From the desk of JIM & FAY BATES, presidents NNJSDA

"The world, she am a-changin'..." and nowhere is it more apparent than in our world of Square Dancing. Oh sure, the faces have changed over the past five or six years, and the officers are different, but there's far, far more! Just look around you....S/D attire is brighter, there's more color coordination, more "his 'n her" outfits...the whole scene is changed. And of course, the calls are different, and greater in number, requiring more lessons (with perhaps some masquerading as "workshops"). As the dancers become more knowledgable, levels of dancing rise, and the caliber of the clubs changes.

with the advent of Callerlab, even the lingo has changed. Where once we merely termed a club's level, "Fun", or "Intermediate", or "Advanced", we now qualify and say "Mainstream", or "Plus One" or "Two", with a great deal more preciseness than formerly. This should ultimately work out to the dancer's benefit, but there may be some rough spots in the transition.

In the midst of the changes, however, the basic attributes that have always characterized Square Dancing have remained firm. S/Ders are still enthusiastic about their activity, and we hope this will never be altered. But most important, it is the friendliness that pervades Square Dancing at all levels, wherever and whenever. This is the ingredient that keeps the whole thing together.


VFW Hall. Iselin. NJ - downstairs \$3.50 / cpl The NNJSDA & CCNJ, thru Ron/Millie Nitzsche and Frank/Jean Riviccio, began a project last year to help get DROP-OUTS back into circulation. Thru the dedication and input by many, the project was successful. There has been much speculation and dialogue about the causes of drop-outs.

Space precludes their final report on the many lessons learned from CATCH ALL EIGHTS, but the most important is that when efforts are made to get dancers back they WILL return. Some clubs recognize that helping a dancer back into the fold will help swell their own membership and also that the graduates first year of dancing is their most critical one. A sponsor couple is assigned to each graduate couple whose duty is to give the new grad personal attention ... such as accompanying them to dances of at least three different clubs, guiding grads to clubs where the level is compatable to their dancing ability, as well as calling them if they have missed their own club dance.

Even tho it was shown that personal attention by the individual club will bring back Drop-outs, many clubs have not set up a program for this problem. As a service project to dancers in the area, the Executive Boards of NNJSDA & CCNJ have voted to continue on with CATCH ALL EIGHTS, and are each contributing \$50. towards its expenses. Class instructors and/or callers who are not running their own program are asked to please send a copy of their drop-out roster to -

Catch All Eights is not a class for beginners. It is available only to badge wearing dancers. It will start at Basic 39 and is progressive up to Mainstream (#69). The workshop is based on continous dancing with the level gradually raised, but with spot teaches where needed. Its measure of success is when attendance falls off at the Mainstream level and the more confident dancers start returning to their home clubs. It all began when Herb Arkin got the idea, and said "How about making up a caravan of campers to go to the convention in Oklahoma City in June?" We decided that it would be a good idea, perhaps even starting a little earlier with a stopover in Nashville, TN. There were 16 of us who hit the road. 



FOLLOW UP. . . .

The U.S. Postal Service staged a ceremony for the dedication of the 4 commemorative stamps in honor of the American Dance. The proceedings took place on April 26, 1978 in the N.Y. Public Library for the Performing Arts of Lincoln Center. The dedication program was attended by some 300 people, a veritable congress of the Who Who's of the US dance scene - the professional variety. Unfor-

tunately, there were no performances but simply speeches.

John Gingrich of the Ass'n. of American Dance Companies spoke of the contribution of dance to American culture and of the rapid growth of popularity of the past decade. Walter Terry, dance critic of the <u>Saturday Re-View</u>, introduced the distinguished guests - a most impressive assemblage. Among them were your reporters - not as immediate past president of the NNJSDA, but rather as editor of a reknowned philatelic publication FIRST DAYS. It was frustrating, indeed, that neither of the two speakers that followed - Robert Jofferer, Director of the Jofferey Ballet, and Regional Postmaster General Frank Sommerkamp - remarked on the prominence and popularity of Square Dancing. Consider also that square dance enthusiasts had labored for some 12 years for a US Stamp recognizing the activity.

During the closing moments, when souvenir albums were being distributed to the half dozen most prominent guests, the venerable Bob Osgood was called to the podium in his capacity with the American S/D Society. He took the opportunity to announce that there **are** some six million Americans who actively square dance today - personally involved in the very theme of the stamps. Were it not for Bob Osgood, the contribution of squate dancing to American Dance would have gone unrecognized. Well done, Bob.



The NNJSDA, now 20 years old, has always been concerned with a good promotional program, classes, leadership, summer dances & clearance. Now 36 clubs strong, and expanding, the Association continues working to improve and expand the S/D picture and its related activities. GRAND SQUARE was thrilled to be thought worthy of mention in their August '78 issue. tising manager and three district reporters.

As noted in the opening paragraph of this review, a greal deal of association news is included in GRAND SQUARE, not the least of which is to outline the minutes of the three yearly NNJSDA Delegate meetings. Anyone responsible for presenting the news of such a meeting could do well to pattern themselves after this concise and informative wrapup. The column is aptly named "In A Nutshell" but we would mentally add the adjective "interesting" before nutshell.

In addition to subscriptions and advertising, GRAND SQUARE operates in the black through the sale of GRAND SQUARE Booster Tags. These tags, sold annually for a six-week period (last half of January through February), are a miniature replica of the GRAND SQUARE logo. Any square dancer contributing \$1.00 (50¢ for teens) receives one.

In addition to association and club news, each issue includes a Square Dance Date Book. Here any club meeting semi-monthly or less frequently may list two special activities a season; clubs meeting more often may list up to five specials. A monthly sewing column entitled "The Square Pincusion," written by Rose Ericson, is widely reprinted in other publications. Rounds of the month, CALLERLAB news and some general square dance information round out the format.

Good use is made of the lower portion of many pages where information has been highlighted by ruling it off from the balance of copy on the page. Occasionally a paragraph with a small photo is included in this way; more often two or three lines are run calling attention to some particular item.

The March/April issue reviewed welcomed new graduates to the world of square dancing and most impressively listed more than 1,000 names of newcomers to the northern New Jersey area!

Last issue we discussed some of the possibilities of the basic bodice, fitted with the addition of 2 bust darts and 2 waistline darts.

Now, we'll show the versatility of the bodice with a center front panel and 2 side panels. This style lends itself easily to the change of fabric color or to combine prints with solids. The fitting is easier, too, as the seams can be taken in (or let out) with ease. The seam can also take a ruffle for a pinafore effect or a ruffle top-stitched for asquareneck effect. This bodice is perfect for a gored skirt as the lines can extend through the skirt.

The third type of bodice is a little more difficult to find in the pattern books- keep checking and you'll find it.

This type also lends itself to easy fitting, the lines can also be carried through to a gored skirt, and also makes up in twotone fabrics as well as prints combined with solids. Although these and most basics come with a high round neckline, they can be changed to a few different styles and we'll cover that in the next issue. Don't be afraid to invent a new combination or to try something unconventional. That's how all designers do it!!!

The International Association of Square Dance Callers In the interest of brevity & in response to requests from the s/ding public, the following abbreviations are recommended by CALLERLAB as a means of further identifying

the appropriate dance level. Please note that all abbreviations are cumulative, that is each two letter abbreviation includes the calls of the levels preceding it. Many clubs will not need levels other than MS or QS. CALLERLAB does not mean to imply any pressure to encourage dancers to try a level beyond where they are comfortable. Clearly, the Plus Program, Advanced Dancing and Challenge Dancing are not designed for all dancers. The main purpose of the abbreviations is to help those publications and clubs who wish to label their dances and find space a premium. The abbreviations will enable a dancer to know what calls he (or she) can expect to hear & will suggest whether a dancer should attend a particular dance or not. Not all clubs choose to label their dances - that is fine. However when a dance is labled, please use these abbreviations in the interest of standardization.
