This issue the SQUARE PINCUSHION works with BORDERS.....

For special effects and eye-catching outfits, try a border print or a piece of border trim. Since it takes



Gores or A-line styles or circular skirts do NOT lend themselves to border prints as their hemlines are curved. Straight hemlines are essential. Therefore, flounces, ruffles and tiers are appropriate places for borders in skirts; and, sleeve inserts, cuffs, bodice inserts and straight-cut ruffles are some possibilities for blouses.



In order to utilize a lot of border trim, anywhere from 8 to 10 or more yards fabric are necessary. Remember, you lose part of the yardage to the border. If you find the need to conserve, try adding the border to an area that doesn't need as

much fabric such as the middle tier of a 3-tier skirt, or use it lengthwise in 1 or 2 panels-







Cut your border pieces first, marking them carefully so that pieces will match when sewed together.

Watch for sales, closeouts and yard sales for buys in border trims. Be sure to wash all trims before using as many will shrink. Borders are usually finished on both edges and can be top-stitched where desired. Trims can be applied over lengthwise seams on a gored skirt but not on the curved hem. Plan ahead so that you place these trims on before the hems so that all raw edges are concealed.

So watch for good buys, someone else's discard can be your find.....



America's Folk Dance

The National Folk Dance Committee report the Public Law designating the S/D as the National folk dance of the USA expires 12/31/83. To give this law permanency Bill 6912 was introduced last August by Congressmen Mineta & Panetta. This bill now sits in the Post Office & Civil Service Committee. Guess Congress is so concerned with taxes, etc.it has no time to consider the relaxation square dancing can provide.

CALLERIA S

The International Association of Square Dance Callers

CALLERLAB has been publishing a recommended stratification system for several years which we feel properly defines the various programs being danced throughout the coun-

try and the world. There is some misunderstanding as to our purpose & some misuse of the terminology that we established. CALLERLAB has identified the following Dance Programs:

- B Basic Program CALLERLAB list 1 48
- MS Mainstream Program CALLERLAB list 1 68
- QS Quarterly Selections MS plus the current Quarterly Selections
- PLUS Plus Program QS plus the 27 calls listed in the Plus Program
  - Al Teaching Progression Advanced Program All above & the calls listed under A 1.
  - A2 Teaching Progression Advanced Program All above and the calls listed under A 2.
  - Cl Basic Challenge Program All above & the calls listed under C 1.
  - C2 Extended Challenge " All above & the calls listed under C 2.

As can be seen all programs include calls from previous lists. It is not the intent of CALLERLAB to try to force anyone to call or dance at any particular level. Clearly programs beyond QS are not for all dancers. As a matter of fact, CALLERLAB encourages clubs & callers to provide dances aimed at the Basic Program for those dancers who dance less often than once a week.

CALLERLAB encourages clubs, callers & festivals to label their dances for the calls that are to be used in a dance program. For instance, if a plus is to be labeled QS, then the caller could use any call found in the MS Program and the current Quarterly Selections. He/she could not use calls from the Plus Program. If on the other hand, a club is labeled Plus (+) Program, the caller may use all calls in the Plus Lists, the QS List & the MS list. If the dance is labeled a Plus Program Workshop, then the caller should be teaching & using calls & figures from the Plus List. By labeling clubs, halls we hope to provide a better dance program where the dancers will know what to expect & therefore enjoy their dancing more.






