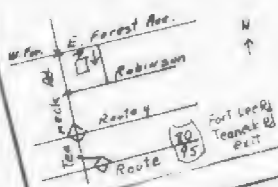

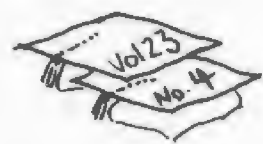

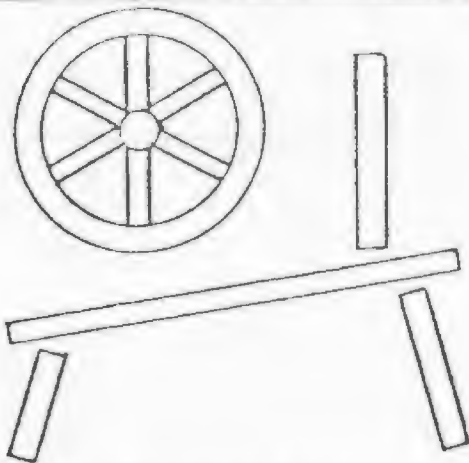

GRADUATES, to the wonderful wide, wide world of Square Dancing & its related activities.....Described briefly below are a few organizations whose names you will become more familiar with as time goes on, whose main purpose is the promotion, preservation & protection of square dancing & its related activities.

CALLERLAB - The International Association of S/D Callers is the professional callers communication organization which has provided immediate & much needed leadership to the field of calling. Meets annually.

LEGACY - An International Assembly of trustees who represent leadership in over a dozen different related phases of the S/D activity. It is a valuable communications system aimed at providing information & tools needed by clubs & associations. Meets biennially in odd years.

NATIONAL FOLK DANCE COMMITTEE - Is working to have square dancing officially declared the National Folk Dance of the United States. Several states have already declared the S/D their state folk dance. NJ's AJR 29 awaits signature

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION - begins 4th Thursday in June...entirely run by square dancers, it's Executive Committee is comprised of former General Chr. 1981 in Seattle Washington; 1982-Detroit, MI; 1983-Louisville, KY; 1984-Baltimore, MD. In 1977 it was in Atlantic City, NJ.

LLOYD SHAW FOUNDATION - Provides school guidance programs & excellent leadership training sessions as well as maintaining an archives center.

ROUNDALAB - The International Association of Round Dance Teachers formed to promote, protect, & perpetuate the general R/D movement as a complement to the overall S/D picture. Only teachers may belong. Meets annually.

SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA - Raises funds (notice the roses stuck on badges), designs & builds the S/D float for the annual Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California. Thiessens/Arkins were float riders from NNJ in 1981.

UNIVERSAL ROUND DANCE COUNCIL - Outgrowth of annual R/D convention. Membership open to dancers/teachers alike. Convention held yearly.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SQUARE & ROUND DANCE SUPPLIERS; BACHELORS AND BACHELOTTES INTERNATIONAL - their names tells their interest.

"One dreary August evening while I lay sleeping, Carol came charging upstairs yelling "We're going to California!". The shock was doubly so since I didn't even know that our name had been entered to be on the float (A common occurrence).

We arrived in San Francisco on Dec. 19 & continued to sight see thru Napa, Monterey, Hearst Castle & Disneyland at Christmas. Finally, on the 26th we met the Float organizers & our fellow dancers. They included the Thiessen's from NJ, Hroxiencik's from CN & 3 couples from California - one was an alternate.

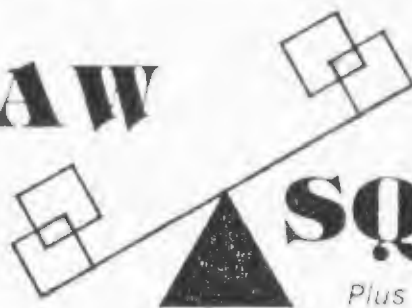
The real story of the float is not the beautiful design & the flowers, but the extraordinary commitment & hospitality by unpaid volunteer S/Ders to make this event a success. They are the unsung heroes working on the float 16 hours & more per day under quite trying conditions. This is even more remarkable when you realize that this was initiated over 6 years ago by John Fogg & Charlie Naddeo pledging themselves to cover the expenses involved. Not anyone can enter a float. This year's float cost \$40,000 paid for entirely by dancer donations; \$25,000 is required. None of the organizers has taken a penny for their efforts & they exclude themselves from being on the float.

After 12 hours of practice we hoped we were ready. On the day of the parade, we got up at 4 AM traveled to & were on board the float before 7. We danced on & off to keep warm to 8:30 & then full time to parade end at 12:30. There is no doubt that this day was the most thrilling of our lives. You must experience performing to 1.5 million people on the parade route to come close to understanding.

A few dancers have said, "Why should we be interested; its too expensive & short lived". The answer is that Square Dancing lives by its new members. Showing over 100 million people all over the world that the activity is modern & viable aids in that effort. The over 1 minute coverage by CBS clearly indicates the level of interest.

I heartily recommend that all dancers send their names, addresses & a picture to John Fogg - PO Box 2, Altadena, CA 91001 stating that they wish to be on the 1982 float & are willing to pay their own way. Names will be drawn at the Seattle convention in June. Good luck." Herb/Carol Arkin

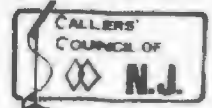
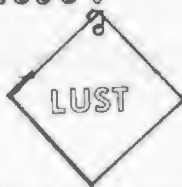

3. For dancing at 26 member clubs. Patron's cards with rules & room for signatures are included in every graduate's packet.
4. Attendees at LUST (Let Us Speak Together)- NNJSDA's Leadership Seminar dedicated to helping all better understand the workings of a S/D club may purchase these. A biennial meeting held 2nd Sun. in Sept in even years.
5. Red state of NJ with center section denoting office held by wearer in the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association. (NNJSDA)
6. Denotes a past officer (president's slightly different) of NNJSDA.
7. Northern New Jersey Round Dance Leaders Council (NNJRDLC) members wear this badge. Formulated in 1965, the Council meets quarterly to exchange information, self improvement, plan specials & select Rounds of Month (ROM).
8. Callers Council of New Jersey (CCNJ) members wear this badge-colors denote type of member. Organized in 1974, it is a state-wide, non-profit corporation of professional S/D callers whose purpose is to encourage/promote modern S/Ding & the development of professional callers/teachers.

LEVELS

What are they??????

Many dancers have received handouts listing the CALLERLAB PROGRAMS and/or "Basic Manuals of S/D Calls".

Certain S/D calls have been grouped together to make the learning process easier. These grouping, or LEVELS, are progressive & are named..... Basic - Extended Basic (EB) - Mainstream (MS) - Quarterly Selections (QS)- Plus I (+1) - Plus II (+2) - Advanced (A 1) (A 2) -Challenge (C 1 etc) -

In NNJ most graduates have been exposed to, and have a fairly good working acquaintance with, the calls that comprise the Basic & Extended Basic levels. The calls that bring one up thru the Mainstream (MS) Level may need a little more practice. Every 3 months CALLERLAB suggests 1 or 2 calls callers may want to workshop as an extra at the clubs that dance at Mainstream (MS) Level. These are called Quarterly Selections (QS). (There are none over the summer.)

In NNJ most clubs have selected a level compatible with their dancers & the caller has been instructed to use no calls beyond this level. This does not exclude one workshop tip of the next level if a club so desires.




Graduates are urged to dance at clubs listing themselves Extended Basic (EB), Mainstream (MS) or Quarterly Selection (QS) clubs until comfortable with all their calls. Periodically a series of workshops are offered to help dancers advance to the next level.

It makes no difference at which level you dance - many dancers can be comfortable at different levels - you'll find the same friendly, congenial people among those of the same dancing ability. The enjoyment of the dance is the interaction among the people present.

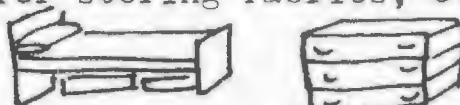


Some wall space devoted to peg board panelling to hang equipment out of the way but in plain sight is very handy if you can do it.

Fabrics picked up at sales, prewashed, measured and an appropriate tag attached telling fiber content, yardage and washability will be a boon when you have the urge to sew NOW.... Don't forget to put a swatch in your little purse-size swatch book to match hubby's shirt, thread or trims.

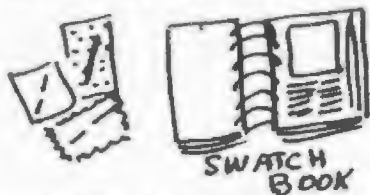
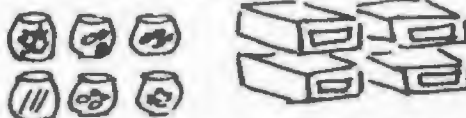


Underbed storage boxes are good sizes and inexpensive containers for your fabrics...An old dresser revitalized becomes a good place for storing fabrics, etc.



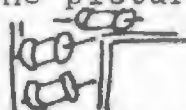
Small boxes such as cigar boxes make good holders for trims, lace edgings, zippers, bindings, etc.

Small jars like instant coffee jars make good containers for snaps, hooks & eyes, buttons, needles, pins, etc.



Speaking of needles, its a good practice to put your used machine needles (if there is still life in them) into a scrap of fabric of the type you used it for, then you won't have to wonder if the needle was for silk or for jeans.

A 2 or 3 drawer filing cabinet is a fine place to store patterns. Manila envelopes are good to put the patterns into-space to paste the picture on top & room for notes.

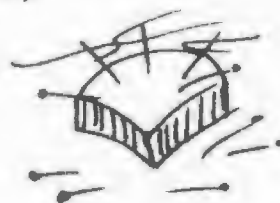


A gal I know solved her thread storage dilemma by having headless nails spaced around her windows each holding a spool of thread.....
