AFTER GRADUATION - WHAT ?

Graduation is always a happy time, and a welcome event after 6 months of mental concentration and physical effort. It has been truly an exercise in coordination of mind & body. Although a great many people attracted to Square Dancing have done some Ball Room dancing & like dancing in any form, they discovered after only a few lessons that there is something significantly different about Square Dancing and the type of people enjoying this activity. They have learned long before Graduation time that it is a team activity on the dance floor. But our new Graduates must learn too that everything we do in this fellowship is a team effort. They should be ready to take their turn in the many functions of their Club, such as Refreshment Committee; Hospitality Committee; assist as Angels and to be Club Officers when asked. Northern New Jersey is a highly transient area, with frequent transfers of our members to other States, & many of our retired members are also gradually moving away, Our fellowship is therefore dependent upon gaining new Dancers every year via our many Classes.

A reminder to our new Graduates - Square Dancing is not like Ball Room dancing, where couples can go just any time they feel like it. It cannot be a "sometimes activity". Couples need to square dance at least once everyweek. Without such continuous exposure we cannot retain all of those calls. In recognition of this requirement, the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers' Association (NNJSDA) has scheduled ten Summer Dances during July & August specifically to keep our new Graduates dancing during the Summer. The Callers Council of New Jersey (CCNJ) has scheduled six summer Dances; many of our Clubs continue dances through the Summer; and some Clubs & Callers run special Workshops as refresher courses for new Craduates who wish to be more proficient. The bottom line in this message is: If you do not square dance all through this first Summer, you may not be with us next Fall or Winter. Every Organization serving Square Dancers is doing everything possible to keep you in our fellowship after Graduation. Won't you do your share and come out and dance regularly with us?

A reminder to our regular Dancers: - Do you remember how nervous we were during those first months after Graduation? Well, this is how our new Graduates will feel in April. There will be tension in their desire to be accepted and made welcome at their chosen Clubs by the seasoned dancers. The Leadership of each Club cannot do this alone. It is up to every dancer to extend their personal welcome and square up with these new dancers at every opportunity. Let us be mindful that these new dancers need our help now. Let's be right there with the welcome. Let's show them by our example that "Friendship Is Square Dancing's Greatest Reward."







SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA- They raise funds (notice the yellow stick on roses), design & build the S/D float for annual Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California. See page 15.

UNIVERSAL ROUND DANCE COUNCIL- Outgrowth of annual R/D Convention. Membership open to dancers and teachers.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SQUARE & ROUND DANCE SUPPLIERS; BACHELORS AND BACHELORETTES INTERNATIONAL - their name tells their interest.

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION- begins the 4th Thursday in June. It's Executive Committee is comprised of former General Chairmen. The convention

(1980 in Memphis, TN; 1981-Seattle, Wash.) is entirely run by volunteers from the sponsoring areas.


GARDEN STATE SQUARE DANCE CAMPERS

The SQUARE PINCUSHION shows a few techniques...



There have been a few requests on 'how to do' some sewing skills that are often taken for granted.

The first of these is 'gathering'. How you assemble your gathered skirt can make the difference between a skilled and a less-accomplished seamstress.

There are several methods you may employ to use when gathering those long strips to make into a tiered skirt or dress that is so popular in square dancing

apparel.

THIS

THIS

The first rule to remember is the sheerer the fabric the fuller it gets shirred. The second is don't be skimpy. If you feel you may not have sufficient fabric, add a complimentary piece or change the style.

A good rule of thumb is to gather your ruffles 2 to 1,i.e., a piece of fabric 36" wide gathers to 18".

When working with such large amounts to be gathered, some helpful hints can make the difference. If your brand of sewing machine comes equipped with a 'ruffler' attachment and your fabric is lightweight then you have a winning combination. Ruffler attachments take a little practice to get it going but it is worth it. On some scrap fabric get your attachment to gather in the 2 to 1 ratio; sew all your seams except the last one, then run the edge thru the ruffler, join the ruffled edge to the skirt and lastly close your final seam.

If you do not have a 'ruffler' or your fabric is not lightweight then other measures must be taken...You can put a heavy duty thread in the bobbin(à contrasting color makes it easier to tell which to pull); sew your gathers in quarters(if the thread breaks in pulling its easier to replace to fit). Pin your gathers and adjust evenly as you go or you can use nylon fishing line held over the stitching line using a zigzag stitch over the fishing thread being careful not to catch the line in your stitching. When all is stitched you pull the nylon line to the gathers desired. I'd suggest trying this on a scrap to see if you can master it. The zigzag stitches provide a casing that the fishing line is pulled thru.

Iry these and next issue we'll review a tiered skirt for those of you that have been asking for that.


5. Red state of NJ with center section denoting office held by wearer in the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers' Association. (NNJSDA)

The International Association of Square Dance Callers

The 7th annual International Convention will take place in Miami Beach just prior to Easter. Indications are that this will be another very productive Convention in the ever changing world of S/Ding. It is

through CALLERLAB that caller/leaders from all over the world will have an opportunity to work closely with one another, to exchange ideas & find solutions to problems & challenges facing them in their areas. CALLERLAB meetings vary from small Special Interest Groups to larger committee meetings to the combined general membership sessions involving all the delegates. While the convention is not primarily a dancing event, there will be occasional dance demonstrations & teaching techniques used to illustrate certain situations. CALLERLAB's 1980 meeting is not a festival, nor a caller's school & not just another callers meeting hashing over the same old problems. It is truly a professional gathering of dedicated leaders. Many of our area callers are members and are planning to attend.



Did you know CALLERLAB has established Caller Educational Specialists? To qualify a CALLERLAB member must have been calling a minimum 10 years, conducted at least 5 complete Callers Colleges utilizing the curriculum outlined & approved by CALLERLAB, answered correctly 100 of 110 questions on a written test, and answered 5

essay questions which serve as the starting point for the oral exam. An accreditation fee of \$150 is required prior to the Orals. To provide for provisional Caller-Coach accredititation to get the program off the ground 10 members of the Board of Governors were recognized for their expertise in the training of callers and completed all the testing procedures. So designated were Al Brundage, Cal Golden, Lee Helsel, Jon Jones, Frank Lane, Jack Lasry, Jim Mayo, Vaughn Parrish, Bill Peters & Bob Van Antwerp. As of the news release, four had passed the written and were in the process of taking their orals — Harold Bausch, Bruce Bird, Cal Campbell & Kip Garvey; and four had successfully taken the writtens & orals — Barry Aronovitch, Bill Davis, John Kaltenthaler & Gloria Roth.



At the ROUNDALAB (International Association of R/D Teachers Convention in San Diego, two retired R/D couples were elected Honorary Members. Ralph & Eve Maxhimer - from the West - who was on the staff at the 1st National S/D Convention & for 30 years did a tremendous amount to popularize & lay the

basis for the Square & R/D activity in their home area..and...Jack and Na Stapleton - who many R/Ders in our area must have met as the Stapletons travelled extensively teaching at many festivals and workshops and who were prolific choreographers, noted primarily for their beautiful waltzes (Mexicali Rose, Silk & Satin). NORTHERN NEW JERSEY SQUARE DANCERS' ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION and BYLAWS --- Revised March 1980

ARTICLE I. Name

The name shall be Northern New Jersey Square Dancers' Association. It will be a nonprofit organization.

ARTICLE II. Membership

The membership of the Association shall consist of organized square dance clubs governed by elected officers.

ARTICLE III. Area of Eligibility

Section 1. The initial area of eligibility for membership shall be Northern New Jersey (defined as north of and including Mercer and Middlesex Counties) and Richmond County (Staten Island) in New York.

Section 2. Other counties in and out of New Jersey that border the initial area outlined above, may be included upon mutual agreement.

ARTICLE IV. Purpose

Section 1. To promote square dancing in the area by:

- a) Organizing and providing special activities.
- b) Serving as a clearing house for area activities and information.
- c) Promotion of square dancing through publicity.
- d) Working in harmony with others interested in the promotion of square dancing.
- e) Encouraging standardization of styling and ways of executing figures.

ARTICLE V. Organization

Section 1. All dancers in good standing of member clubs shall be considered members of the Association.

Section 2. Each member club may select one couple delegate, and one or more alternate couple delegates not to exceed three couples, none of whom may be members of the Executive Committee of the Association. Individual members may be selected in lieu of a couple.

Section 3. Callers or cuers receiving remuneration from any Association club, directly or indirectly, are not eligible to be delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall elect the officers of the Association.

Section 5. All past presidents of the Association shall be Lifetime Honorary Delegates without voting privileges.

Section 6. The term of office of the delegates and alternates shall be from June 1 to May 31.

Section 7. Delegates and alternates must be members in good standing of the club they represent.

Section 8. Delegates and alternates may not represent more than one club simultaneously.

ARTICLE VI. Officers

Section 1. The officers shall be President, 1st Vice-President, 2nd Vice-President, 3rd Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. All officers of the Association shall serve without remuneration.

ARTICLE VII. Advisors, GRAND SQUARE Editors

Section 1. The immediate past president shall remain on the Executive Committee in an advisory capacity until replaced by another immediate past president.

Section 2. Advisors may be appointed by the president to serve during the current term.

Section 3. There shall not be more than three advisors appointed.

Section 4. Advisors shall render general advice and assistance to the Executive Committee.

Section 5. The President, with the concurrence of the majority of the elected officers, shall appoint the editor and associate editor of GRAND SQUARE.

ARTICLE VIII. Election of Officers

Section 1. Individuals receiving remuneration from any Association club, directly or indirectly, are not eligible for election to office.

Section 2. Election of officers shall take place at the Annual Meeting held during the month of April, from a slate presented by the Nominating Committee and nominations from the floor. The Nominating Committee's slate shall be presented to the delegates not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting.

Section 3. Election shall be by simple majority of the delegates present. The vote shall be by secret ballot whenever a contest occurs.

Section 4. The elected officers shall serve for a one year term, starting June 1st.

Section 5. No person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

ARTICLE IX. Duties of Officers

Section 1. The President shall preside at all Association meetings and insure that all business is covered. He shall be spokesman for the Association. He shall call all meetings of the delegates and of the Executive Committee.

Section 2. The 1st Vice-President shall be responsible for special events, balls, and callers except as specified in other Sections of the Constitution. He shall assume all duties of the President if he is absent from any scheduled meeting.

The 2nd Vice-President shall be in charge of Beginners' Classes, Graduates' Ball and all other items in connection with new recruits to square dancing. He shall assume all duties of the President if he and the 1st Vice-President are absent from any scheduled meeting.

The 3rd Vice-President shall be responsible for all publicity, new member clubs of the Association, and act as liaison representative of the Association in connection with any disputes between member clubs, and assist member clubs who may have financial or membership difficulties. He shall assume all duties of the President if he, the 1st Vice-President and the 2nd Vice-President are absent from any scheduled meeting.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall take and transmit minutes of Delegates' and txecutive meetings. He shall be Chairman of the Clearance Committee. He shall also keep accurate records of all member clubs' regular dance schedules.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall be responsible for all other correspondence. In the absence of the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary shall assume his duties.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all income, moneys on hand, and expenditures. He shall be prepared to give the financial status at each meeting of the Delegates and Executive Committee. The President shall authorize all expenditures and may delegate to the Treasurer authorization of routine bills/invoices in accordance with the annual budget. The Treasurer shall be bonded.

Section 6. Other duties may be assigned to any officer by the Bylaws or by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE X. The Executive Committee

Section 1. The officers, editor of GRAND SQUARE, and advisors shall constitute the Executive Committee.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall formulate policies and programs, and, with the help of committees, carry out the activities of the Association

ARTICLE XI. Meetings

Section 1. The President shall call, in addition to the Annual Meeting, a minimum of one fall and one winter meeting of the Delegates, giving at least two weeks notice for these meetings. A quorum shall exist when at least 50% of the member clubs are represented.

Section 2. The President shall call meetings of the Executive Committee as required. At least two-thirds of the Committee shall be required to make the meeting official.

ARTICLE XII. Voting

Section 1. At Delegates' meetings, a simple majority of the delegates present shall be required to approve items of business requiring a vote, except as otherwise noted. Each member club present shall have one vote.

Section 2. The President shall call at least one Executive Committee meeting at least four weeks prior to Delegates' meeting. Also one Change-over meeting prior to June 1st. A two-thirds majority vote of the members present shall be required to approve items of business requiring a vote. Each individual has one vote.

ARTICLE XIII. Succession of Officers

Section 1. In the event that the President resigns or becomes incapacitated, the vacancy shall be filled within 30 days from among the elected members of the Executive Committee by a majority vote of the elected members.

Section 2. All other officer vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the President with the concurrence of the Executive Committee for the remainder of the term.

Section 3. Any elected officer may be removed for cause on the recommendation of the majority of the Executive Committee and a two-thirds vote of the Delegates.

ARTICLE XIV. Committees

Section 1. The President shall appoint the following committees giving geographical consideration to such appointments:

- a) Nominating Committee consisting of chairman and two members, one of whom shall be a former officer of the Association.
- b) Audit Committee to audit the books annually and at each change of Treasurer.
- c) Administrative for review of Constitution, Bylaws, and other Association procedures.

Section 2. Special Committees may be appointed as necessary to cover activities.

ARTICLE XV. Finances

Necessary operating expenses shall be defrayed by fund-raising events and/or membership dues.

ARTICLE XVI. Suspension

Section 1. A club may be suspended from benefits of membership in the Association for failure to comply with or for acting contrary to the ARTICLES and BYLAWS of this CONSTITUTION. Temporary suspension of benefits may be invoked by the Executive Committee until such time as action shall be taken at the next Delegates' Meeting.

Section 2. For a club to be suspended or expelled, a vote of two-thirds of the Delegates (one vote per club) attending a scheduled meeting shall be necessary.

ARTICLE XVII. Amendments

Section I. Proposed amendments to the Constitution may be submitted by any dancer belonging to a member club. Amendments must be submitted to the Association President eight weeks prior to the meeting at which the vote shall be taken. The President shall be required to notify all registered delegates at least four weeks prior to this meeting.

Section 2. To be ratified, an amendment must receive a two-thirds majority with at least two-thirds of the member clubs represented.

ARTICLE XVIII. General

Robert's Rules of Order shall be the governing Parliamentary Law in all cases not covered in this Constitution or Bylaws.

ARTICLE XIX. Bylaws

Bylaws shall be adopted, amended or rescinded by a two-thirds vote of the member clubs present at a regular meeting, with prior notification as for Constitutional Amendments, ARTICLE XVII, Section 1.

BYLAWS

Section I. Procedure for becoming a member of the Association.

a. A written application shall be filed with the Recording Secretary of the Association setting forth the name of the club, list of membership-elected officers, names of callers, dates, level, and location of dances, and number of paid-up members.

b. An officer of the club shall appear at the next meeting of the Executive Committee to answer any questions regarding the application.

c. An announcement of the application shall be made at the next Delegates' Meeting following the filing of the application.

d. The 3rd Vice-President shall visit the club prior to Executive Committee review.

e. Application shall be voted upon at the next regular Executive Committee meeting. By a majority vote the application may be rejected, postponed or recommended to the delegates for acceptance.

f. The recommendations of the Executive Committee shall be presented at the next Delegates' Meeting. A majority vote of those Delegates present is required for approval.

Section 2. Qualifications for eligibility for new member clubs are as follows:

- a. Must consist of at least four adult squares with a reasonably stable membership over a period of at least one year.
- b. Must be devoted to Western Style Square Dancing with a regular caller or callers, a regular meeting place, and governed by regular elected officers.
- c. Must not dance on the same night as another member club within a 15 air mile radius.
- d. Teen age clubs, with a reasonably stable membership of at least two squares over a period of one year, may become Associate Members with a nonvoting delegate, having the right of discussion.

Section 3.

- a. To continue membership, a club must conduct regular dances and maintain, as a minimum, the qualifications for eligibility defined in Section 2.
- b. When unusual circumstances arise in regard to the above qualifications, any club, upon obtaining permission, in writing, from all conflicting clubs, may request consideration as specified in Section 9, the decision to be binding on all. Any party may appeal to the Delegates within one year of the decision.
- c. A club must also be represented at a majority of the Delegates' Meetings each year and be in good standing.
- Section 4. The annual dues for each member Club and Associate Club shall be as recommended by the Executive Committee and approved by the Delegates. Annual dues shall be payable at the second Delegates' Meeting.
- Section 5. The Association or Member Clubs may organize and run beginner classes in various sections of the area covered by the Association.
- Section 6. The Association will provide various instructional pamphlets, diplomas and 100% attendance pins for beginners' classes of member clubs.

Section 7. The Association shall have first priority of all 5th Fridays and 5th Saturdays and also all Wednesdays from June 20 to August 31 for Association dances.

Section 8.

- a. Any member club planning to hold a special dance on a day other than its regularly scheduled day shall notify the Recording Secretary and shall be limited to days when no regular club dance within 25 air miles is scheduled.
- b. Dates shall be recorded as received. In no event will the Recording Secretary acknowledge any specific date for more than three years in advance. Regularly scheduled dances of member clubs have priority over dance classes, workshops or any extracurricular activities by any member club or Association caller.
- c. In the event any such notification indicates a conflict with another member club's regularly scheduled dance or previously scheduled special dance of a member club to be held within a 15 or 25 air mile radius (as appropriate) of such proposed dance, or a conflict with an Association dance, the Recording Secretary shall advise such club of such conflict and suggest a new date be selected.


Section 9. In the event of any difficulty between two or more clubs or the Association, upon receiving such advice from the Secretary, or upon request from an involved club, the 3rd Vice-President shall attempt to effect a mediation satisfactory to all concerned. If unsuccessful, the President shall appoint an impartial committee consisting of at least three members from at least three different clubs (other than those clubs that are affected). This committee shall meet with representatives from each club to effect a mediation.

Section 10. The official publication shall be known as "GRAND SQUARE". It shall be made available to all dancers of its member clubs, to the beginner classes of member clubs, and other interested persons. No advertisment or announcement of any dance that is in conflict with a previously scheduled dance of a member club to be held within a 15 or 25 air mile radius (as appropriate) of such member club's dance or in conflict with an Association dance shall be accepted.

Section II.

- a. The Association shall keep and maintain records of each member club, including the names and addresses of its officers, delegates, callers, level of dance, and the location of its regular place of dancing.
- b. Any change in officers, delegates or callers is to be reported to the President as soon as is reasonably possible.
- c. Any contemplated change in regular place, date or level of dancing is to be reported immediately to the Recording Secretary for proper clearance.

Section I2. To acquire the title of "Patron", a dancer of the Association shall attend a scheduled dance by a regular caller of 26 member clubs, not counting Associate Clubs, in the Association and shall present a written record thereof to the Executive Committee. There shall be no time limit.


