HISTORY REPEATS ITSELF -

For the first 5/6 years of its existence, the NNJSDA ran S/D classes in various areas. Graduates were absorbed into clubs, with many becoming officers - new clubs were started - new callers emerged. More & more clubs discovered the merits of running their own classes, until in 1965 the Ass'n instead of running a Class, switched to providing for its members, the materials and assistance as requested.

In the late seventies, NNJSDA & CCNJ held a dialogue on helping get drop outs back into circulation. Clubs furnished names - lesson plans were developed to help people catch up - CATCH ALL EIGHTS was born. Clubs were asked to open up the second half of lessons to CAE members. CAE was a unique, relaxed workshop. And as more couples returned to club dancing thru the CAE program, clubs realized the value of the program & began to urge their own drop-outs to come on back via their classes. As more & more clubs did their own CAE program, attendance at the CCNJ/NNJ faltered. Chairman from both organizations have said while both are interested in getting back drop-outs, they really don't care how or who does it. They are just hopeful the clubs will continue on following up on their dropouts and strongly urge all to not drop their drop-out program. Once again the Association has led the way ...and now the clubs want to do their own thing.

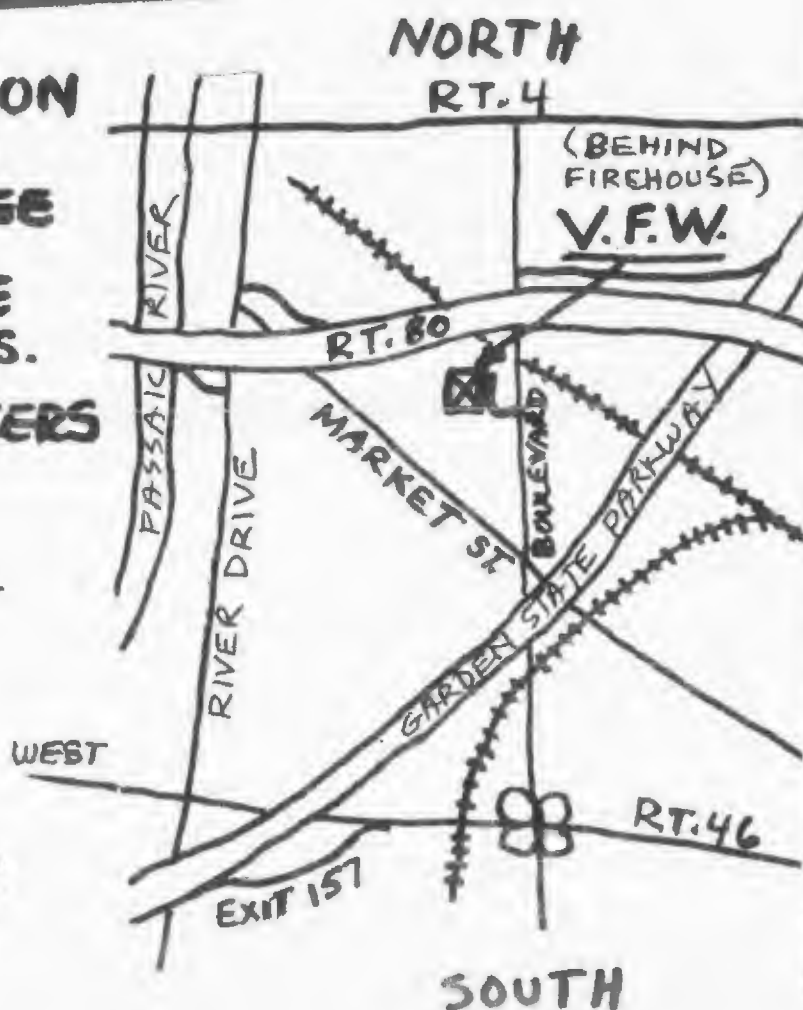

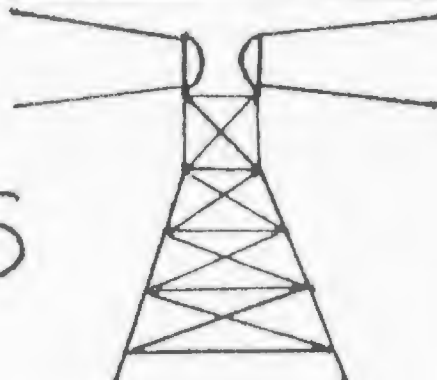

FOLLOW UP - At the January Delegates Meeting, the question was raised - Since some places were demanding higher insurance coverage, what could the Association do to help? Insurance Chairman, Ed/Alva Bell, immediately tackled the problem. In February a letter announcing that Selected Risks Insurance Co. with whom we have our coverage has offered the NNJSDA an additional buffer policy. The liability against bodily injury will increase to a million per occurrence & against property damage to \$800,000.00 per occurrence.

All NJ based clubs were polled & the vast majority indicated their desire for this increased policy. Accordingly the additional cost was prorated per club for the balance of our insured year. Our sincere thanks again to Ed for doing the seemingly impossible.

This issue The SQUARE PINCUSHION talks about the 'prairie skirt'...



Lucky for the square dancers, the biggest 'in' thing is the Prairie skirt and the ruffled blouse...In for fashion in everyday wear, the prairie skirt is casual and comfortable. But best of all, it is a style that we all love as the square dance skirt.

There are 2 things to watch out for if you're buying- 1st, be sure they're full enough to wear a crinoline underneath and 2nd, some of them are cut longer than we wear our square dance skirts and therefore need a tuck above the flounce to shorten or perhaps even be shortened at the waistband.

Non-sewers can benefit from this style and when this fashion goes the way of all others be ready to snap up the bargains.

There are patterns available for this type of skirt. This is the time to add to your repertoire. A change of blouse or addition of a new bodice and voila! a new dress.....

The perfect accompaniment to the prairie skirt is the ruffled blouse...short or puffed or long or petal or flare sleeves - a ruffle at the neckline, over the shoulder, edge of sleeve, down the center of bodice or whatever strikes your fancy..watch for ideas in magazine pictures, in fashion ads, in pattern books or on other dancers. Keep a file or notebook with your ideas. Then you can mix and match or spur your own ideas. This is a time and opportunity that doesn't come our way too often ...so let's take advantage and sew (and/or buy) up a storm...

Since ruffles are what makes the difference, watch for buys on ready-made lengths of gathered eyelet and other wide ruffles. Learn to make them on your machine in fabrics that match or co-ordinate. Remember to make flounces for skirts  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 times as full; and blouse ruffles about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  times as full. Ruffles can be added in seams or on top trimmed with banding or ribbon.

Whatever you choose, make the most of the fashion rage, the 'prairie skirt' & the 'ruffled blouse'.....

# CALLERLAB

The International Association  
of Square Dance Callers

## QUARTERLY SELECTION COMMITTEE

For the quarter beginning April 1, this committee has selected RED HOT for use during workshops at the Mainstream Level. This is a traditional move that has been around the activity for a long period of time, but has never before made any of the CALLERLAB lists. The starting formation for RED HOT - Moving Promenade or from dancers meeting one another in a right & left grand type of set up. From a promenade position: The man will pull the lady across in front of him in a left face turn with his left hand where she goes to the man behind him. Man & lady will right arm turn the one they face 1/2 turn & return to partner for a full left arm turn and pull by to move to the corner for a right arm turn 1/2 & pull by to return to partner and await the next command. From an allemande thar followed by a shoot the star: Dancers meeting with a right hand will arm turn 1/2 & go back to the person they just left (partner) & left arm turn full around to the new corner for a right arm turn 1/2 & pull by to the partner to follow the next command. This move should only be called from common set ups - the girl on the man's right or with the man on the girl's left. The timing is 20 beats (2 1/2 phrases). No Selections to be made over summer.

The Ninth International S/D Caller's Convention at Reno, Nevada April 5-7, was the largest CALLERLAB Convention to date with more than 700 callers, 550 partners, as well as several VIP guests from the National Executive Committee, LEGACY & ROUNDALAB. 48 states, 6 provinces of Canada & 4 foreign countries were represented (Australia, New Zealand, Japan & England). 57 Quarter Century Club certificates were awarded to those CALLERLAB members who have completed 25 years of active calling. Their most prestigious award, the MILESTONE Award, was given to Johnny LeClair of AZ, Jim Hilton of CA, & Art Shepherd of New Zealand.

The theme for the convention was CALLERLAB IS MAINSTREAM with a sub-theme of CLASSES - THE LIFE BLOOD OF OUR ACTIVITY. More than 100 callers & partners helped in the presentation to make this convention a success. John Kaltenthaler & Herb Egender continue as Executive Secretary & Assistant Executive Secretary respectively.

The 10th Annual CALLERLAB Convention will be held at the City Line Marriott Hotel in Philadelphia, PA March 28-30, 1983.

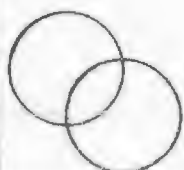

Follow Up.....Remember the questionnaire you filled out last year? Well, 4,280 dancers from all over took time to fill out the 1981 LEGACY dancers questionnaire survey. The results have been tabulated and put on the computer. All comments have been extracted, categorized & assembled in bookform for review by interested persons. (Tirrells have a copy if you care to borrow it)

The dancers concerns for the overall S/D activity is highly evident. Briefly, there is a strong demand for increased emphasis on S/D etiquette. "Callers sticking to the announced level of dance" and "fewer new figures" were second & third respectively among the dancers concerns.

The 1981 questionnaire repeated the 1980 request asking dancers to rate fourteen aspects of the activity on a +5 to -5 scale. By repeating this section in future surveys & comparing results, trends in dancers attitudes may be spotted. Dancers are expressing more concern over the cost of our activity. "Learning new things" & "Challenge" has dropped in the plus ratings, but "pleasure of dancing" still remains high.

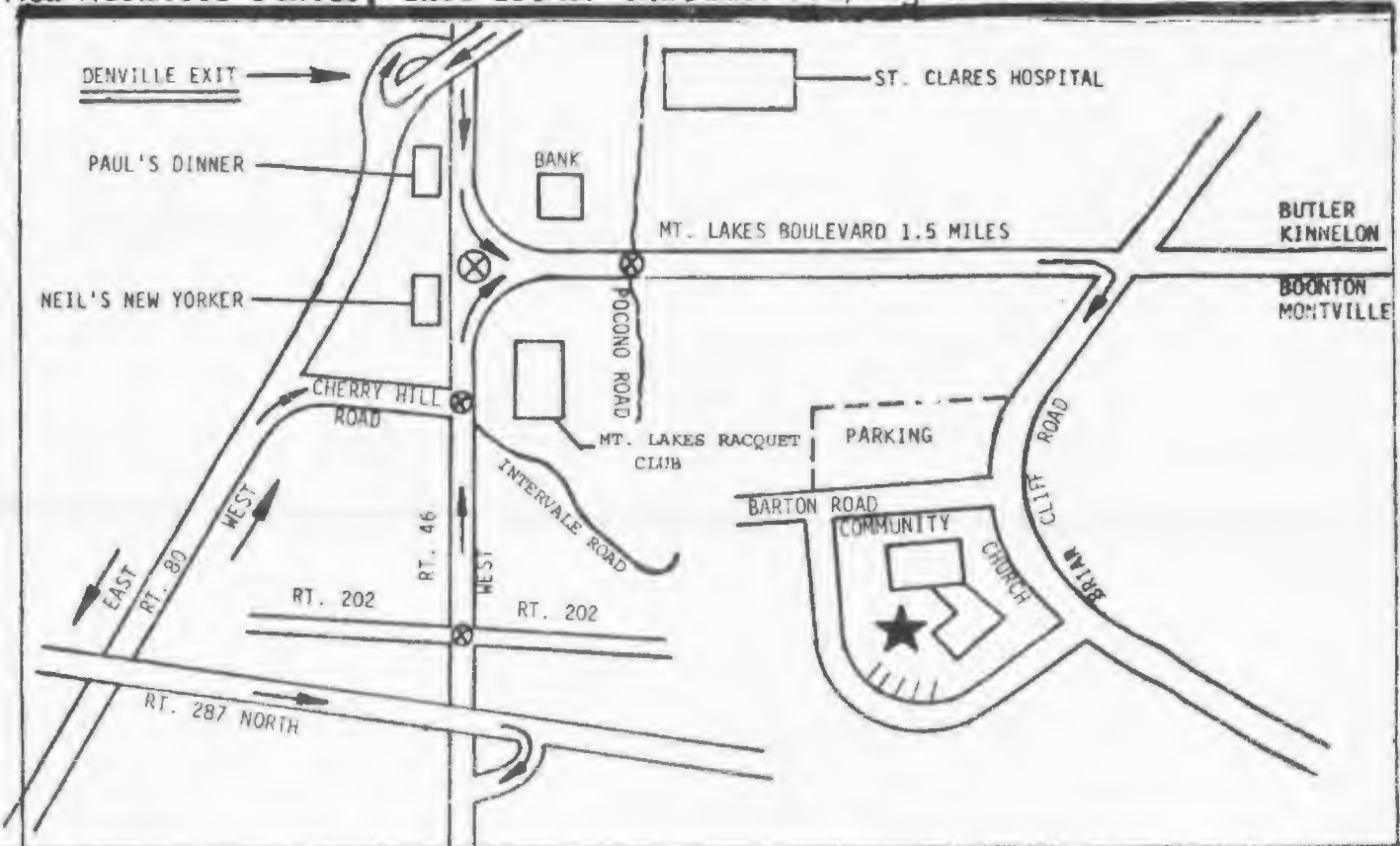

A separate summary of the convention questionnaire results has been forwarded to the National Executive Committee.

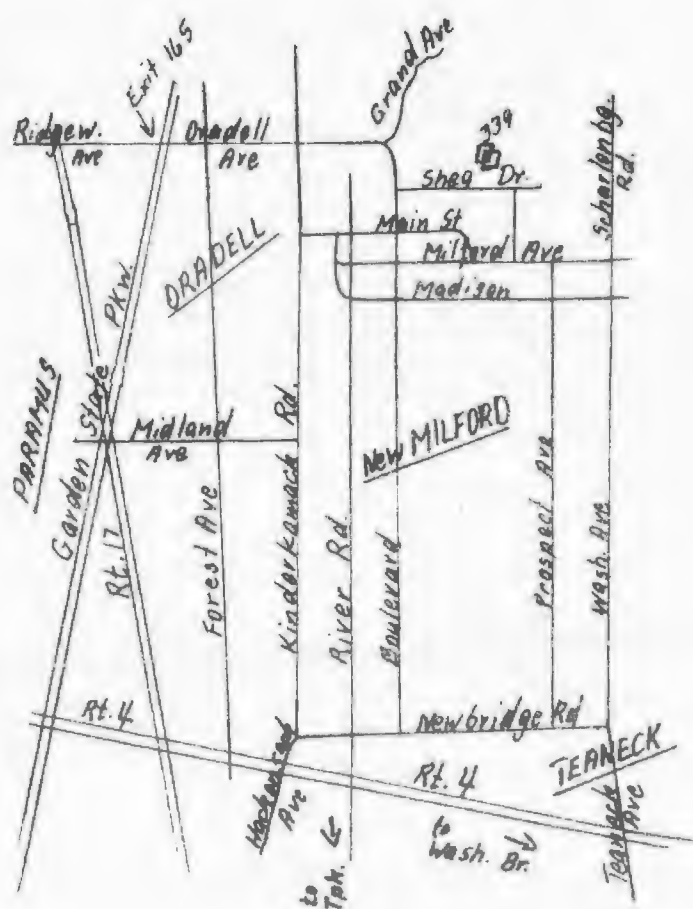

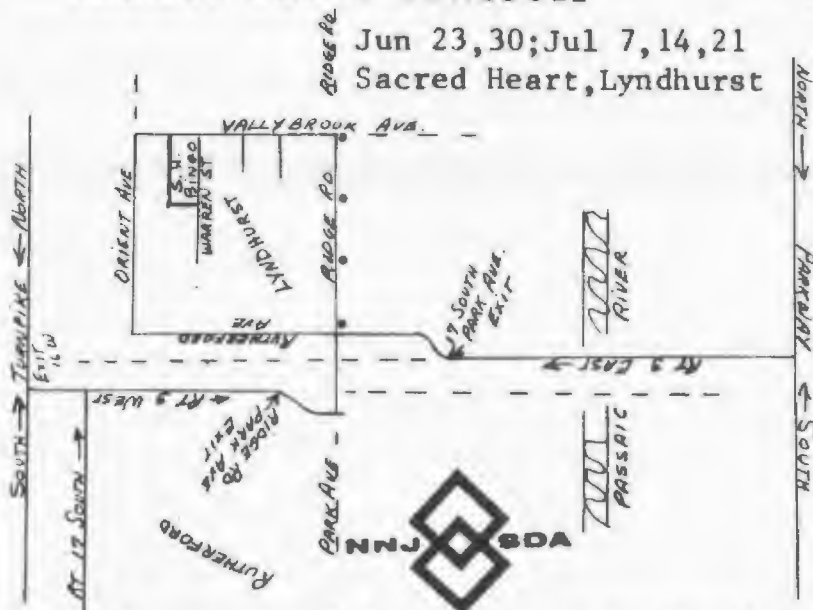

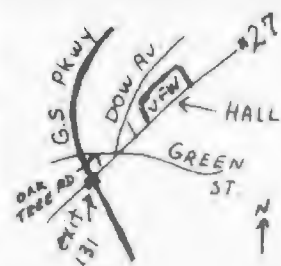
