We are pleased to announce that the NNJSDA has established a Blood Program for the benefit of the members of our Association. Not only are our members covered, but the program includes spouse, children, parents and parents-in-laws.

At the Delegates Meeting on Jan. 15, 1984, the clubs voted overwhelmingly to join the program sponsored by the New York & New Jersey Blood Service. As a result of this vote, all Association Clubs, in NJ, NY & PA are covered by the program.

Information will be sent to all Clubs, mentioning who can give blood and what procedures are to be followed if blood is needed. Meanwhile, we will begin setting up donor dates...in most cases trying to get several clubs to give on the same dates at a convenient place. Since the most critical shortages of blood occur around the holidays, our first date will be Memorial Day weekend. The clubs to be involved will be notified well in advance.

Eventually we shall have our own identification number, making it easy to arrange for replacement of blood when needed. For now, if you have any questions or know of any member who needs blood, please contact Burt Caplan, Blood Bank Chairman. His address is 148 Cindy Street, Old Bridge, NJ 08577/201-679-8079.

By now, most of the housing requests have been confirmed. The assignment of persons to specific rooms within a housing facility is the prerogative of the hotel and is not the responsibility of the convention. While there are a limited # of downtown hotels, most of the other facilities are located in 20/30 minutes of the Convention Center.

Since the parking will be rough, shuttle buses will run - \$4/daily pass per person or \$10/3 day pass per person.

2000 breezy sites have been created at Camp Smallwood - 17 miles away. This city park, converted into a camp ground just for the NSDC will be open June 24-July 1. Altho there are no electrical hookups, city water, showers & toilet facilities and a dump station are available. Shuttle bus service will be provided June 27 thru 30th. Reservations must be made for this thru the Housing/Registration Committee. (See form.)

There will be all programs of square - round - contra - clogging every day from 9 AM to 1 AM Thurs thru Sat. plus Trail End dances Wed. Their Education Program "Follow the Tassle Trail" will have clinics, seminars & panels galore spaced thruout the day so when your feet need a rest you can use your brain instead. (Plot your time by using the Program Book)

A convention would not be complete without a FASHION SHOW. Theirs will feature Baltimore firsts (i.e.-first umbrella); be on Saturday with 11 models wearing combinations of red, white and/or blue.

And TOURS galore! Before - during - and after !!!

Special reduced rates have been obtained for dancers wearing convention badges to US Frigate Constellation (get these passes at tour desk); USS Intrepid; 27th floor World Trade Ctr; National Aquarium; Science Ctr; Star Spangled Banner Flag House & B & O Railroad Museum. (More on page 11)

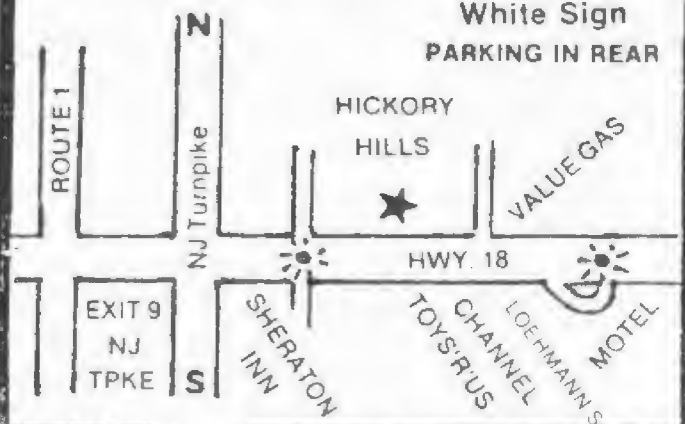

Locally there are 43 member clubs - many of whom have adapted their dance program to include more Mainstream (MS) dancing for the new dancer. We urge all new dancers to attend as many open house dances as possible - not only to meet other dancers but to practice their newly learned skills.

Do not be in a hurry to move along into the next program of square dancing - or into the Plus Program. Take time to make friends. Enjoy the fun and fellowship that can be yours in the MS program. There can be fun and fellowship in every program - we just suggest all new dancers follow the CALLERLAB suggestion that you dance a year in each program before moving into the next one.

GRAND SQUARE puts the club dance program in brackets () up in the club heading. New dancers are most comfortable usually with MS and/or QS (which is Quarterly Selections). Some clubs for the remainder of this spring will change their dance programs to include more MS; some alternate tips; so that the new dancers can join in the dancing. Get out and mix with the others - do not stay in the same group- make new friends. ENJOY!

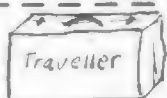


some "EXTRA SPECIAL AWARDS".....

FOLLOW UP - CLASS COORDINATORS Dialogue.

Education Chairman, Doc Tirrell, had categorized concerns into 3 areas for discussion purposes.

#1- What training should a Class Coordinator have?

This led into a discussion on their job responsibilities which Hal Margo summed up as " Advertize Classes; Plan Demo's; Greet & Check in new people; Prepare attendance lists & keep attendance; Publish class rosters; Follow-up non-attendees; Coordinate angels - ask for at dances; Look for problems of floor; Bring problems to instructor's attention; Provide for food; take care of singles; dress in S/D attire - encouraging all angels to do the same; provide information - dress,shops, background; encourage attendance at class level dances, balls, coordinate class level dances; arrange for graduation - badges, etc; followup after graduation; make sure plus program summer workshops are attended; meet with previous coordinators for their helpful hints and prepare a notebook to pass on to successor...as well as meet with them.

#2 - Angels in Class -

They should always be in proper S/D attire; smile & show it is fun; must remember they are there to assist NOT teach; practice good S/D manners & do ALL figures correctly with no gimmicks. Dealing with inadequate angels should be left up to the Class Coordinator NOT the caller. Suggest-rotating experienced angels as well as the people from last year class so that you have one experienced angel, one "weaker", and another angel couple each week...also have an emergency couple to call in case of illness.

#3 - Are the dancers being overly pressured? Are they being pressured to move up into + program so they can dance with their friends who invited them to learn? This discussion left all with many unanswered questions... Most felt dancers should go to as many MS dances as possible and not rush into next program - This discussion will continue at LUST in September.

BADGES-DANGLES-ROVERS

Your NORTHERN NEW JERSEY SQUARE DANCERS ASSOCIATION (NNJSDA) was founded in 1958. It has always been concerned with a good promotional program, classes leadership, summer dances & Clearance. Now 43 clubs strong, the Ass'n continues working to improve & expand the S/D picture & its related activities. Delegates are the avenue of communication between their club & the NNJSDA. 3 Delegate Meetings are held (Sept, January, April) a season. These meetings are open to any dancer, but only delegates may vote. GRAND SQUARE, its official publication, is distributed free to all member clubs thru delegates.

Northern New Jersey Round Dance Leaders Council (NNJRDL) members wear this badge. Formulated in 1965, the Council meets quarterly to exchange information, self-improvement, plan R/D Specials and select Rounds of the Month (ROM).

Callers Council of New Jersey (CCNJ) members wear this- colors denote type of member. Organized in 1974, it is a statewide, non-profit corporation of professional S/D callers whose purpose is to encourage, promote modern S/Ding & the development of professional callers/instructors.





WELCOME GRADUATES to the wonderful, wide world of Square Dance Activity. Described below briefly are a few organizations whose names will become more familiar to you as time goes on. Their main purpose is the promotion, preservation & protection of S/D & its activities

CALLERLAB - The International Association of S/D Callers is the professional callers communication organization which has provided immediate and much needed leadership to the field of calling. Meets annually prior to Easter. John Kaltenthaler of Pocono Pines, PA is Executive Secretary.

LEGACY - was founded as a service-leadership organization to develop better communication among the many facets of the S/D activity. Trustees representing every facet of the activity meet biennially. Next meeting-May '85. Doc/Peg Tirrell of Cresskill, NJ were reelected Chairman in 1983.

LLOYD SHAW FOUNDATION - Provides school guidance programs & excellent leadership training sessions as well as maintaining archives S/D center.

NATIONAL FOLK DANCE COMMITTEE - successfully masterminded the drive for the bill declaring the S/D America's National Folk Dance thru 1983. Now working to make it permanent. Frank/Helen Cavanaugh active with group.

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION (NSDC) - Begins 4th Thursday in June..entirely run by S/Ders. It's Executive Committee comprised of former General Chairmen. Runs for 3 days with something for everyone. 1984 in Baltimore; Birmingham, AL-'85; Indianapolis, IN-'86; Houston, Tx-'87. Plan to go.

ROUNDALAB - The International Association of Round Dance Teachers formed to promote, protect & perpetuate the general R/D movement as a compliment to the overall S/D activity. Only teachers may belong. Meets annually. Peg Tirrell recently elected Executive Secretary.

SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA - raises money (sells stickon roses), designs, decorates S/D float for Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, CA. See page 52 for how to apply to be chosen to dance on float in '85.

UNIVERSAL ROUND DANCE COUNCIL - (URDC) - Outgrowth of annual R/D convention. Open to both teachers & dancers. Convention annually in July.

UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA - Newly formed organization representing just dancers. Will meet the Wednesday prior to NSDC in Baltimore.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SQUARE & ROUND DANCE SUPPLIERS (NASRDS) - Organization for suppliers in our activity. Members must maintain high ethical standards to belong.

The SQUARE PINCUSHION revisits the Petal Sleeve...



With warmer weather around the corner, this seemed the ideal time to answer requests for the 'Petal Sleeve'.

The first decision to make is do you want the sleeve cap smooth or slightly gathered. Second, you need a sleeve pattern from a blouse or dress (the set-in type not raglan).



Place a piece of tissue paper over your sleeve pattern and trace the upper edge and measure 3" down either side seam. Stop. Turn the pattern over and trace it again, the upper edge & 3" ea. side. This gives you one piece

with the single notch on the right, and one with it on the left. Also, the double notch will appear on the left on 1 piece and on the right on the other. Mark the center top for the shoulder seam, too

Now, with a pencil or chalk, make a graceful curved line from the end of the 3" side seam to about 1" below the notch on the opposite side; do the same with the 2nd tracing.



cut these out. Cut from fabric - note you will 2 of each pattern for each sleeve (1 will be the lining).

To assemble, sew the underarm seams of the 2 top pieces; join underarm seam of 2 lining pieces.



Right sides together, join upper section to lining, leave uppermost edges open. Trim seam, turn & press. Baste upper edges together. Overlap to form petal. It doesn't matter if you overlap front or back, just do both the same. Gather upper edge if necessary, and set into armhole as any other sleeve.




If you wish to pipe or add lace edging do this to the outer section before joining to the lining.

This sleeve is prettiest in soft fabrics. If you choose to line in a contrasting color, repeat the color in trim elsewhere, perhaps in a flounce or ruffles.

It may be wise to try on a scrap of old fabric (such as an old sheet) to test fit before cutting your good fabric. Any questions don't hesitate to ask. Good luck.

INTERNATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF "TRUSTEES" OF THE SQUARE DANCE ACTIVITY

Changing attitudes and opinions of dancers as they gained experience was reviewed. The 5,481 responses were categorized into 2 year groups (New & 1, 2 & 3, etc.). Results were compared to the "average" dancer as portrayed by all responses. What was learned?

a- New & one year dancers dance 3 to 4 times per month. This peaked at 6 per month for the 6 to 7 year groups. A decline to 4 & 5 until after 20 years. At that point frequency rises.

b- Why have friends dropped out of S/D? The responses ranked: 1-felt pressure toward higher dance programs; 2- felt rushed - inadequate learning time; 3- social-not accepted by groups; 4- caller- inadequate in some way; 5- club-functions or responsibilities; 6- were bored-not enough variety; 7- styling-rough or non-standard moves; and other reasons.

c- 18% of the new and one year dances had been officers jumping to 43% of the 2 & 3rd year S/Ders.

d- Only 1/3 of the 12 or 13 year S/Ders had attended leadership panels or seminars (like our LUST).


e- Attitudes about different aspects of S/D varied widely with 6/7 yr S/Ders having the lowest attitudes ranking each category on a -5 to +5.

While reviewing the results of this last survey the committee is also thinking about what measures the 1984-85 survey should look toward.
