FOLLOW UP - SQUARE DANCE COUNCIL of NEW JERSEY



Remember the LEGACY questionnaire many of you filled out concerning s/d last year??? Well, 5,481 forms were received. Thanks to a computer, a good program & a good operator, the 208,00 data points and 127 pp of comments were reduced to three mini-floppy discs.

The average survey respondent danced between 4 & 5 times per month & had about 5 years' experience. About 2/3 of all dancers has been club officers. 1/4 had at-

tended a S/D leadership panel or seminar and 2/3 found the information useful. Respondent were asked what methods of teaching and/or emphasizing etiquette were most effective. 68% voted "caller in class" with "by example" & "experienced dancer in class" each receiving a little less than half as many checks. Dancers apparently deem "written material" ineffective since it was checked on only 6% of the forms. Dance "mixers" were appreciated more by the less experienced & less frequent dancers. Higher frequency dancers rated "clothes" more positively. Dancers with 4-5 years experience had the lowest opinion of club leadership. The poorest overall attitude was scored by 6-7 year dancers.

Dancers were asked, "Of those you know who've dropped out of S/D, what do you feel were the most significant reasons...?" - 38% felt pressure; 28% felt rushed; 21% social(not accepted by group); 13% caller inadequacy; 11% club functions/responsibilities; 11% bored; 8% rough styling; 34% other..... which when broken down covered 3 broad groups-personal, club related & other dance related reasons such as "no partners for singles".

It is impossible to objectively summarize it all in a short half page here, but most seemed to be saying "Keep the fun & pleasure in dancing, teach them social as well as dancing skills, and reduce pressures wherever you can. Copies of the comments/data summaries (by state & overall) are available from your LEGACY Turstees. We will print the NJ responses in the next GRAND SQUARE. Another survey is planned for late 1984.

Spring was in the air as 22 Spinner beginners graduated to become Sussex Spinners at the Alpine School during the Graduation Ball in early May. The evening opened with welcoming statements by Norm/Audrey Bolin, Sec. of NNJSDA & the club induction by presidents Bill/Shirley Wright. The great food and a very special cake only added to the momentous celebration attended by Stan Lach & Martha Strait, VP Beginner chairpersons, all the club angels and many visiting clubs. We would like to extend a special thanks to Stan & Martha, & to instructor John Kaltenthaler and Bill Heyman for their humor, patience and support throughout the introductory classes. In addition good wishes and hopes of luck go to new pres, Stan & Martha and all our other new officers.





A kit for the 2 vests and dress with materials & eyelet runs about \$25.00. The overskirt with eyelet runs about \$5.00 more. Check with Alberta (838-3392) to be sure you send the right amount and include postage. Make all checks out to "N.N.J.S.D.A.Square Dance Outfit".

BACK VIEWS





The basic dress is made up of a circle skirt with a bodice with round neckline and puffed sleeves. Sleeves, neckline and hem are edged in gathered eyelet edging. There is a zipper closing down the back.

The vests are made of green (kelly) polycotton broadcloth. The man's has a western yoke, pocket flaps in front and top-stitch details. The ladies' is fitted to the waist and has button closing in front. Both have a map of New Jersey appliqued to the back. On the map you sew a star to the locale of your home town and add the initials of N.J.

Although the sewing is up to the individual seamstress,



discretion is recommended and as much adherence to the the basic design as possible is is desired.

We're trying to be a unit of state representation and therefore feel we should not deviate too much.

The overskirt is optional. We will talk about this and other overskirts in an upcoming issue.

I forgot to mention the dress is made of white poly-cotton broadcloth. The men are wearing white slacks, shirts and ties. The outfits are definitely striking. Keep these in mind as a suggestion for Santa(it's never too soon)......
We'll talk about the applique in next issue.





LEGACY, the International Communications resource and leadership cen+ ter of the S/D activity, was the set-

ting for the very busy meeting of LEGACY VI with 183 trustees from 34 states, 2 Canadian provinces & the

Netherlands in attendance. LEGACY trustees from NNJ (including freddie/ John Kaltenthaler: Frank/Helen Cavanaugh: Doc/Peg Tirrell: Donna/Bill Anderson) attended the convention at their own expense for the purpose of exchanging ideas. This years theme was COOPERATION with the use of flags as the acronym to formulate topics. Some of the sujects covered were Friendship, Leadership, Attitude, Giving and Styling. Dick/Jan Brown gave a report of LEGACY's third survey questionnaire. They had received 5,481 responses, with thousands of words of comments, which were compiled into a thick volume for all to read. One highlight of the convention was when Bob Osgood awarded the Silver Spur to a most deserving couple, Dick & Jan Brown. Among the resolutions adopted by the LEGACY trustees in St. Louisa recommendation that S/D organizations at the local, national, international level support Leadership training by holding Mini-Legacies (like NNJ's LUST); that LEGACY VI encourages outreach programs be developed worldwide.; The concensus of meetings was that the social aspect of S/D is a major factor, if not the most important one, to assure a successful program. LEGACY proposes that the S/D community be made aware of the importance of social aspects & encourages the continued development of this practice - that the experience of enjoyment be fostered beginning with the dance learning process. LEGACY VII will meet May 1985.






