This issue the SQUARE PINCUSHION  
looks at "HEM-LINES".....



The nicest dress can be ruined if  
the hemline is done sloppily.

Let's first look at some different types of hems, where  
they could be used and how-to do them.

The easiest, by far, is the flat hem done on straight  
pieces such as the tier on a skirt. There we just turn  
in the raw edge 1/4", then turn in the required amount  
to make the skirt your desired length. This can be hand-  
hemmed, if you wish, or machine stitched, nice and even.  
With this type hem you can also make it very narrow and  
add a small ruffle of lace or eyelet, or a small ruffle  
of self-fabric, or a row of embroidered ribbon, or bias  
tape (plain or fancy), or one of several rows of ribbon.  
The possibilities are many. Check ready-mades, especially  
the decorative finish in fine little girls' dresses. You  
can use many of these ideas on your dress or skirt.

Circular skirts make for easy-to-make skirts that give  
fullness without much waistline bulk. Their hems are a  
little tricky. Turn under the raw edge 1/4" and press as  
you go; turn under a second 1/4" and press again. Now  
top-stitch all around. This hem can also be edged in  
many of the ways the flat hem above was finished.

Sheer fabrics look and hang best when the hems are made  
deeper than usual-about 4" or more. This provides some  
extra weight to keep it from flying around. Sheers look  
lovely with ribbon trim in one or more rows.

When adding trim to your hems, work it in a way that will  
permit you to do top-stitching on the right side whenever  
possible. Example: Bias binding can be added to the wrong  
side of the hem, turned to the front (right side) and top-  
stitched in place.

Spend a little extra time in planning how you will finish  
your hem- no raw edges showing on inside or out. If not  
finished neatly, it will spoil the look of the whole  
skirt.

And, lastly, a word on hemlines. Our square dance dresses  
know no season or fashion-time in the sense that they  
do not go out of style. Therefore, wear the length that  
looks the best for your type of figure. Knees and gawky  
legs showing beneath a too-short dress on a too-chubby  
figure ~~at~~tract from an otherwise lovely frock.

So make your dresses lovely from the bottom up.....

# CALLERLAB

The International Association  
of Square Dance Callers

CALLERLAB calls your attention to several changes that reflect significant differences in their new program page 49. The MS list consists of 2 segments - the Basic Program (B) is a combination of the previous Basic & Extended Basic Programs. The calls are the same; the change is in suggested teaching order. There are major changes in the Plus Lists. It is anticipated the two lists (+1,+2) will be combined at the Callerlab Convention in 1982 (in Nevada).

The MS list has been frozen for 3 years. Additions can only be made in the calls 49-68 and then only if the recommended calls have been on the QS list for 3 years. CALLERLAB feels this stability will benefit the activity and hopes all clubs and callers support this new designation.

CALLERLAB WANTS to encourage clubs & caller-teachers to take a critical look at their class programs & goals. Review the current Basic & Main-stream Programs carefully in light of the time available for instruction & the clear need to graduate well-rounded dancers. Dancers should be taught not only the choreography of various basics but also an introduction to the topics of history & heritage, dress, dance customs & manners, as well as simple rounds, mixers & contras. Teach the basics from more than just a single set-up & insure both heads/sides can dance each part comfortably. Note that the new BASIC PROGRAM makes an excellent 30 week package & is well suited for those areas where conditions limit class time to about 30 weeks a year.

CALLERLAB recommends 41 sessions of 2 to 2½ hours each to teach the complete MS PROGRAM, & many areas are phasing into a two year program of instruction to ensure that graduating dancers meet with success when they enter the S/D world. It seems clear that much of our dropout problem is rooted in the fact that some dancers are rushed thru class too quickly & find that they cannot cope after graduation. Rushing dancers thru class to increase membership or the club treasury is short sighted at best.

How much better to produce dancers who will be around for a long time because they are comfortable with & enjoy their S/D experience. The freezing of the MS list for three years enables us to look ahead & plan our teaching program without fear of disruptive changes. Let's make the most of the opportunity & rededicate ourselves to graduating really capable, smooth-dancing, happy dancers who are well-prepared to take their places in the S/D world & have the background & motivation to prepare for positions of leadership.

The ADVERTISING of dance LEVELS for club dances and the posting of levels at Festivals is encouraged, Including the desired level in the caller's contract or confirmation agreement will provide programming guidance to the caller as well as protection for the sponsoring organization.

The LEVELS or PROGRAMS are NOT intended to segregate dancers into exclusive groups or to indicate that one who chooses to dance at his/her own preferred level is any better or any worse than any other dancer. Dancing skill can be achieved at many levels & the quality of calls is not necessarily an indication of dancer proficiency. It is hoped the lists will be used as intended to aid in a logical teaching progression & thorough coverage of basics in classes & to provide an enjoyable modern S/D for dancers of all inclinations.

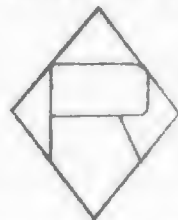

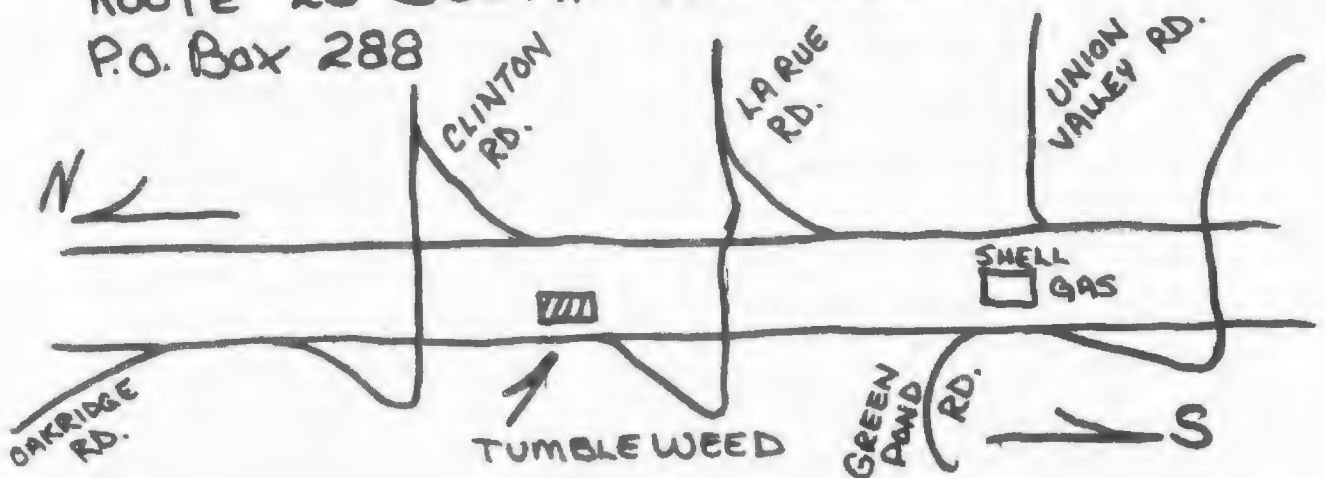

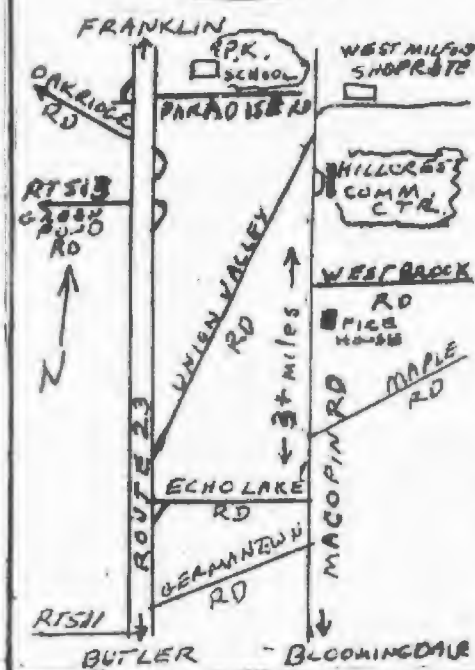
