



BLOOD BANK NEWS

The first year of the NNJSDA Blood Bank was one of mixed results. We started off by providing blood replacement for red .. a dancer who had open heart surgery. During the year, drives were scheduled in 2 areas, and one club, the Merri-Eights conducted its own drive. In 2 situations we were able to conduct the drives on the scheduled days. In one situation we did not get enough donors signed up and members of the groups in that area did donate on their own thru the Red Cross. During the year, members from several areas, especially Statem Island, have been donating blood for NNJ, and we will undoubtedly be scheduling a drive for SI and Brooklyn clubs this fall.

While we are trying to set up donor dates encompassing several clubs in the same area, we are also going to be mailing to each club open dates in which they can donate on an individual basis in their area.

It is difficult organizing blood donor days with clubs and members so spread out. It is frustrating to work many months to set up a date and cancel it at the last minute because we could not get the minimum number of donors. Even though many of us have blood programs at work or through other organizations we belong to, there are many, many dancers and their families who do not have this protection. We will be asking the presidents of each club to appoint a Blood Bank representative to work with us.

It may be "corny" to say "the life you save may be your own", but blood donors truly are lifesavers, and even if you belong to another blood program, your participation in ours will help many of your fellow dancers. If you do give blood through a Red Cross program, our ID number is 9192. Please make sure that you notify the Red Cross of this so that we can get the credit. Also, we have special dangles for all those who donate. Please contact the Blood Bank Chairman if you have given blood and did not receive your dangle. Thank you very much for your cooperation.

THE THREE SKIRT WARDROBE.

A well rounded wardrobe should consist of three basic circle skirts, one white, one red and one black. The stores are full of attractive blouses and shirts which will extend these skirts into a varied wardrobe.

The white skirt can be decorated for the holidays with pretty felt flowers and designs for the occasion. These additions can be basted on with clear thread or purchase narrow two sided tape and tape them on for the evening.

Attach a grosgrain ribbon sash either the color of your blouse or to match the design you have attached to your skirt. One and a half yards of inch and a half ribbon ties a nice bow for a 28 to 30 inch waistline.

The black skirt can become a formal skirt when topped with a frilly lace trimmed blouse. It also can be decorated smartly for Halloween with goblins, pumpkins or scary cats.

The red skirt makes a lovely Christmas skirt trimmed with white and green cutouts of your choice. For the Fourth of July your red skirt can be decorated with huge white firecrackers or another symbolic design. A white tailored shirt and a red, white and blue striped grosgrain ribbon sash carry out this theme nicely.

Now that you have three skirts in your wardrobe it's time to think of blouse purchases. A dressy black blouse can be worn with the white skirt. This time a black grosgrain ribbon sash to encircle the waist. The black blouse can be worn again with the black skirt. Add one of the new bold shiny belts that are so fashionable. Soften your neckline with brightly colored beads to match your belt.





Round Dance teachers from 24 states & 2 Canadian Provinces attended the 9th Annual Convention in Birmingham, Al last June. This, the first time ROUNDA-LAB has held its convention immediately prior to and in the same city as the National S/D Convention saw many of its members actively participating in both

There was a strong feeling of cooperation & comraderie among the teachers as they continued the work of R/D Standardization. Additional figures were placed in the Six Phases of R/D which will enable all choreographers to phase rate their dances more accurately. Compilations of the 3,241 R/D surveys were presented to the membership for evaluation and discussion.

The Video Tape Committee reviewed tapes and made plans to develop a library of all Six ROUNDALAB Phases of Round Dancing. On Sunday evening all attendees participated in a teacher training clinic. Monday evening's session was devoted to "You Asked For It" figures. All also had the opportunity to share their expertise and gain new knowledge in 3 Swap & Exchange sessions. At the Monday evening Award Banquet certificates and awards were presented to attending teachers who had attained their 10,15,20 & 25 year of teaching round dancing...including Marie/Stan Shipman (10 years) & 25 year teachers Doc/Peg Tirrell.

Clancy/Betty Mueller of IN were elected Chairman. Serving as Executive Secretary will be Peg/Doc Tirrell.

3,241 Surveys were returned from R/D all over the world. The average R/D answering the survey was in the 50-65 age group with over 92% having square danced. The average dancer had square danced over ten years and had been round dancing for almost eight years. 80% belonged to a R/D club. While over 28% learned their basics of R/D at a S/D club, 74% had also attended a basic class of R/D instruction. The dancers showed a strong dislike to round dancing to tapes and cued records and a mild dislike for (continued on page 50)



(continued from page 49) records with vocals as well as memorizing sequences. Their greatest pleasure, besides just the enjoyment of R/D itself, was being with friends and leaders cueing rounds. Pleasure was also expressed in learning new figures, the exercise, learning new rhythms and just plain getting out. Mild pleasure was new acquaintances, the challenge of rounds, cost and clothes. Comments were received on about ten percent of all the surveys. Most of them dealt with new dances and level of dances. It was the feeling of most dancers that there are too many new dances and that most of the new dances don't stay around very long. The next largest amount of comments dealt with standards. Most of those wanted cues standardized and dances cued the same way. Some comments dealt with teaching techniques. Quite a few expressed appreciation for their teachers.

ROUNDALAB thanks all who took the time to answer the survey and is carefully evaluating the results in light of its current program on Standardization, Phase Rating System, Cue Word Standardization, Video Tape Committee, Teacher Training Program and Teaching Progression Manual.

Cliff/Pam Gordon, Survey Chairman, deserve high praise for handling all the computer entries, compilation and evaluation.
