ning October 1, 1984 is GRAND PARADE by Mort Simpson. The timing is 64 beats. It starts and ends from a static square. Heads step forward to a a momentary wave; ends & adjacent centers turn half, new centers turn 3/4; each side lady now steps forward to her right (to head position) to become the partner of the head man now in that position while the side men take head ladies out of the center with a courtesy turn; all now promenade half way around the set & face in. Repeat all of this action again starting with the heads. The sides will then repeat the action of the heads, while the heads do the action of the sides and repeat all of those actions again. The total action is a four times through routine.

On the following page is LEGACY's 4th biennial dancer survey. A total of 5,481 forms were returned during the last ('82-'83) survey & about 7000 are expected back this time.

To help make the information available for specific areas of interest & to measure the validity of the data compiled, LEGACY purchased a rather sophisticated statistical analysis computer program. This new program will make survey info much more available and useful for all facets of our activity. All costs & labor for the survey, as before, come from individual contributions (often postage), LEGACY funds (membership fees & personal donations) & volunteers for the preparation, distribution, collection, computer entry, data analysis & distribution of information. Last date for mailing the forms back (or handing them to the Tirrells) is March 1, 1985. Complete results will be available after the LEGACY meeting next May in Philadelphia. Other LEGACY trustees in our area helping with distribution of the surveys are Donna/Bill Anderson; Frank/Helen Cavanaugh; Johnny/Betty Pederson; & John & Freddie Kaltenthaler.

Dick/Jan Brown, former Executive Secretaries of LEGACY, of Bellevue, NE are Chairman of the LEGACY Survey and will mastermind the entry of data. Cathie Burdick is in charge of entering and the compilation of all the written comments that usually accompany the surveys.






