
CALLER Christmas is just around the corner, and gifts for our friends and loved ones. CALLERLAB would like to suggest a number of gifts you can give your S/D associates-



Attendees left this convention feeling it would be known as a milestone of accomplishment. Through the eagerness and willingness of the membership in sharing their knowledge and expertise several decisions of far reaching importance to the R/D activity were reached.

Members voted to restructure the committee on Standardization into separate committees for each of ROUNDALAB's six phases of Round Dancing. Decisions were made to: establish a new ROUNDALAB Dance Rating System based on these six phases; to develop an accreditation program; to start a video tape library program; and to finalize the ROUNDALAB Classic List. A new membership category was created - that of "Inactive Teacher Member". At the awards Banquet, certificates and awards were presented to attending teachers who had attained their 10th, 15th, 20 & 25 or more years of teaching. Don Hickman was re-elected Chairman with Peg Tirrell re-elected as Executive Secretary. Their next meeting is June 23-25, 1985 in Alabama.






