

With all the fear and mis-information about AIDS, the supply of blood/blood donors has declined. Blood is urgently needed. We will send out material to the clubs to clear up any misconceptions. To remind you: every member of NNJSDA and their immediate families are covered by our blood program. It is too valuable to fall by the wayside. If you give blood through your work, etc., why not donate for your fellow dancers at least once a year. There are many dancers who do not belong to any program and by donating through our group, you can show that you do care. Meanwhile, if you have given blood for NNJSDA or have helped out on a donor date and have not received your B/D dangle, please let us know. This is one to wear proudly!!!


Our club is in full swing now and we are excited about the new season ahead. First of all, our new beginners class was full of wide eyed newcomers. They were a little nervous the first week but

A very feminine pocket can be added to your skirt by using my ruffle pocket design. If you are making a new skirt, self fabric can be used, if you wish to perk up an old skirt, a contrasting color may be used.

Cut two (2) circles of fabric with a 6" inch diameter, and one (1) circle of interfacing, light weight or iron on.



SMALL OPENING FOR TURNING

Sew circles and interfacing together on wrong side leaving a small opening for turning fabric. Clip edges for a smooth circle, turn and press. Hand sew the small opening. Mark by pinning or basting a five (5) inch opening for the hand.

5" OPEHING FOR HAND

Cut a 36%" inch strip of fabric 2%" inches wide on the bias. Fold in half and press. This becomes your ruffle. Gather the raw edge to fit the pocket starting at pin or basting stitch, end at second pin or stitch.



Sew the gathered ruffle onto the pocket with the raw edge inside.

THE LACE DOILY.

Another nice addition is the lace doily pocket. This can be backed with a matching or contrasting color or the hue of the crochet thread. A square or circle, used at an angle, adds a nice touch. Garage sales or flea markets usually offer a variety of doilies if you do not crochet. Many of the pieces can be used to decorate a neckline for a new look.

My thoughts and your expertise will help to create your new look outfits.

QUARTERLY SELECTION COMMITTEE reports:

The Mainstream Quarterly Selection (QS) for the period beginning Oct. 1, 1985 is SPIN THE NET.

Starting Formation(s): Parrallel Ocean Waves or Eight Chain Thru. From parallel Ocean Waves, all Spin the Top, to form a momentary tidal wave. Without stopping, the very center four dancers, in their own wave do another Spin The Top, while the other four dancers Cast Off 3/4 and the outfacers will Run. Ending formation 1/4 Tag - Timing 16.

The schedule of Quarterly Selections is staggered. Mainstream figures cover periods beginning first of January, April, October with none in summer. Plus is for periods beginning in February, May, August & November. Advanced QS effective periods begin first of March, June, September and December. No program is required to have a QS. As of September 1, the following QS are current: MS: Chain Down The Line; Grand Parade; Spin The Net. PLUS: Spin Chain & Exchange The Gears; Ping To A Diamond; Load The Windmill; Coordinate The Gears. ADVANCED: Change Lanes; Linear Action; Mini-Busy; Zing; Checkover.

MS Emphasis Calls for the quarter beginning October 1 are: Dixie Style To An Ocean Wave and Hinge Family. Plus emphasis call is 3/4 Tag the Line.

As of 4 PM on October 5 CALLERLAB announced there occurred an unprecedented opportunity of TV on Public Broadcast Stations or Educational TV. The SC Educational TV Station uplinked the TV series of S/D Instruction for 26 consecutive weeks. This broadcast is at no charge to receiving stations. It is up to the dancer to urge the PBS stations to avail themselves of this opportunity. If you have a VCR, you might also wish to tape it as a supplement to lessons. Althought receiving the news late, your NNJSDA tried to apprise all clubs of this news.
