THE SQUARE DANCE IS THE NATIONAL FOLK DANCE OF THE U.S.A.

The United States Congress, on May 11, 1982, has passed SJR-59 with an attached amendment by Rep. Robert Garcia of NY, Chr. of the Committee on Post Office & Civil Service & also the Subcommittee on Census & Population. The amendment limits this Resolution to 1982-1983. This Resolution was amended, was then approved by the US Senate on May 19th & quietly signed into Law by the President on June 1st, 1982. Dancers all over will now continue to support & work toward achieving the permanent status of what is now known as Public Law 97-188, making the Square Dance as the National Folk Dance of the United States of America.

Washington, Oregon, Tennessee & Alabama have already passed & signed Resolutions making the S/D their State's American Folk Dance. In NJ the Cavanaugh's have been hard at work getting our bill reintroduced and on its way. Already thru the Senate, as of this writing it awaits action in the Assembly. 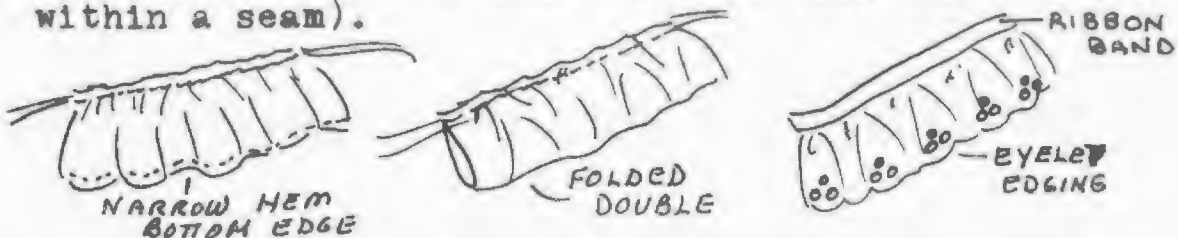
In an attempt to keep up with the 'in' look in fashion as well as keep the upper edge on your purse-strings, we'll pursue the possibilities of ruffles.



Almost any style can be enhanced and given a new look with the addition of a few well-placed ruffles. Trim a collar, or a yoke, or edge a front band, or add a pair of vertical ruffles (pinafore fashion), or create a new line of interest with diagonal ruffles or ??????



Ruffles can be included within seams (if planned ahead) or top-stitched if thought about afterwards. Ruffles can be made from any soft fabric that matches or contrasts. Narrow ruffles with rolled edges, or narrowly hemmed, or cut double-width and folded in half lengthwise or finished edging of lace or eyelet can be used. The unfinished upper edge is then gathered evenly and then added as desired. Raw edges can be covered with a row of narrow ribbon or bias tape (if they can't be put within a seam).

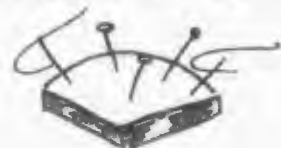


Trim an otherwise plain little shirt-type blouse with ruffles of gingham & make a skirt to match...or cut up the scraps(leftover from cutting out your blouse or dress)into strips and make them into self-ruffles. The prairie look is still with us and the budget-minded can come out ahead with a little planning. Watch for sales of fabrics, beautiful sheets(their yardage can't be beat) and take advantage of money-saving tips whenever you can.
