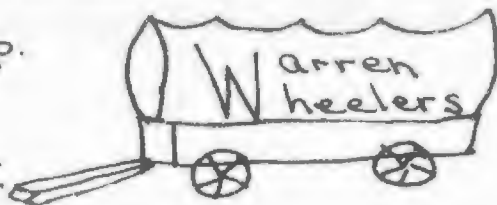
Please communicate with us. Your Executive Board welcomes suggestions and constructive criticism. We promise to give each one received our thoughtful and careful consideration.

Treasurer reported all dues paid except See Saws.

1st VP - 40 sets at John Hendron dance; 15 sets at Class Level Dance.....  
summer schedule all set....asked all delegates to promote Association

dances...we need your support - profits from the dances are used to keep the Ass'n functioning....summer assignments for refreshments will be mailed to delegates.....still looking for new halls for future dances...

2 VP - 32 classes with 822 + graduates.....19 callers have agreed to call for Graduates Ball in April!!!asked all to help the graduate make the transition from class to club....packets distributed for graduates....

3 VP - letters to the Governors of NJ & NY requesting them to name Sept 20-26, 1981 as National S/D Week have been mailed out.....

GRAND SQUARE - in spite of practicing many economies it still averages \$500+ deficit with each issue - Questionnaires were distributed to all clubs requesting info for next season - due back by mid June...

Many comments concerned GRADUATES.....

How do you convince new graduates to dance ALL summer?

What do you do for those who don't dance all summer.....and flounder in at the club in the fall?

Should clubs drop the level in the Spring to encourage the grads to feel more welcome?

Many commented on summer dancing & the need for new grads to dance...

How do we pick up those who could not dance all summer but still want to dance in the Fall? Will there be a CATCH ALL EIGHTS available?

We must not sell new dancers a bill of goods.

Adopt a buddy system with new graduates

Push Association summer dances (1st 5-MS; 2nd 5 MS/QS)

MS Clubs need to say "You are Welcome" to grads and not let the more experienced dancer push the levels up.

Comments concerning LEVELS. . . . .

- A. Can you ask for a refund if club dances higher than advertised level?
- B. Can you ask for a refund if caller workshops material several levels beyond the advertised material?
- C. What do you do if your caller does not stick to the advertised level? Even after a warning???

This issue the SQUARE PINCUSHION takes a good look at SLEEVES....



Pretty dresses go unworn all because the sleeves bind or cut due to improper fit or planning. A sleeve that is tight and smooth does not wear well on the dance floor. You raise your arm to do a 'star thru' and it either binds or tears. Spend a little time in planning what sleeve to use and how it will wear when dancing and you'll get lots more mileage from that dress.

Sleeve choices are many-we'll discuss a few to help you. There's the 'cap' sleeve....not cut onto the bodice but a separate piece eased or gathered to fit the upper part of the armhole (fig. 1)



Then there's the 'cape' sleeve....soft and flowing, lots of freedom for arm movements, and flattering to all figures. This is most often found in raglan styles. See fig. 2.



Puffed sleeves have been around for generations but are quite comfortable to wear. Just be sure the elastic edges are soft and not too tight or they won't be so comfortable either. (fig. 3)



A newer addition to the family of sleeves in recent years has been the 'petal' sleeve. Very feminine and quite comfy, too. (fig. 4) To adapt your puffed sleeve pattern here's how...Make a tracing (twice) of tissue or other paper. Draw a gentle curve as in fig. 5. Cut out. Repeat with 2nd pattern only in reverse. (fig. 6) Each sleeve will require 2 pieces of fabric cut from each pattern piece, i.e., each sleeve takes four pieces of fabric (2 will serve as the lining) To assemble, join 'A' front to 'A' lining, right sides together, sewing the lower edge.

Repeat with pieces 'B'. Join underarm seam, see fig. 7. Overlap A over B to fit the upper curve, then set in your sleeve in the armhole normally. Repeat other sleeve using B over A. This is kind of tricky so if you have a question feel free to call me (687-0342) evenings or weekends please.

Long or 3/4 sleeves, with added fullness are great when temperatures dip. If you make them a little longer and in place of the cuff you put a casing and insert elastic, you can slide them up a bit if more stretch is needed while dancing.

There you have a few styles to start you thinking. These can all be adapted in one way or another. Trimmed or plain, try some. Gotta run....Rose Ericson, the  pincushion.....

## QUARTERLY SELECTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

For the quarter beginning April 1, CALLERLAB has selected one new movement for use in workshops at MS Dances...written by Dick Kenyon.....RELEASE RECYCLE. From a 1/4 Tag formation, the ends of the Right Hand Wave and the outside Boys (beaus) extend to the dancer ahead of them and all finish like a RECYCLE. Ends in a starting Double Pass Thru formation. Timing is 6 steps. For the majority of clubs, this call should be used with standard set-ups only (girl on boy's right). For groups that can handle variations of Recycle, this call can be used from a variety of Boy-Girl arrangements. There will be no QS chosen for the summer months. It is recommended callers feature some of the calls from the Mainstream list they haven't used too frequently in the past.

#### WHICH DIRECTION TO TURN?

By Jon Jones  
Chairman of the Board of CALLERLAB

This question has been asked by many callers and leaders all over the world. It is not new, it has been asked for over thirty years and yet nobody has come up with a fool-proof solution to satisfy everyone.

The question is in regard to the Mainstream Basics Program. CALLERLAB has developed the most workable program ever! Nobody has ever said that the CALLERLAB program is perfect but it is closer than anything in existence today, in the eyes of the majority.

At the first CALLERLAB Convention, held in St. Louis in 1974, the big outcry was "Develop a Mainstream Program of basics that every caller, all over the world, can use so the teaching and learning process will be standardized." The Mainstream Basics Committee was formed, with Johnny LeClair as chairman, and the process began. The first proposed program took almost two years to develop and was adopted on a permanent basis in 1977 with a suggested teaching order and a recommendation of forty-one sessions or eighty hours of teaching time. The amount of teaching time was the most workable average selected by the committee from suggestions that ranged from a low of ten weeks to a high of seventy weeks. If every caller in the world were to make up a Mainstream Basics list, along with the amount of teaching time, we would probably have nine thousand different programs, presuming there are that many callers worldwide. What a disaster that would be to the square dancing world! MORE p. 41

The Mainstream Program does work. This has been proven in many instances. It can and should work all over the world. All it takes is commitment and cooperation of the callers and leaders.

We need to keep the fun and sociable aspect of square dancing uppermost in our minds and not frustration. Too many very good callers have forgotten what made them popular and in demand all over the world. They became well known for the simple reason that they called a fantastic dance. No mention was ever made about what level they called or how choreographically intricate the figures were. They simply called a great dance.

Good leadership and good judgment are the keys to the entire activity. If the callers and leaders have the attitude that the dancer must be the winner during class and at dances, then good leadership and good judgment have been exercised. If, on the other hand, the callers and leaders are constantly pushing the dancer to learn more and more and never permitting them to win and have fun, then poor leadership and poor judgment are evident. In far too many instances we have sacrificed quality for quantity. Quality dancing is so beautiful and feels so good, it gives one the feeling of being a winged figure of human form in fine art.

So, which direction do we turn? We turn toward commitment and cooperation that we can and will continue to make Square Dancing the most enjoyable activity that has ever been created.

Square dancing should and must be an "Expression of Joy."

Square dancing is more standardized today than ever before, due to the hard work and dedication of the committees and members of CALLERLAB.

There have been a certain number of complaints about the length of the Mainstream Program and the teaching time. Some of them have been justified, but there have been many more compliments than complaints. It was interesting and rewarding to hear the European Callers Association at their meeting in Munich, Germany in July, 1978 adopt a policy that the Saturday night class of their festival would consist of the CALLERLAB Mainstream Program only! What fantastic cooperation and what a compliment to CALLERLAB.

We may have reached the time when the Basic and Extended Programs need to be "frozen" for a certain period. This aspect will be discussed at the convention this year.

It is disturbing to hear callers complain about the length and the amount of time required to teach the Mainstream Program when all along their ultimate goal is to push their new dancers to the Plus II level as fast as possible. Some callers are trying to attain this impossible goal in twenty to twenty-five sessions. How sad it is to see this happen and watch dancers suffer and be totally frustrated when they enter the square dancing world. The caller and the club are not being fair to their new dancers.

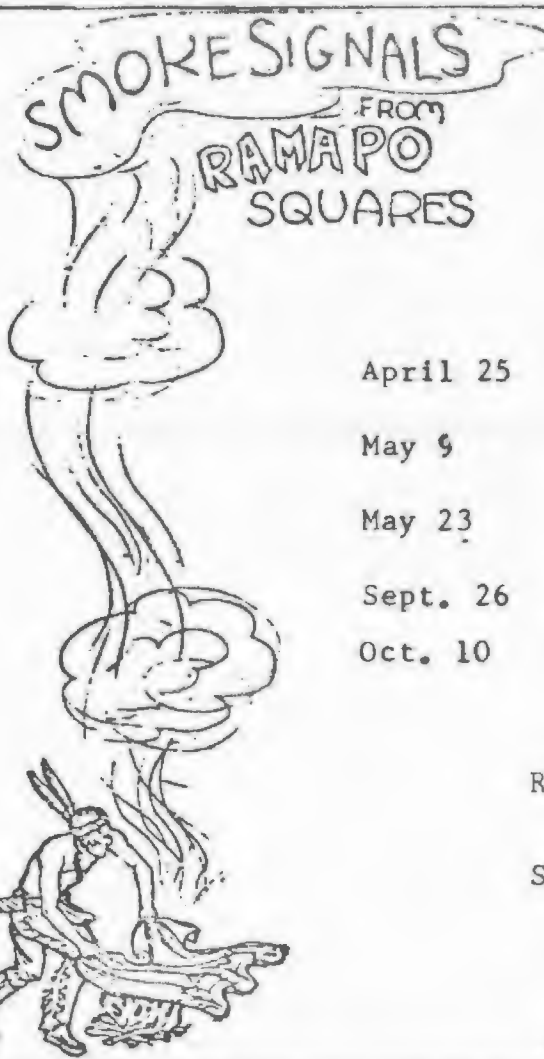

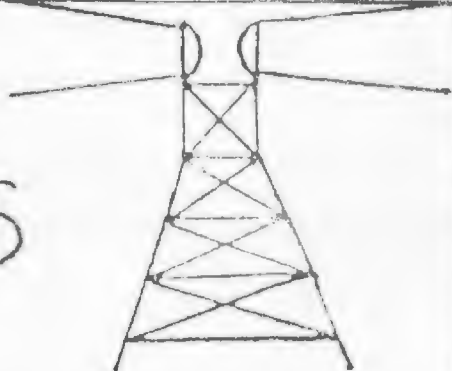
