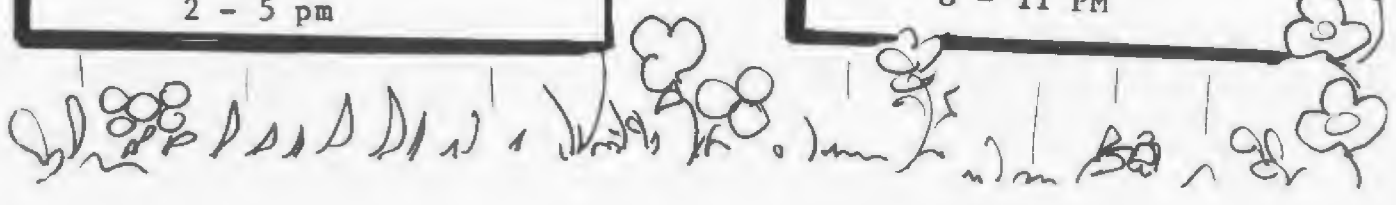

Each member club has selected Delegates to represent you and your club at the 3 NNJSDA sponsored Delegates meetings per year. Representatives of CCNJ and non-member clubs also attend. You, as a member club dancer, are welcome to join these meetings to express your views, ask questions, make suggestions or just to observe the proceedings; however, only the Designated Delegates have the authority to vote.

At our meeting this past September a query was distributed by LEGACY... "To help keep square dancing the way you like it". Each Club President received a reprint of CALLERLAB's revision of Basics, Extended Basics, Mainstream and the probability of combining M/S-1 and M/S-2 into an overall M/S level. We asked that this be discussed with executive boards and to return the resulting comments and suggestions. In the Fall issue of G/S there was a Mini-Festival questionnaire so that this NNJSDA sponsored event would be as you like it in '82.

The number of responses to these three items while not overwhelming, was encouraging....your interest and concern was very strongly expressed. Thank you for finding time to respond. We appreciate your letters...keep them coming...we received many ideas for recruitment of new dancers; many questions and suggestions regarding GRAND SQUARE; we have been asked for advice on how to handle Callers who don't stay within the dance level advertised by the club; how to retain our dancers, especially our new dancers. Many of the questions were answered at the Delegates Meetings, some of our dance clubs already have formulated programs in answer to some questions or problems that were raised.

Your Delegates are dedicated and have indicated a very thorough understanding of where we are and what direction is best to be followed by the Square Dance activity. Show your Delegates you appreciate the time and effort they give so willingly....give them the opportunity to share with club members the whys and wherefores of their meetings. The more informed you are of actions and reactions in our square dance area....the more you will enjoy square dancing....share your thinking about the S/D activity with us, with your Delegates, and with your club officers.....

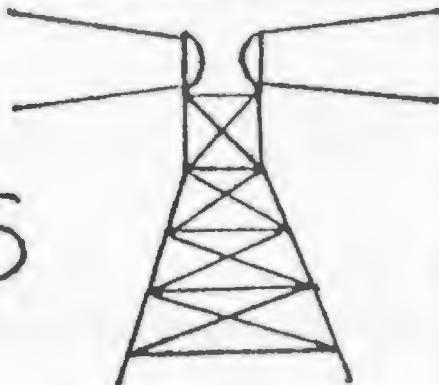

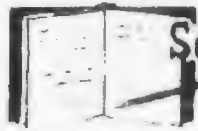

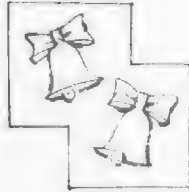




Dear Editor,

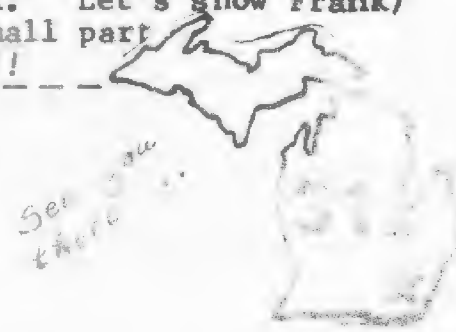
IN THE MEANTIME, we S/Ders have work to do.

Dear Editor.....ONCE A BEGINNER, ALWAYS A BEGINNER -

" We have been actively dancing for several years & enjoy the camaradery, exercise, etc. that square dancing offers, & have recommended it to friends who also share our enthusiasm.

We feel we must call your attention to a problem that has become very widespread & which may indeed be the reason many dancers become disenchanted with square dancing & subsequently drop out.

Pre-arranging squares on the part of more experienced dancers so they will not be subjected to breakdowns has become rampant. They decide who the better dancers are & will dance only with those designated while those less experienced are often forced to dance with the beginners. Dancing under these circumstances becomes nothing more than an allemande left and promenade, & frequent breakdowns do not add to the enjoyment of square dancing. If these more experienced dancers would dance more indiscriminately, the needs of all square dancers would be better served. The age of segregation has long passed!

It is an affront to approach a square where there are obvious vacancies only to be told that they are reserved. We have also seen squares where one partner will occupy the head and the other the side to insure that no one enters the square without their approval.

The blatant rudeness we have encountered, frequently on the part of club officers, forces us to speak out at this time in the hope that this serious situation will be corrected before it is too late and more and more dancers become turned off to square dancing."

This issue the SQUARE PINCUSHION makes a 5-tier skirt.....

In response to several requests, we'll review how to make the most feminine of skirts-the 5-tier!



Each tier is a graduated length with the narrowest at the top, and the widest at the bottom. The mathematics will sound a bit complicated, but take it step by step, and you'll do fine. The easiest & the place to begin is to use the finished length of 25". Finishing each tier at 3", 4", 5", 6", & 7" to make a total of 25". Adjust by fractions either to shorten or lengthen. Then add 1" to the width of the 4 uppermost tiers for 2 1/2" seam allowances, and finally add 1/2" for top edge seam allowance on the bottom tier plus desired hem.

For the cutting:(up to about a 35" waist)
Cut 2 strips 45" fabric for tier 1; cut 2 for tier 2; cut 3 for tier 3; cut 5 for tier 4 & cut 7 for tier 5; also cut 1 @ 5" for the waistband.

For the assembly:

For each tier, join the strips in that size, end to end. Leave last seam open- this will give you 5 long strips. For tier 1, measure off and cut at 60"; tier 2 uses the full 90"; tier 3 cuts at 135"; tier 4 cuts at 205" and tier 5 is 310". This will allow each tier to be 1 1/2 times fuller than the preceding one. Now gather the upper edge of tier 2 and sew to lower edge of tier 1; gather upper edge of tier 3 and sew to bottom edge of tier 2; repeat with tiers 4 and 5. Your combined tiers should look like the picture at the right. Sew remaining seam, leave allowance for zipper. insert zipper. Cut waistband strip the length of your waist plus an allowance for seams and overlap. Sew end seams, add some stiffening. Gather upper edge of skirt to fit your waist and attach to waistband. Add closure desired.



Try on and if length is correct do your hem. Since this is about 8 1/2 yards at the bottom, a machine hem is not out of place. If your skirt looks too short because your math was off or your seams too deep try adding a band of eyelet or contrasting fabric strip or some other edging. You could split your lowest tier and insert a trim of your choice.

A tip or two- use lightweight fabric- many tiers were intended for a dainty look....Learn to use a ruffler, it saves many a temper and is a worthwhile investment. ...can be attached to a bodice in place of waistband.. trim it up with rickrack, ribbon, eyelet, applique, or whatever.....enjoy it over and over again.....

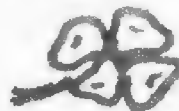
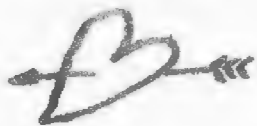

QUARTERLY SELECTION COMMITTEE reports....

The International Association
of Square Dance Callers

For the quarter beginning Jan. 1, CALLERLAB has selected two movements for use during workshops at the MS level...HINGE & FLUTTER by Ron Schneider..."Starting formation - Ocean Wave(s). All dancers do a Single Hinge, the in-facers will do a Reverse Flutterwheel while the out-facers do a right about face to finish as in a Reverse Flutterwheel. Ends in facing pairs." Callers are asked to be sure that all dancers are in established wave(s) before calling HINGE & FLUTTER since the move begins with a Single Hinge action. There are some All Position Dancing (APD) calls that dance smoothly if your groups are so inclined. Please note, however, that not all groups desire to dance other than from common (normal) boy-girl arrangements. It is not CALLERLAB's intent to force APD onto any group.

RELEASE THE COLUMN - "Starts from any right or left-handed column formation. The number 2 and 4 dancers in each column move forward and slightly left or right to pair up with the dancer in front of them (making a momentary offset two-faced line) and then all finish like a Ferris Wheel to end in a Double Pass Thru formation. (From a common or normal column, RELEASE THE COLUMN produces a common or zero Double Pass Thru formation.)

CALLERLAB members will be voting on all existing QS by mail ballot & will conduct a discussion & vote at their annual convention in April. The above moves will be on the QS list for the period beginning Jan. 1 until removed or accepted after a three year trial period. Please let us hear from you on the dancer reaction to these moves & routines....Send all comments to CALLERLAB Box 679, Pocono Pines, PA 18350. Thank you.
