have given much thought to writing this letter and could not "leave office" without bringing this incident to some one's attention. With the cost of patterns ever increasing, the square dance sewer needs to get as much mileage from a pattern as possible.


Start by investing in a few basic patterns that will give the most versatility possible. Example: the classic basic with back zipper, darts at the bust and at the front \& back waistlines. Another basic, a little more difficult to find would be one with princess lines, no need for front or back darts as the adjustments are made in the prim\#1 cess seam. This type of pattern will probably have no waistline seam but that doesn't mean you can't cut it to the natural waistline markings and add your seam allowance and use it with a favorite skirt pattern to produce a new dress. The gored skirt style works well with that style top. Finally to start a collection,
\#3
 one that is harder to find has a shaped inset at the side front, again fitting adjustments are made here.

Before we go any further, I'd like to say a word about sizing. Patterns and ready-to-wear clothes do not use the same standards for sizes. It truly makes no difference what size pattern you buy, no one goes around wearing the pattern envelope to advertise the size used. The important thing is how well it fits you. BUY according to bust size..it is far easier to adust the waistline and the length from back neck to waist. Hemenber, manufacturers make their patterns for the average size, so if you re a little more endowed buy accordingly its the fit that counts.

I will attempt to show you that the most basic designs can be changed to give versatility..to basic \#1 add a bib yoke, fth or without trim or
 ruffle-if you cut it too wide add rows of tucks, cut too narrow, add bands of trim inserts. Basic \#1 using trim added in different ways produces different effects. These are for starters only. .sext issue
 we'll continue with ways to change the basics, giving you the most variety for the least cost. In the meantime I hope I've gotten you thinking.

Mare on CALLERLAB, March 1978.....
Over 1000 members of Callerlab and spouses attended the annual three day convention in St. Louis.... The CCNJ contingent divided among the various interest areas so that everything could be covered.
Dick Pasvolsky received a Callerlab Quarter Century Club Certificate in recognition of calling at least 25 years. He foined Art Seele and Dick Lighthipe previous recipients in this.

Cookie Lighthipe will chair a sub-committee of the Caller Association Liaison Committee whose duty it is to propose a model constitution as a guideline for caller associations.

Many resolutions were passed by the convention that will effect the s/d picture across the nation. It was agreed that Callerlab establish permanent liaison with ROUNDALAB and provide callers with a list of basic r/d steps to help them with the $\mathrm{r} / \mathrm{d}$ programs at their dances.

The Timing Committee of Callerlab had a resolution passed that accepted a list of the number of beats used for each basic. The list will be reviewed next year and made permanent if there are no objections.

The subject of levels and lists occupied much of the convention's time. The call "Recycle" after three years on the Quarterly Experimentals iist was added to the Mainstream program as basic \#69. Substitute was added as a companion to "Zoom".... Two calls from the mainstream list may be recomm mended by the Mainstream Comittee per quarter to be workshopped in depth for all position dancing. The Quarterly Experimental Comittee revised its list. (see page 49): It was agreed by the convention that from now on only experimental calls would be considered and not calls already on other lists. The Level Identification Comittee, dealing with the Plus $1 \& 2$ level had a resolution passed that made Plus 2 Program a permanent plateau. (see page 49 for the lists) Nothing will be deleted from these lists until at least the Callerlab Convention of 1981. Calls dropped from the Quarterly Experimental list may be added.

Perhaps the most significant resolution passed was the unanimous approval of promoting the use of Extended Basics Plateau (basics 1-54). This includes Swing Thru, Spin the Top, and Wheel and Deal. It was agreed that Callerlab would publicize and promote programs in national magazines, provide programs for this level at festivals and convention, distribute material at this level to Callerlab members and promote singing calls suitable for this level. These programs will hopefully provide a place for those who want to dance at a more relaxed level.

Jack Lasry was reelected to Chairman of the Board and his Executive Cominittee will include Al Brundage, Lee Helsel, Jon Jones \& Bob Van Antwerp. John Kaltnethaler will continue as Executive Secretary.

The Callerlab Milestone award, the highest award given, was presented to MANNING SMITH for all he has contributed to the $s / d$ activity over a long period of time. A Milestone award was also presented to BOB OSGOOD for all of his contributions to s/ding and callers over a period of years. The 640 callers present came from 46 states, 8 provinces of Canada \& 2 foreign countries - England \& New Zealand. Our thanks to Dick Lighthipe for his reflections on CALLERLAB. Clubs are asked to study page 49 - CALLERLAB PROGRANS. It is suggested the club Executive Board \& the club caller decide together the "Level of dancing".
