





The incorporation of your S/D club is an essential protection for the members and officers and certainly should not be ignored. By the simple act of completing and filing a Certificate of Incorporation the group becomes a legal en-

tity, thereby relieving the individuals from liability that can be very, very damaging.

In the absence of incorporation, if a club is sued for a physical injury at a dance (in excess of insurance coverage), for breach of contract, or for moral damage, all the officers and members may be sued. That means every registered member of the club can be named in the suit and must share the legal expenses as well as the judgement (if the court finds against the club).

Incorporation is relatively easy to achieve, although there is an initial bother involved. Following are the steps to be followed, which are reasonably accurate. If assistance is required call the incorporation office in Trenton at (609) 890-9500, or your County Clerk.

1. Write to the N.J. Dept. of State, P.D. Box 1330, Trenton, NJ 08625, to request 4 copies of Form C-101 7-6-70 for the incorporation of an organization not for profit — plus instructions.

2. Have the completed forms notarized, then send them to the NJ Div of Public Welfare, Dept. of Institutions and Agencies, P.O. Box 1627, Trenton, NJ 08619. Request that the original and at least one copy be returned approval stamped and with a Letter of Review.

3. The original and one copy are next taken to the County Clerk for recording and additional stamping. The fee is \$10 (increased on July 1).

4. Send the original and Letter of Review, with the \$5 fee, to the Dept. of State office initially contacted. If an additional copy is included it will be stamped FILED and returned to the club.

Thereafter an annual fee of \$2 is required to maintain the incorporation in force.

The small amount of effort and the modest investment will provide enormous protection from what otherwise could be a financial disaster. Both members and officers of each club should be obliged to see that incorporation is effected.

When the bill passed the Assembly unanimously last June, reporters were busy tracking down any & all NNJSDA officers (many of whom were at the 29th NSDC in Memphis) for info. But when AJR 29 finally passed the Senate on Nov. 24, the ONLY paper to pay any attention was the STAR LEDGER!

What next???Well, after many false leads (including several calls to newspapers for help), a call to Senator Matthew Feldman of Bergen County produced a phone number to call to find out the latest status of AJR 29or any piece of legislation. It is 800-792-8630 - the Legislative Infornation Service or L I S N. Be patient if their line is busy for you will eventually get thru and a very pleasant voice will bring you up to date on AJR 29. She'll also explain what next. It seems the Governor has 45 days after the second Tuesday in January '82 to act on our bill. If he chooses to ignore it then, it gets a "pocket veto" and we are back to square one. But if and when he decides to act, he then calls for the bill & has 10 days to make his decision. He can veto, send it back for a change, or ignore it & let it become a law minus his signature, or do what we all are hoping for - sign the Bill.

So now, once again it is up to all you dancers out there - if you want Governor Byrne to call for & sign AJR 29, please invest some postage & time into writing the Governor in Princeton or Trenton concerning the merits of AJR 29 & our overall Square Dance activity. FRANK & HELEN CAVANAUGH have brought us this far along, let's the rest of us do our part to join the states of Tennessee, Washington & Oregon who have similar signed Resolutions.







This issue the SQUARE PINCUSHION looks at Sewing Room Organization!



Is your sewing space organized? Or do you shy away from sewing because it's too much trouble to get everything together....

If you have an area where you can leave your sewing machine open that would be first preference. Then, even a few minutes can be snatched at the machine. To keep it from becoming dusty make a little cover from an old towel or a half of an old pillowcase. If you sow a lot or would be tempted to if space permitted, in place of a regular sewing cabinet put your machine head into a table top...The machine bed should be level with the table top. It means cutting a hole in the table the size of the machine, then reinforcing underneath the hole with a few short strips of lumber along the front and back of the opening and fastening hinges in place. An ideal size is




sketched at left. This provides ample space behind and to the left to keep fabrics from sliding off. If you're about to purchase a new machine you'll save money if you purchase it without a cabinet...

If your sewing space has one wall you can cover in cork squares you'll have a perfect bulletin board for ideas, pattern envelopes, notes, etc. These squares are available with peel-off backs.

Tapemeasures in quantity are a timesaver & convenience. 6 are not too many...fasten 2 at the side and 1 at the end of your cutting table.(good for instant measuring). Place the 4th tape glued to the front edge of the machine table, the 5th gets attached to the front top edge of your pressing table and the 6th-uses the first 6" onlycut off the first 6"; cut off the first $\frac{1}{2}$ ",too-lay this

end $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the needle at the right side of the presser foot, gluing the tape measure in place. Use a paper, not plastic, tape. It's thinner. This will help you to



stitch straigter. By distributing your tape measures, you will save a lot of time fumbling, therefore making more sewing time.

There's a relatively new type lamp available for the needlewoman called a magnifing lamp. Comes with a magnifying glass about 5" diameter surrounded by a flourescent lamp(ring), with a lampshade covering, all connected on a flexible arm that clamps to your work surface. A few are available with a weighted base.

These are a few starters, next month a few more ideas to organize to provide more time and pleasure for your sewing. Rose Ericson, 687-0342

ROUND DANCE HIGHLIGHTS




