This issue The SQUARE PINCUSHION shows easy machine applique.....

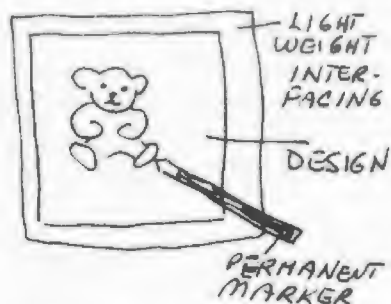


It's time to review some old skills-so let's look at some machine applique. If you're good at hand applique and have the time necessary to do this on a project of much yardage like a square dance dress or skirt, fine, but most of us have time that is at a premium and that is to whom I am speaking.

First become acquainted with your zigzag sewing machine. You will need to do a very close stitch so it looks like satin-stitch embroidery. On some scrap fabric, practice doing curves. Learn to pivot (with needle in fabric) on outside curves with the needle to the right and on inside curves pivot the needle on the left. This prevents gaps in the line of stitching. Also practice going around a square edge so you learn to make nice corners.



Now it's time to select your design & get to work. Look in children's coloring books, especially for younger children, those designs are simple & cute. It is wise to use a lightweight iron-on interfacing to give your design some stability. Now don't get upset at the mention of interfacing, the new things are simple. Here's how:



Place a piece of interfacing with the smooth side up (rough side down) over the design you wish to trace. Trace with a permanent fine marker or specially made wash-out pencil. Washout pencil lines wash out with water. After tracing, cut out design and iron on to fabric (wrong side of fabric), cool & cut out & place in

position on your garment. If your design has many small parts such as facial features, apply these to the larger face background and applique the face as one piece. Select those items that are farthest in the background to be done first. It sounds like a lot of work but for something that will be an outstanding addition to your dance wardrobe and will be worn for many years, it's worth all the time it takes. Start with simpler designs (those with fewer pieces) & work up to the more complex. Be sure all the scraps you use as well as your base fabric have been prewashed. Appliques can be used on bodices, blouses, skirts and dresses, men's shirts, etc. This may be more work but it will save you some money & give you an individual outfit you will be proud to wear.
